Grand Knight's Report

ALL SAINTS COMPASS

Brothers:

It's the start of the new fraternal year, and there will be a key election held at Tuesday evening's business meeting. We will vote on a new three-year trustee to fill the term left vacant by the sudden passing of our Brother Tom Mix.

If you are interested in holding this position, please let me know prior to the meeting. We will also take nominations from the floor. The duties of the three-year trustee include overseeing the work of the financial secretary and treasurer, and with the Deputy Grand Knight serve on the council's retention committee.

While overcast skies and drizzle shrouded the day on the 4th of July, the Knight's of Columbus float was a ray of sunshine for the council at the 2013 Dunwoody parade. Our Thomas the Tank Engine float took second place for best character. Master float builder Greg Crnkovich and his team did an amazing job of replicating the fictional steam locomotive in The Railway Series books by the Reverend Wilbert Awdry and his son, Christopher. I'm still not sure how the float didn't get first place! It was a wonderful team effort exemplifying the second virtue of our order – unity.

While the inclement weather prevented the council from serving up brats and burgers at Dunwoody Village following the parade, the retrofitting of the cooker from a "smoker" to a "grill" is almost complete. In the past, it took close to 12-15 minutes to cook a hamburger as cooker temperatures struggled to reach 375 degrees. During a test after retrofitting, cooker temperatures soared to over 500 degrees within four minutes. Hopefully we can find even more events in which to put the cooker to good use.

Our next big cooking event doesn't even involve the cooker. For the second straight year, the council has been asked to grill for the Dunwoody Nature Center's Butterfly Festival, which attracted more than 2,000 people last year. The Butterfly Festival is Saturday, August 17. Hopefully you're able to volunteer – it was great fun last year.

The Knights' international headquarters in New Haven, Connecticut put out a press release this

week announcing the Knights of Columbus set a new all-time record for charitable donations and service hours in 2012. The results of the K of C's Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity for the year ending Dec. 31, 2012, indicate that more than \$167.5 million and 70 million hours were donated to charitable causes. Notable beneficiaries during the past year included Habitat for Humanity, Special Olympics, victims of natural disasters, local food banks, the economically disadvantaged and physically and intellectually disabled persons.

"Throughout its 131 years, the Knights of Columbus has always practiced charity as its first principle," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. "With so many people enduring great hardship, the Knights of Columbus is happy to help provide solutions to real people's problems through this great outpouring of charity by our members over the past year."


And in case you missed this announcement last month, the Knights of Columbus moved up to number 909 on Fortune Magazine's recently released 2013 ranking of America's top 1,000 companies.

Last year, Fortune's list ranked the Knights of Columbus at 912 in total revenues among the nation's top companies. During the past six years the Knights of Columbus has climbed 56 spots on the list — up from 965 in 2007.

The Knights have earned the highest possible rating from A.M. Best (A++ Superior) for the past 37 consecutive years.

The Knights of Columbus has nearly \$90 billion of life insurance in force — more than twice the amount of insurance in force when Carl Anderson was elected Supreme Knight and CEO in 2000. The organization also has nearly \$20 billion in assets under management.

Council Officers for 2013-2014

At our Tuesday, June 4th, Business Meeting, we elected the following officers to serve for the next fraternal year which extends from July 1st 2013 to June 30th 2014. There were no surprises or nominations made from the floor. One contested election for Inside Guard resulted in the re-election of Ed Pierson with newcomer Bryan St. Romain as his assistant.

Bill Camden had agreed to run for the post of Chancellor, which is the third position in importance after Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight. He was unopposed and was awarded the office. Our former Chancellor, Frank Callan, moved to Kennesaw, GA and transferred to St. Catherine of Siena Council located there.

Tom Mix ran uncontested for the Trustee - 3 Year Term office and was awarded the office. In a tragic turn of events, Tom passed away about a week later. The position is now unfilled and it appears that an election for that position will have to be reopened at the July Business Meeting. Our Trustee - 1 Year, Lou Hlad, fell off the roster of trustees by natural rotation.

Chaplain and Lecturer offices are appointed by the Grand Knight and are not elected positions. Financial Secretary is suggested to Supreme and then approved by the Supreme Knight. Monsignor Marren will continue as our Worthy Chaplain. John Buchholz has chosen to retire as Lecturer and his replacement will be appointed by the Grand Knight. Dennis Caniglia will continue as the Financial Secretary. Council Worthy Musician is an appointed position and is currently held by Mark Foster.






Stan Wasowski was elected Faithful Captain of Watters Assembly (equivalent to Deputy Grand Knight on council level).



Council Aids Eagle Scout Project

James Brewster, 15, a Life Scout in All Saints Troop 434, has applied for permission to augment the parish Garden of Remembrance with installation of a permanent Indian-style teepee for use by children in our Pre-School.

The project requires clearing an area for the teepee, construction of a retaining wall for water drainage, and construction of a large authentic teepee from a kit to be purchased.

The project was slated to begin on June 15th and employ the efforts of about 25 scouts and family members.

It was estimated that the project will cost about \$1,150. The council donated \$250 to the project. The scout is expected to raise the total cost from several sources excluding family members.

James gave a detailed presentation to the council officers just before the June Business Meeting.



Picture of the teepee kit that James will install on the parish grounds for children's use. It is slated for late July completion. It is estimated that 110 work-hours will be needed for completion.

A retaining wall made of 4" x 4" pre-treated lumber will protect the teepee from flooding.

The kit comes unassembled with galvanized 8-inch spikes, wooden poles, and animal skin-like covering.

Hope Long, Pre-School director, is working with James on this project.


