

Council Supports Soap Box Derby for Third Year

For the third consecutive year, All Saints 11402 will lend its McGivney Hall to the Dunwoody Soap Box Derby supporters for the purpose of building race cars for the Saturday June 4 event at 8:30 AM. Last year there were about 28 cars entered in the race in two divisions (Stock and Super Stock). This year there may be over 35 cars and a third division (Super Kids) will be featured. The race is held at First Baptist Church, North Peachtree & I-285.

The Super Kids division will feature wide-bodied race cars that hold two occupants side by side. One is the driver and one is a passenger with some sort of a disability. Normally, disabled youths are not able to participate in the event. Supporters are now looking for youngsters with disabilities that would have parental permission to ride as passengers in the race. Winners in each of the three divisions would go on to race in the national finals in Akron, Ohio.



The race is supported primarily by the Dunwoody Kiwanis Club-- an organization that specializes in youth mentoring. We are fortunate to have as our council member the president of that organization (Rob Swanson) and also the race technical director (Al Alberghini). His wife Addie Alberghini has served as the race director. Rob Swanson's wife, Susan Swanson, is the new director of the Super Kids Division. Thus, our council ties to the Derby event and its sponsors are very strong.

Four clinic dates were held at McGivney Hall-- April 30th, May 14th, May 21st, and May 28th.

This new race is specifically for kids ages 8-17 with disabilities that would otherwise prevent them from competing in the All American Soap Box Derby race. Racers from Clayton, DeKalb, Gwinnett, Henry and Rockdale counties are eligible to enter the race.

Super Kids racing cars are built by our Soap Box Derby Association, so the Super Kids are not responsible for building their own cars. They ride down the hill in a car that accommodates two kids, an experienced driver who drives the car and the Super Kid who has a fun experience. The race has expanded every year. Next year, maybe 50 cars, we're told.

Trustee 2-year Term – Lou Hlad (former Trustee 3-year)

Trustee 1-year Term – Don Myers (former Trustee 2-year)

<u>Appointed</u> positions by the Grand Knight are Chaplain, Financial Secretary, and Lecturer. It is now anticipated that two of the three current incumbents will continue their positions. Monsignor Kiernan and John Buchholz are current incumbents who will continue.

Gert Kampfer, the current Financial Secretary has served superbly for 11 years and will not continue in that office. John Stowell was the proposed appointee as the new Financial Secretary, and he has just been certified by Supreme. His term began immediately upon his certification on May 23rd. Council provided physical services for the building of Soap Box Racers in our McGivney Hall for community youth.


Our Fathers for Good Seminars continued all month.

YOU DID IT! Thanks to a great Council 11402 TEAM EFFORT our Council sold out of our 520 ten pound bags of Vidalia Onions (Only had 7 bags left for the 6 PM Sunday Mass). Thanks to all who either BOUGHT onions or helped to SELL them after the masses on the weekend of April 30-May 1. This is a very important source of funds to help our various charities.

Of course, it takes considerably more time and effort than meets the eye. Late in January the initial contacts are made with our Supplier in South Georgia, and many emails are sent to get the needed commitments from the other Councils - but we have been doing this for 9 years so we have a pretty grooved swing on the process.

We want to thank the other Councils who participated with us this year, namely: St. Andrew (175), St. Benedict (350), St. Brigid (375), St. Peter Chanel (300), OLA (300), St. Monica (400), St. Brendan (250), Mary Our Queen (130), St. Thomas More (200) and St. Joseph (Athens) (250). We had a record 3,250 bags shipped from South Georgia (16.5 TONS) to cover the needs of the Eleven Councils involved. Their participation helps minimize the individual costs for the long distance and local trucking needed.

The other notable fact is that this event - much like the Fish Fry - gives our member Knights a chance to work with and get to know other members of our Council. Hopefully it will encourage them to become more active members.
