Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

I am humbled by the confidence you have shown in me by choosing me as your tenth Grand Knight at the start of the **2010-2011 Fraternal Year**.

Lou Hlad's performance as Past Grand Knight will be a tough act to follow. Nevertheless, I am very encouraged by the powerful slate of officers you have chosen to surround me. For the coming year, we will have an interesting mix of new and familiar faces in the officer positions.

I have chosen several goals to guide my term as Grand Knight:

First of all, to continue and, if at all possible, expand the successful programs that our Council has been running such as our Acolyte Program, the Lenten Fish Fry, the Vidalia Onion Sale, the Tootsie Roll Campaign, the Soap Box Derby participation, Desserts with Santa, and many others.

To encourage the use of McGivney Hall for additional functions including fellowship functions, family events, educational opportunities, entertainment events, such as watching a baseball or football game or movie on the big screen.

To organize and document the programs that we run at the Council so that members that may not be currently involved can see what it is we do, what they can do to participate and how the various programs are run and just what it takes to pull off the various programs that they make look so easy. Brother Knight John Buchholz has already started this process by putting together a draft of a **Communication Guide** which, I believe will be valuable, not only for the Council, but other organizations at All Saints.

To initiate some programs to help new members become active in the council and to encourage existing members that are not active to become active as well. A "buddy system" has been suggested to pair a new member with a current member to help show the new member the ropes, as it were, and help him "fit in."

To encourage our first and second degree members

to continue their journey to full Knighthood.

This will include coordinating with other councils on degree exemplifications.

To explore the need for transportation to meetings for members who, for example, cannot drive at night or are not able to get to our meetings or functions, even though they might want to.

To explore other "services" to help enable greater participation, besides transportation, such as baby-sitting or other dependent care.



To continue the job of maintaining and improving McGivney Hall. We will be looking at installing a satellite dish, and possibly getting other capital items such as an ice machine, a garbage disposal, and figuring out how to get HVAC to actually function in the small conference room without an "Act of Congress."

To continue the recruitment of new members. It will take more than 60 new members to make **Double Star** again this year – even more if people stray.

To continue our charitable activities, and encourage broader participation through the increased use of the **Charity Request Forms**.

To continue our support of the **Father Charles J. Watters Assembly** and encourage more of our membership to take the step into the Fourth Degree.

To support our **All Saints Boy Scout Troop 434** more closely, particularly with their Blood Drive activities. We have not had one in a while, and I think strong support from the Knights would go a long way to bring that worthwhile activity back.

In looking at history, I noted that our Past Grand Knight had set a personal goal of losing 25 pounds. It appears that Lou may well have achieved that objective. Unfortunately, I think I may have found some of them.

That being the case, I will personally need to explore the workout facilities across the parking lot from McGivney, so that as this Fraternal Year progresses, your Grand Knight will not be quite so "Grande".

Meet Your New Grand Knight

Stan Wasowski was born in Harrison, NJ and is a product of Catholic education, from the nuns of the Daughters of Mary of the Immaculate Conception at Our Lady of Czestochowa grammar school, to the Jesuits at St. Peter's in Jersey City, NJ, and then Boston College where he majored in Math, graduating in the class of 1970. After that, he went to Oregon State University for a Masters Degree in Oceanography (1974). While there, in 1972, he married Kathy McDonald who also went to Boston College (School of Nursing, 1970), and was in California on her "Western Adventure".

For the next 15 years he worked for the US Navy's R&D community mostly in the anti-submarine warfare, at places like the Naval Research Laboratory in Washington D.C., the Naval Ocean R&D Activity in Bay St. Louis, MS, the Naval Ship R&D Center in Annapolis, MD and the Office of Naval Research back in Washington DC. By 1985 he and Kathy had three daughters. That's when he went back to school, getting a law degree, at night, from Georgetown (back to the Jesuits) in 1989. Kathy also went to school and became an interior designer.

Stan moved to Atlanta in 1994 and worked with the law firm of Paul, Hastings, Janofsky & Walker until "semi-retiring" to a smaller firm, the Lang Legal Group, in 2007.

His three daughters are all grown, out of college and married. His oldest, Melissa graduated from Wake Forest in 1996, spent 4 years in the Army (after ROTC) where she met her husband Brett. She is now a pharmaceutical sales representative with Pfizer in Atlanta. She and Brett have 2 of Stan & Kathy's 3 grandchildren, Dylan (5) and Haley (3).

Meet Your New Deputy Grand Knight

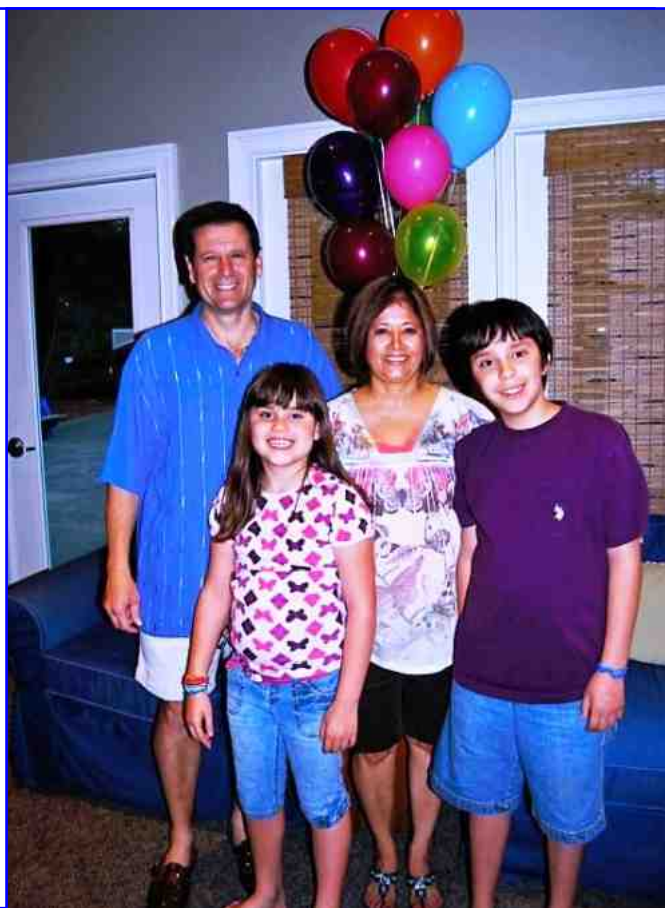

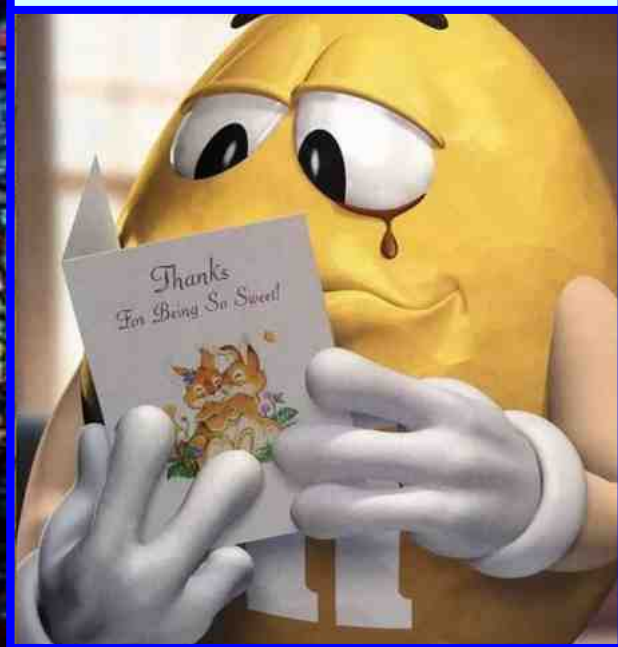
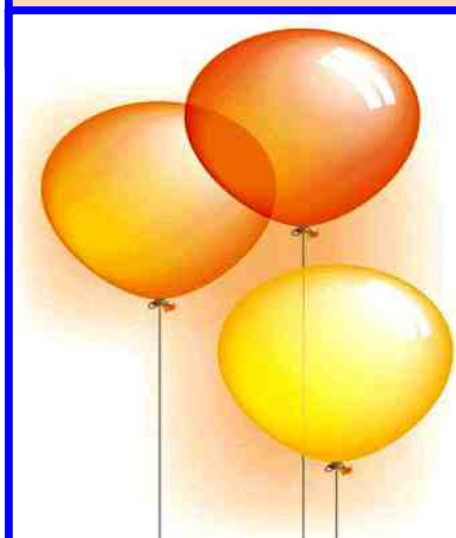
