The Deputy Grand Knight and I are just back from the 105<sup>th</sup> State of Georgia Knights of Columbus convention. We're happy to report that Georgia continues to be a leader in growing our membership, and will finish either in 2<sup>nd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> place nationally.

The State Council has also organized a Scholarship program to support Southern Catholic College that will involve councils state-wide, and continues its effort to support the monastery at Conyers.

The main business of this convention was the election of officers, with outgoing State Deputy John Brenner being succeeded by current State Secretary Dan Baker. Our own PGK Rick Sisko has been elected State Advocate, moving up from State Warden. But, I've saved the really exciting news until last!

Our own Financial Secretary Gert Kampfer and Council 11402 finished in 1<sup>st</sup> place in the "*Keep Christ in Christmas*" Christmas card campaign. After being a 2<sup>nd</sup> place finisher for 3 of the last 4 years, Council 11402 finally earned the "lead dog" position and now enjoys a change of scenery!!! Congratulations to Gert and to all the Brother Knights who contributed to selling cards this past season.

Our Council 11402 is well on its way to achieving **Star Council** status this year, after a 4 year drought. We have exceeded our membership goals for FY 2006-2007 and for the first time since 2003, we've met our insurance quota. This coupled with our traditionally strong slate of programs have earned us the Star Council designation. You all have earned this well-deserved honor!

Following upon the success of another Vidalia onion sale, you'll be happy to know that we've

fulfilled our commitment to the "Our Heritage, Our Future" capital fund campaign. Our final payment was mailed to All Saints this week.

Our float committee continues to work on preparing for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade. Brother Knight Kent Polzin has arranged for the loan of a tractor and a trailer (free of charge). Our design and construction team continues to meet to hammer

out a final design. Last month, we collected \$250 toward offsetting the expenses associated with the float. We'll need to pass the hat, again, as we need another \$300 to \$400 to finish the job. I hope you'll give generously to this effort.

The June meeting is primarily focused on electing officers for the next fraternal year. We have a strong slate of candidates, and we will accept nominations from the floor up to the first ballot. I hope each Brother Knight will make every effort to attend the June meeting to

cast your ballot for the leadership that will guide us through Fraternal Year 2007-2008. I hope to see many of you there.

In closing, this is my last letter to you as Grand Knight for the Fraternal Year 2006-2007. I wish to extend my personal appreciation and thanks to Deputy Grand Knight Frank Callan and his Program Chairs, to our Financial Secretary Gert Kampfer, to our Council Officers and Trustees, and to all the members of Council 11402 for their encouragement, assistance, and support during the last year. We have seen some positive changes in Council 11402, and I hope we'll continue to grow and continue to improve along these lines during the next fraternal year.

We have a bright future ahead of us. Thank you for allowing me to be a small part of bringing that future into the present. Vivat Jesus!

# Vidalia Onion Drive — Another Complete Sellout



Greg Crnkovich continues his tradition of handing out samples like he did at all our Fish Frys. But, thankfully, this time no singing was involved.

#### YOU DID IT!

Thanks to a great Council 11402 TEAM EFFORT, and the leadership of Sales Guru Frank Callan, our Council sold out of our 450 ten pound bags of Vidalia Onions by the end of the 12:15 Sunday Mass. Thanks to all who either <u>bought</u> onions or <u>helped to sell</u> them after the masses on the weekend of April 28-29.

The Onion Sale will bring about \$3,000 to our Council. The first \$2,000 will be used to pay off the remainder of our \$6,000 commitment to the All Saints "*Our Future-Our Heritage*" Fund Raiser. Not bad for a ONE Weekend effort.

Of course, it takes considerably more time and effort than meets the eye. Early in February the initial contacts are made with our supplier in South Georgia, and many emails are sent to get the needed commitments from the other Councils - but we have been doing this for 5 years, so we have a pretty grooved swing on the process.

We want to thank the other five Councils who participated with us this year, namely: St. Andrew (250), St. Benedict (200), St. Brigid (250), St. Peter Chanel (300) and St. Joseph (Athens) (350). We had a record 1,800 bags shipped from South Georgia to cover the needs of the six Councils involved in the sale. Their participation

helps minimize the individual costs for the long distance and local trucking needed.

And, again a big thanks go to Ed Krise and his warehouse staff at *Courier South* for their help in receiving the delivery and arranging for the local delivery to the participating Councils. Also, the team of John Buchholz, Frank Callan and Jim Rainsford reallocated the shipment onto the pallets for the specific Councils. Thankfully, no back injuries were reported. Next year we will need some "young" backs to help with this stage of the work.

With John Buchholz taking the easy way out and traveling to Europe just before the Sale, Frank Callan enthusiastically stepped forward to handle the job of *ONION SALES MANAGER*, and did a great job of organizing and directing the many volunteers who stepped forward to help, as well as acting as Inventory Control Manager to make sure that each station had ONIONS to sell. Over 60

Brother Knights served on our Sales Team - a new record for participation. A Special thanks to those Brothers who worked at multiple Masses to ensure that "No Onion Was Left Unsold".

While it's tempting to think in terms of "MORE ONIONS" for next year, we feel very fortunate to have this year's great weather and the continued support of our All Saints Parishioners so time will tell as to how many onions will be ordered in the future. What do you think?

But, for now it's time to "Stop and Smell the Onions!"





# **Southern Catholic College Information Night**

Yet another event in the planned program of informative speakers was held in McGivney Hall on Tuesday May 15<sup>th</sup>. Parishioner Peter Kehoe gave a presentation on the history, facilities, finances, scholarships, and various future plans for the 100-acre Southern Catholic College (SCC) in Dawsonville. He is a trustee and gives this presentation to all interested groups.

Southern Catholic is the only Catholic college in Georgia and is independent of the Atlanta Archdiocese. This extremely beautiful campus has been in operation for two school years with the first graduating class scheduled for 2009.

It was learned that **Father Brian Higgins**, who gave our second Council Day of Reflection, is now the chaplain of the school. They are instituting a program of summer retreats and other outings on their grounds when the facilities are under-utilized. The presence of an adjacent golf course, modern villas, a lake, and a giant swimming pool make the venue very attractive.

Several area KofC councils have lent support in various forms to SCC and it is hoped that our Council can do likewise. #### Father McCormick To Celebrate 50 Years As Priest

UNWOODY—Father Daniel J. McCormick, the first priest to be ordained for the new Diocese of Atlanta in 1957, will celebrate the 50th anniversary of his ordination at a concelebrated Mass at 12:15 p.m. on Sunday, June 3, at All Saints Church.

The Mass will be followed at 1:30 p.m. by a reception in the parish hall for current and former parishioners and other friends and relatives of Father McCormick. The public is invited to the golden jubilee Mass and reception.

Father McCormick has served at All Saints Church in Dunwoody, where he is a parochial vicar, for over a decade. He is also chaplain for the Veterans Hospital in Atlanta and continues his longtime service in the Province of Atlanta Court of Appeals where he is Defender of the Bond. He is a Vicar for Clergy of the Atlanta Archdiocese.

Father McCormick was ordained for the newly established Atlanta Catholic diocese on June 1, 1957 by Bishop Francis E. Hyland in Father McCormick's home parish, St. Mary Star of the Sea Church, in Far Rockaway, N.Y.


Father McCormick was born Dec. 2, 1927, in Lynbrook, N.Y. After graduation from Malvern High School, he served in the U.S. Navy from 1946 to 1948 on a destroyer and in the submarine service. He attended St. Joseph's College in Philadelphia from 1948 to 1950.

In 1950 Father McCormick transferred to St. Philip Neri in Boston, a school that specialized in accelerated Latin courses for candidates preparing to go to a seminary to train for priesthood. Next he attended St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore majoring in philosophy and theology before finishing his studies in May 1957.

Over the past 50 years, Father Dan, as he is known to parishioners and friends across the Atlanta Archdiocese, has served in many parishes as pastor and a parochial vicar. Upon arrival in Atlanta in 1957, he received a temporary assignment to St. Thomas More Church in Decatur and also helped out at St. John Chrysostom Melkite Church in Atlanta. His first permanent assignment was at St. Anthony Church in southwest Atlanta. He also taught at St. Joseph's High School in downtown Atlanta.

He has served as a pastor in numerous parishes including St.

Patrick in Norcross, St. Bernadette in Cedartown, St. Lawrence in Lawrenceville, St. Mary in Rome, St. John Neumann in Lilburn, and Holy Trinity in Peachtree City. He also spent over two years with the monks at Holy Spirit Monastery in Conyers before returning to active service as an Atlanta diocesan priest. He also has served multiple other parish assignments and as chaplain to the Roswell police and to the Georgia Sheriffs Association.

### **State of the Council Report**

All Saints Council 11402 now has a very healthy membership and its rolls are steadily growing. Average age of the membership has been decreasing. The breakdown of 229 members by their degree attained is now:

 $1^{st}$  Degree = 73 Brothers

 $2^{nd}$  Degree = 2 Brothers

 $3^{rd}$  Degree = 77 Brothers

4<sup>th</sup> Degree = 77 Sir Knights

Our yearly objective is always to move all  $1^{st}$  and  $2^{nd}$  degree knights to  $3^{rd}$ , and then all  $3^{rd}$  degree knights to  $4^{th}$ . Each  $3^{rd}$  degree knight is considered a <u>full</u> knight, while the  $4^{th}$  degree is an honored special Sir Knight category---- a member of a multi-council Assembly of Sir Knights and a voluntary candidate for ceremonial Honor Guard activities.

We have a few first degree members that are currently under suspension for non-payment of dues. We find that 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> degree knights almost <u>never</u> leave the Order, while new 1<sup>st</sup> degree knights sometimes waver if they fail to begin participation immediately in any of our many important and fun activities.

To that end, the officers should strive to plan activities that get new members involved, and older members need to work new brothers into their friendship circles and onto activity teams. Everyone must progress toward full knighthood.

#### **Our Newest Council Brothers**








At the 4th Degree Assembly Meeting at McGivney on May 10th, another 4th degree transfer Sir Knight arrived and asked to join Watters Assembly.

**George H. Foster** – is helping us get some new carpet for McGivney at a cheap price and we finally have some sample swatches to examine.




