In any event, we are at the beginning of a new fraternal year. There are a few new faces among the ranks of your council officers. Our new pastor, Monsignor Marren, will be serving as your Worthy Chaplain. Monsignor Kiernan, who has served as our Chaplain.

Monsignor Kiernan, who has served as our Chaplain

since the founding of the Council in 1994 will be staying on as our "Spiritual Advisor", and has agreed to give us some lessons in our Catholic Faith and spirituality during our meetings from time to time in the coming year.

Our Worthy Financial Secretary of 11 years, Gert Kampfer has retired from that position and has turned the responsibility for implementing the new Supreme Council based financial system

over to our new Worthy Financial Secretary, John Stowell.

Gert will continue his involvement with the council as Trustee and as our webmaster. Mario Commito will be taking over the Treasurer position from Joe Cavallaro, and Frank Callan will be taking over the Chancellor position from Kevin Murray.

Our council owes a deep debt of gratitude to our outgoing officers, particularly Monsignor Kiernan and Gert Kampfer for their many years of faithful service. I look forward to working with our new officers as well as our returning officers in the upcoming 2011-2012 fraternal year.



Over this past fraternal year our council had quite a number of significant accomplishments. We appear to have achieved our fifth consecutive Double Star Council award. The State Council of Georgia gave us the State award for Youth Service for our support of the Kiwanis Club's Soap Box Derby. The Lenten Fish Fry program met with unprecedented success this year serving over 7,500 meals, while garnering favorable TV and press coverage.

Our Vidalia Onion sale program moved over sixteen tons of Vidalia onions through 11 councils in the area, with over six thousand pounds at All Saints alone.

We continued the successful Acolyte program in which brother Knights act as altar servers at funerals and other select functions. The Fathers for Good Seminars (which won the International Family Service award from Supreme Council last year) continue. We provided support to three seminarians.

We also continued our support of I-Care, the Elaine Clark Center, Special Olympics, Birthright, Missionaries of the Poor in Jamaica, our local scout troops,

the City of Dunwoody (interchange cleanup, 4th of July parade, Music Festival), and of course our own All Saints Parish (Spaghetti dinners, Desserts with Santa, Low Country Boil).

We have Satellite TV service at McGivney and there is a large screen TV outside the parish office that showed an evangelical message to the lines of people waiting to get into the Fish Frys. Elsewhere in this issue you can see the results of the work that your brothers did at the Sparta Catholic Cemetery.

The PWID (Persons With Intellectual Disabilities, alias Tootsie Roll) campaign has been revitalized. Our special 3rd Tuesday events have been informative (e.g., Lessons in Leadership), entertaining (Magic at McGivney – Braves Baseball), and social (wine tasting - St. Patricks Day) events at McGivney Hall. McGivney has also been used by Brother Knights for family functions (anniversary and funeral receptions). I know I am leaving things out.

We have also had several of our number go to their eternal reward. *Memento Mori*.

All in all, we have had a very successful year and we should be proud. However, a wit once said that no flower wilts more quickly than a laurel that is rested upon. I look forward to the upcoming fraternal year that is even better. We have great experience to build upon in our existing programs and new people with new ideas for new programs that can make the 2011-2012 fraternal year the best one yet.

I will be looking for volunteers to serve on and chair the various program committees.



Council voted to donate \$2,000 to <u>I-Care, Inc.</u> for driving indigent seniors to medical appointments. The motion was tabled in May and voted on at the June meeting because it exceeded \$500.

Council voted an additional \$500 to <u>The Missionaries of the</u> <u>Poor</u> in Kingston, Jamaica. We previously donated \$500 before the parish mission trip.

Brother John Stowell gifted his business meeting attendance award winnings to the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

WARREN PAGE VICKNAIR, 79

Being coach, referee 'was his life'

Tireless high school official touched lives of many students.

Warren Vicknair acquired a number of nicknames in high school coaching and officiating careers that lasted more than four and five decades, respectively. Among the personalized labels were "Slick Vick" and "Coach Pa."

The popular leader was part of football coaching staffs at Marist, St. Pius, Avondale, Dunwoody and Peachtree High. He was the head coach when he won championships at St. Pius and Avondale,

Warren Page Vicknair of Doraville died Tuesday from complications of organ failure at St. Joseph's Hospital. He was 79. A funeral will be held at 3 p.m. Saturday at Dunwoody's All Saints Catholic Church. H.M. Patterson & Son, Oglethorpe Chapel, is in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Vicknair was best remembered as someone who touched the lives of numerous students, many of whom responded to news of his demise with messages of gratitude and condolence.

"One man wrote that he taught him the love of God and taught him to go 110 percent," said Margaret "Margie" Harrington



"Marist was his pride and joy because he went to school there and he was a die-hard Catholic," said Dr. Devin Vicknair, a son from Dacula. "St. Pius would be next in line behind Marist. His philosophy as a teacher and coach was to bring out the potential in the individual. He always told people you have to use 110 percent of what God gave you."

In a 1995 profile in The Atlanta Journal-Constitution, Mr. Vicknair stressed the need for coaches to control their teams, support their players, know the game rules, and treat everybody with respect.

"We officials are susceptible to mistakes in officiating," he said. "The manner in which the official and coath handle themselves should be conducive to what is expected of the athletes."

Additional survivors include a daughter, Delana Bonnell of Savannah; and four grandchildren.

We hope that the second half of this year will be kinder to us than the first half. Please pray always for our deceased brothers and our sick and distressed friends and relatives.


