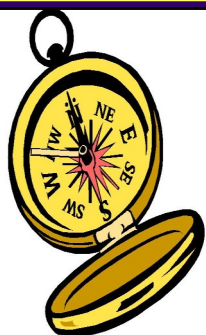

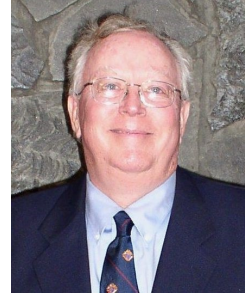


Officer Elections at June Meeting

Our Chancellor, Sir Knight Bill Camden, announced that five of our brothers attended a second degree exemplification at St. Benedict Council on May 27th. They are:

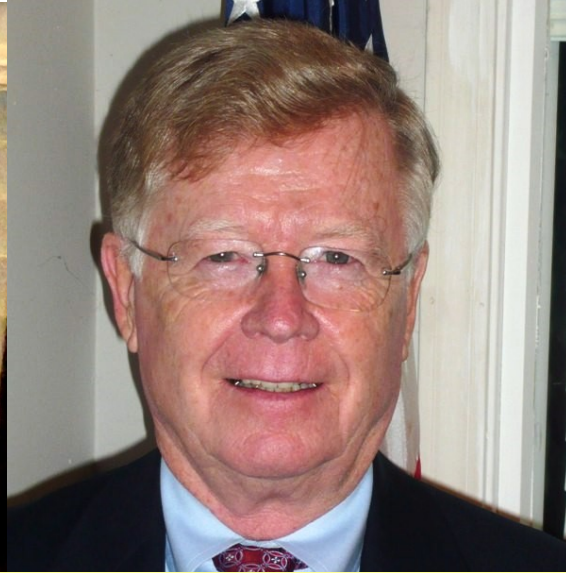

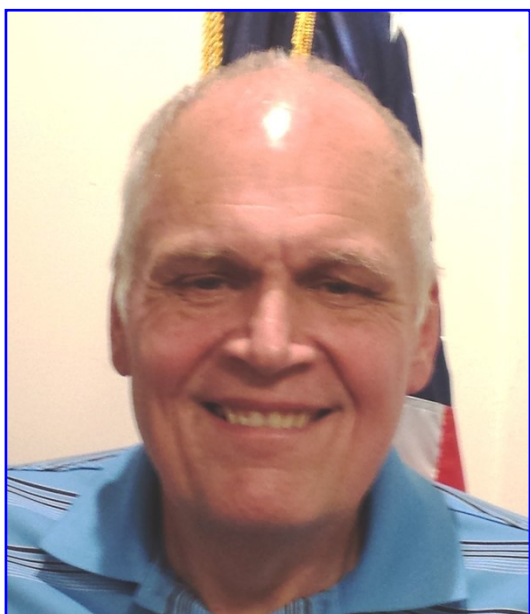
Parish Bingo—June Results

Shortal to challenge Davis in 2015 Dunwoody contest

Denis Shortal, a Dunwoody city councilman and the city's mayor pro-tem, told The Crier Monday he would challenge Mayor Mike Davis in the November city election.

Shortal is a Marine general and retired airline pilot who was elected to represent District 1 when Dunwoody became a city.

He is known for his fiscal prudence.

To win his post and to win re-election in 2013, Shortal tapped into the Wynterhall and Wynter-creek neighborhoods, his long service as a coach at St. Jude Catholic Church and Dunwoody Seniors baseball. In the re-election year, Shortal was opposed by a "Save Dunwoody" candidate and knocked on enough doors to win 58 percent of the vote.

It will be "Mano a Mano" in the November elections as two council brothers fight it out for the Mayor position.

The current Mayor Mike Davis will be tested by Denis Shortal, Mayor Pro Tem of Dunwoody, for the top spot.

"We know that our students are going to be so excited to partner with yours in an exchange," she said through a translator to a handful of Sao Paulo politicians.

The details of the partnership haven't been hashed out yet, but the broad outlines were agreed upon in a stuffy diplomatic session at the Palacio dos Bandeirantes, the governor of Sao Paulo's hilltop estate.

Corbin and a small team of negotiators met with Sao Paulo officials on Wednesday to prep for the pact, and sealed the deal after about an hour of formalities on Thursday, and said it could wind up allowing reciprocal educational opportunities, new study abroad initiatives and internships.

The partnership signed Thursday between the Technical College System of Georgia and its counterpart in Sao Paulo clears the way for a new foreign exchange program between the two higher education systems. It was signed at the tail end of a weeklong trade mission to Brazil led by Gov. Nathan Deal.

Your friends and neighbors with Bike-Walk Dunwoody would like to know: Are you appreciative of the new sidewalks, trails and bike lanes that have been created since Dunwoody became a city? Would you like to see a safe and connected network continued to be built out along our street system for persons on foot, bicycle, wheelchair, and other human-powered means to travel a couple of miles? Would you like it if it was safe for your son or daughter to ride their bike to school? Are you newly retired and interested in getting some fresh air, a bit of exercise by riding a bike to the library for coffee or to meet a friend for lunch? Would you, your spouse and children like to ride your bikes directly from your home over to Brook Run Park to use the new trail, but won't because you just don't want to endanger your family by using the same space on the streets as a 4,000 pound metal box on wheels? Have you ever been late for dinner while you sit in stop and go traffic

knowing that your family is only a few miles away, waiting on you; and you've thought to yourself, "there's got to be a better way?" Have you ever been passed in rush hour by a person on a bicycle and thought, "hmmm..." instead of "you darn you-know-what!!?" Have you been to other cities, regions or countries and experienced the simple pleasure of going on a bicycle ride while feeling comfortable and safe? Would you love to be able to ride your bike from your home for exercise or short trips; but certainly would never be caught riding on Chamblee-Dunwoody, most of Mt. Vernon or Tilly Mill because there's no dedicated space for bikes at the present?

While driving your car, have you ever felt anxious, hesitant or a bit nervous while passing a person riding a bicycle on one of our many street segments that do not have a bike lane or separated space? In contrast, when there is a separated space for persons on bicycles (we've built nearly 10 miles of bike lanes in Dunwoody to-date), do you feel more comfortable and safe when passing them, as they ride along in their own dedicated area?

Instead of hoping and wishing that your hometown was safer for you to have the freedom to access our public amenities and destinations on our publicly-owned streets with the

liberty of your own choice of transportation, would you like to help make a difference?

If you've answered yes to any of these, then Bike-Walk Dunwoody would like to invite you to join us in our Human-Powered 4th of July parade entry.

Bike-Walk Dunwoody, an all-volunteer organization, is all about connecting our community, literally and figuratively. We focus on pedestrian and bicycle transportation options for recreation, going to school, meeting friends for coffee, commuting, family outings or just to get out and get some fresh air.

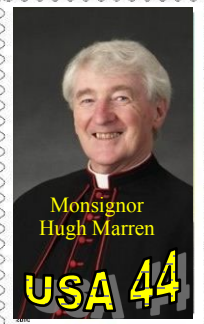
