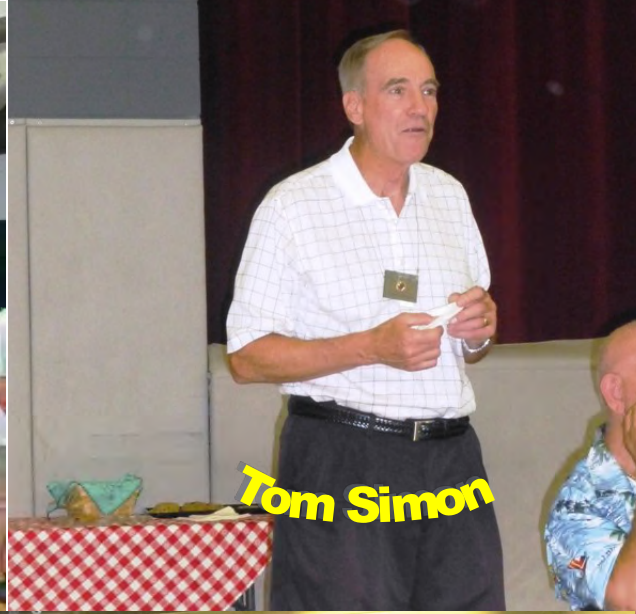

All Saints pastor seeks new sanctuary and more

The pastor of All Saints Catholic Church on Mt. Vernon Road announced at weekend Masses that a campaign has begun to replace the current sanctuary and administration building.

In his announcement and a brochure explaining it, Msgr. Hugh Marren did not reveal a cost estimate, but he did distribute an architectural rendering of a new church made of stone to replace the the wood and stone church built in 1977.

"We need more space," Marren said, citing large gatherings of teenagers and college students at the parish. He said a new three-story administration and classroom building could allow All Saints to open a grammar school in the future.

The brochure cites focus groups whose members said the parish needs more and larger meeting rooms.

It says the current sanctuary was built on sand and silt and is sinking. Structural engineers and a geotechnical engineering

form asserted that sinking pylons to support the concrete slab would be expensive with no guarantee of success. The engineers recommended a new church after removal of the shifting silt and sand.

Without citing cost figures, the report indicates that for the administration building, the most affordable course was to start over.

Smith Boland Architects recommended increasing the size of the two structures from 39,972 square feet to 103,310 square feet. The church would expand from a seating capacity of about 700 to 1000 seats. It would include a choir area, a 100-seat chapel and a walk-in basement with a parish hall accommodating 500 people equipped with a kitchen and

storage space.

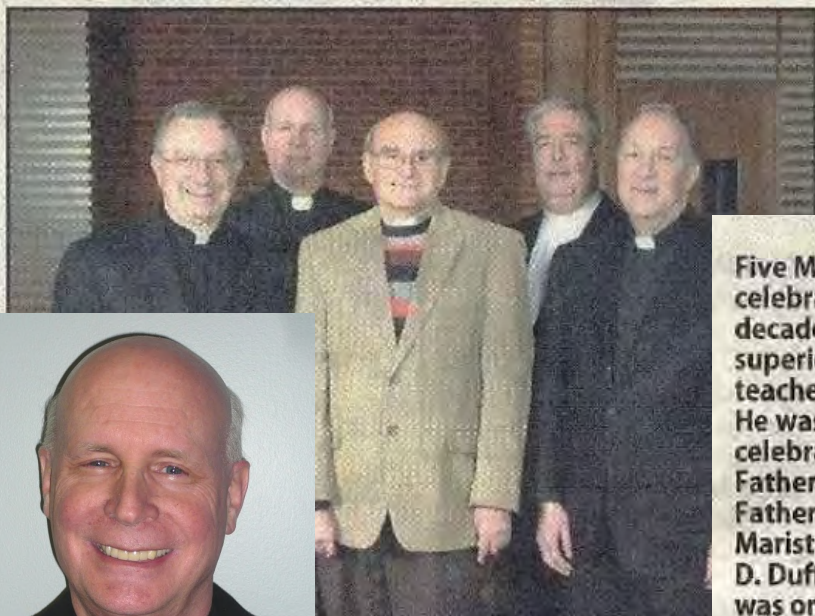
The administration building's three stories would accommodate staff offices, library, conference rooms and the parish school of religion on the first two floors. The third would hold a youth and young adults lounge with accommodations for 500 people.

The All Saints Columbarium and cell/bell tower would remain as they are, as would the lower level of the parish that includes a gym, fitness center and Kiernan Hall, home to Boy Scouts and the Knights of Columbus.

Parking was not addressed in the announcement.

Dunwoody awarded \$784,000 grant for North Peachtree-Tilly Mill

The city of Dunwoody was awarded \$784,000 to complete the Tilly Mill at North Peachtree Intersection Improvement project. The proposed intersection enhancements will relieve congestion, enhance safety and improve bicycle and pedestrian access in the Tilly Mill/North Peachtree Road area.

Improvements will include new turn lanes, bike lanes and sidewalks to all approaches of the Tilly Mill Road/North Peachtree Road intersection. The project will also include a new traffic signal at Peeler Road and North Peachtree Road.

five American chaplains
have been awarded
the Medal of Honor:

- **Lt. Comdr. Joseph Timothy O'Callahan**
U.S. Navy (World War II)
- **Capt. Emil J. Kapaun**
U.S. Army (Korean War)
- **Lt. Vincent Robert Capodanno**
U.S. Navy (Vietnam War)

- **Maj. Charles Joseph Watters**
U.S. Army (Vietnam War)
- **Capt. Angelo J. Liteky**
U.S. Army (Vietnam War)

Every one of them was a Catholic priest, and two have causes for beatification (Kapaun in the Korean War; Capodanno in the Vietnam War).

These are the three chaplains who were awarded the MOH as a result of their actions in Vietnam in 1967.



Charles J. Watters

CH (MAJ) USA

Battle of Dak To, Republic of Vietnam

November 19, 1967

A Catholic priest, he was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor for bravery exhibited while rescuing wounded men in the Vietnam War, specifically the Battle of Dak To. He was killed in the battle in a friendly fire incident when a 500-pound bomb was dropped on American paratroopers near the triage area where he was working.

MAJOR CHARLES JOSEPH WATTERS

United States Army

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in action at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty. Chaplain Watters distinguished himself during an assault in the vicinity of Dak To. Chaplain Watters was moving with one of the companies when it engaged a heavily armed enemy battalion. As the battle raged and the casualties mounted, Chaplain Watters, with complete disregard for his safety, rushed forward to the line of contact. Unarmed and completely exposed, he moved among, as well as in front of the advancing troops, giving aid to the wounded, assisting in their evacuation, giving words of encouragement, and administering the last rites to the dying. When a wounded paratrooper was standing in shock in front of the assaulting forces, Chaplain Watters ran forward, picked the man up on his shoulders and carried him to safety. As the troopers battled to the first enemy entrenchment, Chaplain Watters ran through the intense enemy fire to the front of the entrenchment to aid a fallen comrade. A short time later, the paratroopers pulled back in preparation for a second assault. Chaplain Watters exposed himself to both friendly and enemy fire between the two forces in order to recover two wounded soldiers. Later, when the battalion was forced to pull back into a perimeter, Chaplain Watters noticed that several wounded soldiers were lying outside the newly formed perimeter. Without hesitation and ignoring attempts to restrain him, Chaplain Watters left the perimeter three times in the face of small arms, automatic weapons, and mortar fire to carry and to assist the injured troopers to safety. Satisfied that all of the wounded were inside the perimeter, he began aiding the medics ... applying field bandages to open wounds, obtaining and serving food and water, giving spiritual and mental strength and comfort. During his ministering, he moved out to the perimeter from position to position redistributing food and water, and tending to the needs of his men. Chaplain Watters was giving aid to the wounded when he himself was mortally wounded. Chaplain Watters' unyielding perseverance and selfless devotion to his comrades was in keeping with the highest traditions of the U.S. Army.

If you ever wondered about the man that our **Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly 2688** was named after, here is the information from [*The Military Chaplain Magazine*](#). Just recently, the St. Brigid Sir Knights separated off from our Assembly to form the new **Fr. Joseph T. O'Callahan Assembly 3341**. Both these men won the Congressional Medal of Honor. Watters was killed, O'Callahan survived, however.

Assembly Chalice Travel Kit Donated

Our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly 2688 engraves these chalices with names of up to three deceased Assembly members to ensure their constant remembrance at all future Masses offered by the selected priest. This is a very special gift awaiting all fourth degree members.

Often such travel kits are donated to priests in third world countries, unless a need is found in the U.S.

Consider progressing through the degrees and becoming a fourth degree member of our Assembly. Perpetual remembrance is a very special gift only given Sir Knights.



Sir Knight Frank Zimmerer found out that the Assembly was looking for a worthy recipient of its next travelling chalice kit and contacted them. Frank stated that his Franciscan nephew, Father Matthew J. Janeczko, OFM, was in need of such a kit.

One was promptly ordered. Upon arrival, it was engraved with the names of two recently-deceased Assembly Sir Knights — Paul Buettner of St. Brigid and Paul Reale of All Saints. The emblem of the fourth degree was also added to the chalice and the full name of Fr. Janeczko was engraved on the paten per suggestion by our Ernie Spencer.

Ed Pierson and Dave Mason, both officers of the Watters Assembly, presented the kit on June 17th at the All Saints Social Hall with Sir Knight Jon Bird taking the two pictures. A letter from our Faithful Navigator, Bob Webster, was included.

Father Matthew was scheduled to marry Sir Knight Zimmerer's son in Nashville in late June. The priest was shocked to receive it. He said that one of his fellow priests has one very much like it. The Franciscans travel quite a bit.

This is the ninth large chalice or travel kit awarded by the Watters Assembly in loving memory of its deceased members.

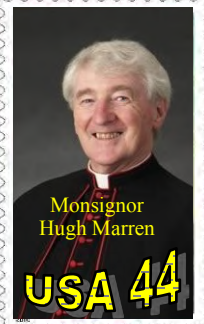
