Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

It was my distinct privilege to accompany Brothers Caniglia, Crnkovich, Jedlicka, and Knight and the wives to the 108th Annual KofC Georgia State Convention at the Augusta Marriott Hotel.

For the second consecutive year, Council 11402 walked away with a major award in front of the entire Georgia hierarchy of the Order---about 300 people dressed in tuxedos and evening gowns in their great ballroom. It is a long stroll to applause that one could never tire of taking.

We won first place in the **Family Service** category for our wonderful series of seminars held in McGivney called "Fathers for Good" that focused on fathering and a second series on husbanding.

These remarkable sessions were taught by Sir Knight Jeff Durthaler and also brother Mike Tobia. They have already resulted in four new recruits to the Order as well.

We are so pleased that finally we are using our marvelous McGivney Hall media center for educational purposes that benefit both the Knights and parish community simultaneously. This will continue.

Our Council was also proud to place the name of our fifth Grand Knight, Rick Sisko, into nomination for Georgia State Secretary. This position is second only to the State Deputy office. The State Secretary usually is next in line for the State Deputy position. He won the election handily. That means that one of our own could become State Deputy in a year. He is currently a member of St. Brigid Council.

The only sad part of the weekend was knowing that I could not attend Sir Knight David Moeller's grand funeral. I would have loved to serve in the Honor Guard for the man that recruited me personally into the Order by constantly asking me at the 7:30 AM Mass we both attended. His acolytes serve about 50 funerals a year, and it was finally his turn to use

this unique service. Honor him by taking his place.

That same May 15/16 weekend saw the conclusion of another very extraordinary Vidalia Onion Sale under direction of a relieved John Buchholz who worried for weeks about the late crop this year.

While all these events were happening on the same day, fellow knights were grilling food in our giant cooker for a **Welcome to Newcomers Picnic**. When you have a council of over 300 members, you can run simultaneously in four directions.

The previous weekend we were honored to be co-sponsors of the Men's Club Golf Tournament at St. Marlo Country Club in Duluth. An amazing total of 144 golfers took part in a charity event that came off like clock work thanks to the expert management of Men's Club President Tom Simon, also a brother.

If the name seems familiar, he is the same guy who manages our Lenten Fish Fry with Dennis Caniglia. It's no accident when events keep turning out both successful and record-breaking year after year. Just look to the people that run them.

We wish Brother Norb Braza good luck in taking up Dave Moeller's mantle as the Director of Acolytes. Please give him every cooperation that you gave Dave. We are always in need of more altar servers, especially during the work week. It is a very great honor to serve on the altar of God.

Original Nominations for 2010-2011 Officers

The Nominating Committee chaired by Sir Knight Don Myers and composed of members Lou Hlad and Jim Mammoser have interviewed and spoken to prospective candidates for officer positions for the coming 2010-2011 Fraternal Year. These recommendations were preliminary based upon agreement of these brothers to serve if elected to these positions. Any 3rd degree or higher member is eligible to run for any of these offices, and may be nominated from the floor at the June Council Meeting on Tuesday, June 1st.

The recommended nominations for the 13 officer positions are:

Deputy Grand Knight – **Bob Fiscella** (former Community Event Chairman)
Chancellor – **Kevin Murray** (former Outside Guard)
Recorder – **Ed Trainor** (incumbent)
Treasurer – **Joe Cavallero** (incumbent)
Advocate – **Tom Mix** (incumbent)
Warden – **Stan Wasowski** (incumbent, but newly-installed)

Inside Guard (Lead) – **Ed Pierson** (incumbent)
Inside Guard Assistant – open (Jack Klapka will not continue) (not an officer position)
Inside Guard Assistant – open (Chris Trantow has moved to Smyrna) (not an officer position)

Outside Guard – **Gene Gannon** (incumbent)
Outside Guard – **Bill Schmitz** (incumbent)
(Our bylaws allow two Outside Guard officers)

Trustee 3-year Term – **Lou Hlad** (former Grand Knight)
Trustee 2-year Term – **Don Myers** (former Trustee 3 year)
Trustee 1-year Term – **Greg Crnkovich** (former Trustee 2 year)

Appointed positions by the Grand Knight are Chaplain, Financial Secretary, and Lecturer. It is anticipated that the current incumbent will continue their service. Monsignor Kiernan, Gert Kampfer, and Mike Will are current incumbents. The Financial Secretary has a defined three-year term and that term is not expired.

Program director and chairmen are appointed by the next Grand Knight. Some changes will occur.

Additional Nominations for 2010-2011 Officers

Since the above recommendations were made, several other knights have thrown their hats into the ring. It will be a wild election. Please make sure you are there on Tuesday, June 1st, to vote. No absentee ballots allowed.

Inside Guard - **Mark Foster** (not presently an officer) will be nominated from the floor

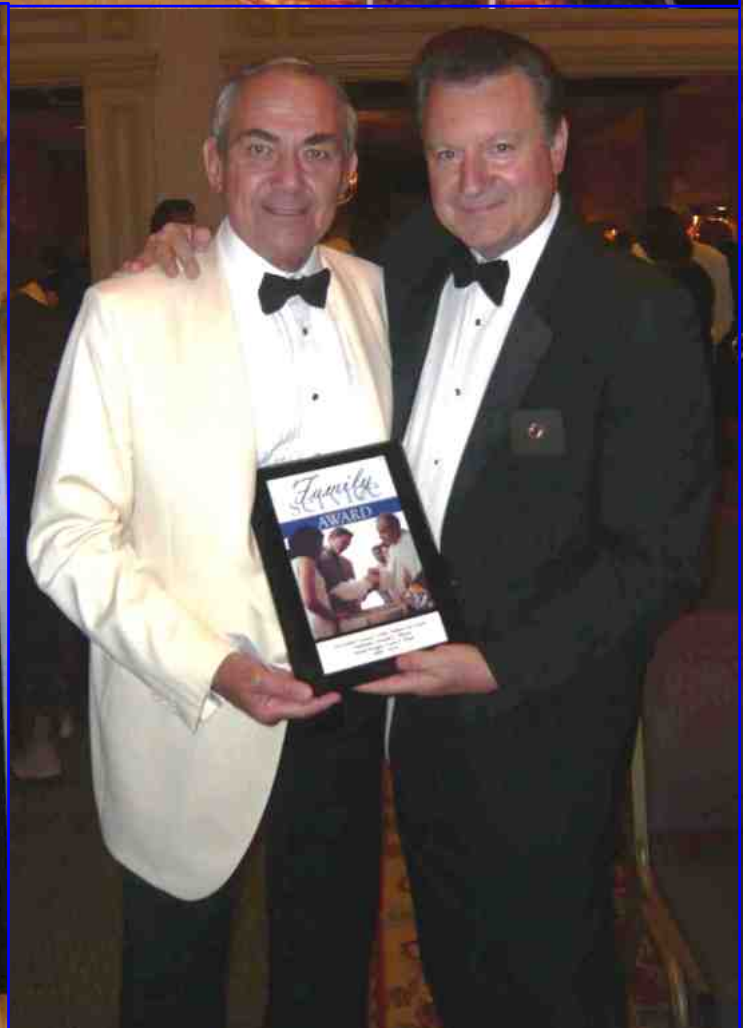
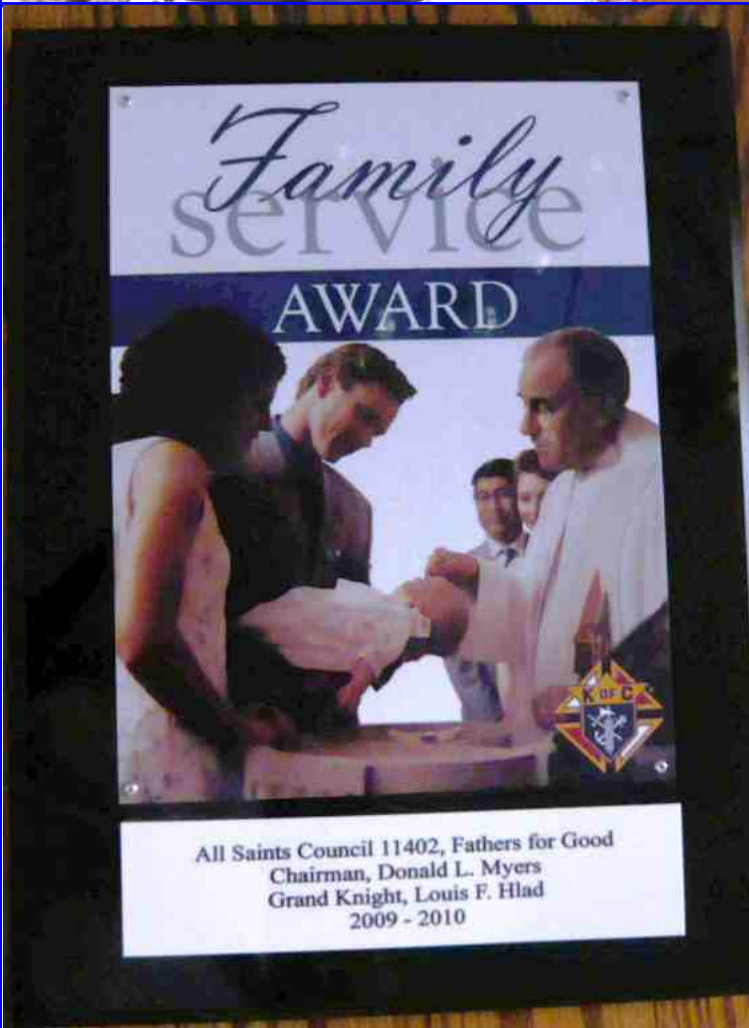
Each candidate in a contested election can give a two minute speech before the election if he chooses. Any candidate not successful in any election, can be nominated for any lower officer in the order listed above.

All Saints Wins Another Coveted State Award

This was the scene in the crowded ballroom of the Augusta Marriott Hotel as Grand Knight Lou Hlad accepted the Georgia State Award for Family Service in front of the elite members of the Georgia Order. Representatives of 85 councils and all state officers and all their ladies were present at the award banquet. It was the second consecutive state award and fifth in our all-time collection in McGivney Hall.

The award is the product of the two sets of "Fathers for Good" seminars held by Sir Knight Jeff Durthaler and Brother Mike Tobia in the Media Center of McGivney Hall. The first seminar dealt with Christian fathering, while the second covered Christian husbandry. Both were patterned after courses laid out by the Order. The courses resulted in the recruiting of four new members to our council.

We expect more such valuable courses held in our Hall and more similar very positive results.

Why Membership Growth is So Important

There are some brothers who believe that now that we have achieved our goal of a council with 300 members, that further membership growth is not very important. They believe we should stand pat and not keep trying for Star or Double Star Awards which they see only serving as bragging rights for officers.

Anyone who attended the recent Georgia State Convention knows the importance that constant Order growth across the nation and the world is becoming a growing bulwark against the Secularism that is creeping into our society. Pro-Life anti-abortion struggles need our growing organized opposition. Christianity is under siege.

Georgia is the fastest growing Catholic state by recent percentage tallies and that growth is transforming the local landscape. There are 103 Georgia Councils and nearly 15,000 knights now in a state where a Catholic could hardly be found a few years ago. Worldwide Order membership has ballooned to 1.8 million men.

There are literally hundreds of thousands of Catholic men in Georgia who are not yet Knights. Our Savannah Council #637 has over 600 members. We have 100 chairs in our Council chamber. Let's fill them all for every meeting. We still have a couple of Double Stars within our grasp. Our next one will be an unprecedented fourth consecutive one, signaling 20% yearly growth and significant insurance participation. We helped spin off the Mary Our Queen Council recently. The State Deputy wants us to now invigorate St. Jude's Council.

As they stated in Augusta, "*any Council that is not growing, is dying.*"

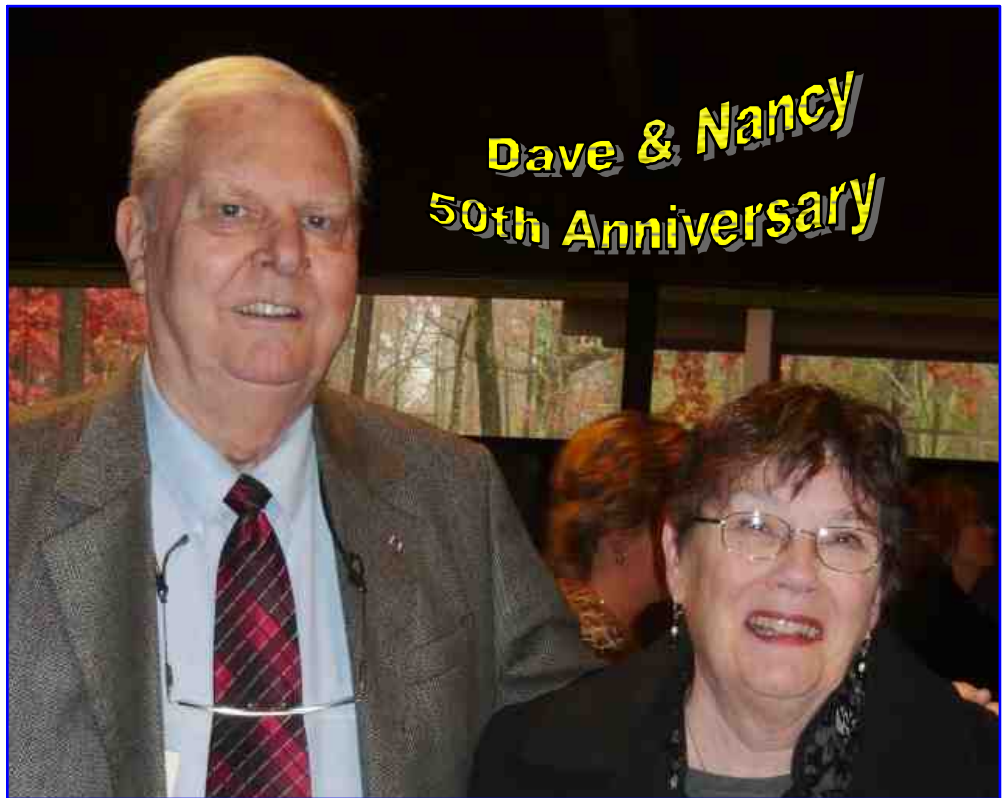

David B. Moeller, age 74, of Atlanta, died Sunday, May 9, 2010. He is survived by his wife of 51 years, Nancy Moeller. Also surviving are sons and daughters-in-law, Steve and Nancy Moeller, Mark and Patsy Moeller, daughter and son-in-law, Karen and John Dwyer, and daughter and companion, Judi Moeller and Michael Simmons. He also leaves behind his beloved grandchildren, Katy and Kelly Dwyer, Annie and Bernie Moeller, and Ted, Emory and Sam Moeller. Other members of his family include his brother and sister-in-law, Paul and Marian Moeller, sister-in-law Rose Moeller and his late brother Roy Moeller. He was a founding member of All Saints Catholic Church in Dunwoody, where he was active for many years in the Knights of Columbus. Dave worked in sales for Standard Register Company for many years, prior to running his own business. His true vocation, though, was as a committed family man, loyal friend and devoted Catholic. David Moeller was one of the “lions” of the All Saints Council, but the lion sleeps tonight. He succumbed to a host of illnesses probably associated with the onset of his sunset years. Dave was only a week short of age 75 and died of blood infections that were caused by problems with his failing digestive system. Medications for Parkinson’s Disease and Diabetes complicated the ability to stabilize his internal functions.

Director of our still-unique 64-man Acolyte Program, he managed the interface with the parish office for the staffing of acolytes for about 50 All Saints Parish funeral ceremonies a year and several other special occasions. He was a familiar face as an usher at the Sunday 10:30 Mass as well. His Acolyte Program won the KofC Georgia State Church Activity Award last year.

He seldom missed an opportunity to engage in a Wednesday poker session, and he always reminded us to fund Birthright, his favorite charity. Even on bad legs and with a cane, he attended Right-to-Life marches. Dave also never missed a chance to try recruiting a new member. He actually was the one who recruited our Grand Knight, Lou Hlad, as a brother (but that should not be held against him).

Thank all of you that participated in his very memorable funeral ceremony. Please pray for our 28th deceased brother and also for Nancy and the rest of the Moeller family. We are collecting donations for a David Moeller Memorial Fund as stated above.

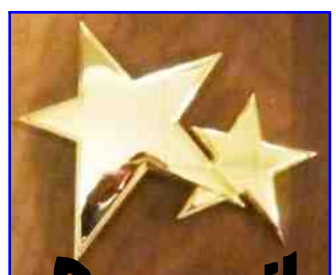
