It is with mixed emotions that I sit down to write my last Grand Knight's Report. It hardly seems like two years have passed since you elected me to lead Council 11402 as Grand Knight. They have been two very challenging and rewarding years.

In those two years, our numbers have grown from almost 300 brother knights to almost 400. We have bid farewell to eight brothers who have gone to their eternal reward.

We have sold almost 6 tons of Vidalia onions (that's "retail" at All Saints – it's about 25-30 tons if you count "wholesale" sales to our sister councils), sold two tractor trailer loads of pumpkins from the first ever All Saints Pumpkin Patch, served almost fifteen thousand fish fry meals, hosted spaghetti dinners, a low country boil, and two Oktoberfests.

We welcomed a new pastor, Monsignor Marren, who, like Monsignor Kiernan, has been extremely supportive of all our activities and under whose leadership we moved our "World Famous Fish Fry" to its new, larger venue in the gym with its expanded new kitchen facilities.

We had memorial Masses, assisted as acolytes at funerals, provided honor guards at various special events. Our work has been recognized at both the State level (Youth and Family Service Program Awards, two Double Star Council Awards), and at the International level (Youth Service Program Award).

These would be enough to make any council proud. Yet they just scratch the surface of all that you have done over the past two years.

And I emphasize that – all YOU have done.

While I may have been at the helm, you all provided to energy, enthusiasm, hard work, time (along with your spouses and significant others) that made all of this possible. I have been truly blessed to be Grand Knight of a wonderful council for the past two years.

The June meeting is election time. It is time for me to step down, and pass the gavel to a new Grand Knight. I am confident that you will elect a new slate of officers for the up-

coming fraternal year and give them the same outstanding level of support that you gave me and the current officers.

We have accomplished a lot in the past two years, and I look forward to even more accomplishments as we move forward into the future with our new officers.

There are still upcoming worthy events on the June calendar.

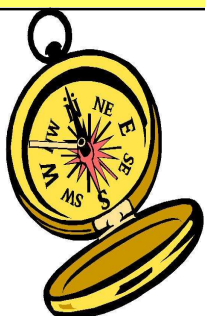

Council Officer Elections in June

As we near the conclusion of another Fraternal Year (July 1 to June 30), the council prepares for an election of officers at the June Meeting. Please note this very important meeting on your calendars and plan to attend and vote.

The three trustees of the council-- Gert Kampfer, Lou Hlad, and Don Myers- are entrusted with the duty of canvassing the officers to ascertain whether or not they wish to rerun for their offices. Interest from other 3rd and 4th degree members is also sought out to bring new talent and energy to the council.

At the Tuesday May 1st meeting, the trustees must announce the result of their efforts and reveal their suggestions for the June elections. The suggestions are not binding and any member attaining the 3rd degree may run for any officer position. All members who attend the June business meeting (Tuesday June 5th) may vote. There are no absentee ballots.

These are the selections of the Nominating Committee for the June elections. Remember that any brother in All Saints Council having attained the 3rd degree may run against these nominees for any position.

It is anticipated that current Financial Secretary, John Stowell, will not continue. Assistant Inside and Outside Guards will be chosen as well and may or may not be the incumbents. Activity Directors are also appointed and will be announced after the election.

It is anticipated that our council will have a new District Deputy as well, since the district boundaries are being redefined. A District Deputy is a supervisor of several councils and reports their compliance with regulations directly to the Georgia State Deputy, Rick Sisko. It is possible that the new District Deputy could be a very familiar face to our membership. Our new district will include All Saints, Immaculate Heart of Mary, and the Georgia Tech Council.

Our current lead Outside Guard, Gene Gannon, has moved to Woodstock and is in the process of transferring to the nearby St. Peter Chanel Council. We will miss his valuable contributions to our service projects and wish him well at his new parish and council.

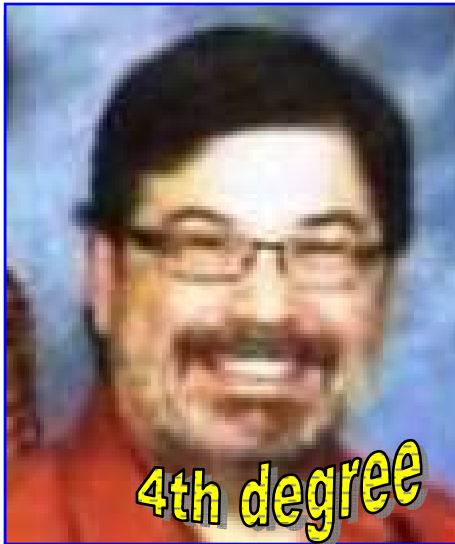

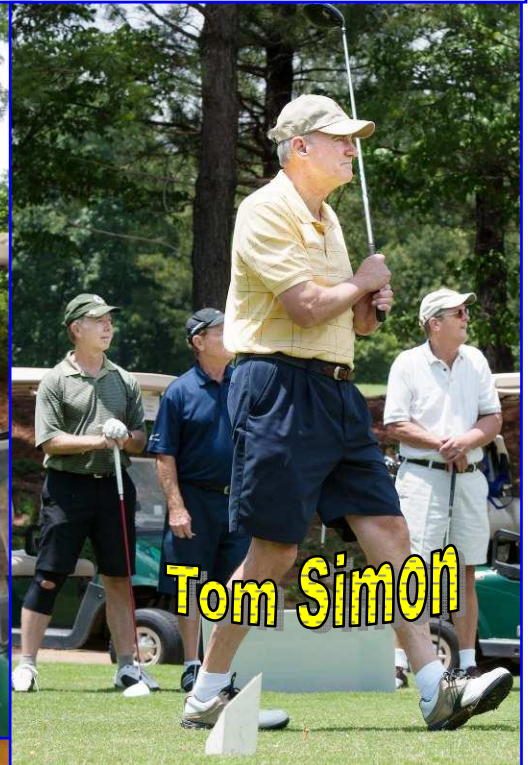

Our Dunwoody Charity Golf Tournament and our Vidalia Onion Sale both raised significant amounts for charities.

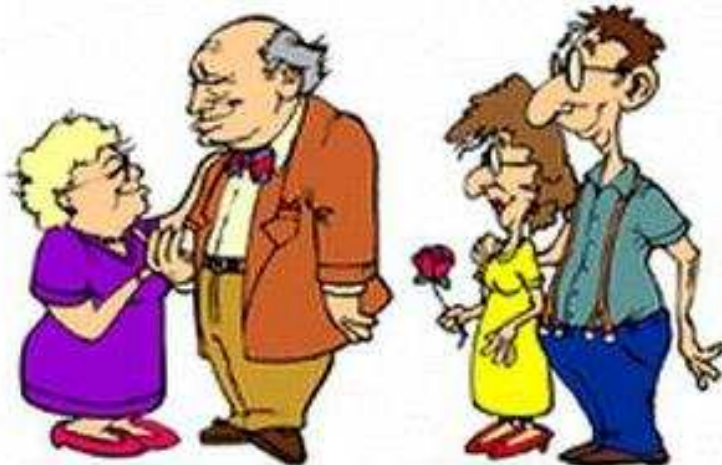
The Charity Committee approved a \$500 gift to the Life Teen Ministry in the parish.

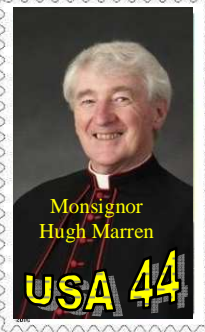
