

# New 3rd Degree Council Brothers



# Elections at June 3rd Business Meeting

Our Tuesday, June 3rd, Business Meeting will be our Fraternal Year election meeting. The fraternal year extends from July 1<sup>st</sup> 2014 to June 30<sup>th</sup> 2015. Please make a serious effort to attend, since our elections are most important to the future functioning of the council. Members must attend the meeting to vote. There are no absentee ballots allowed. Members must have paid their dues to be eligible to either vote or run for office.

Every brother, 3<sup>rd</sup> degree or 4<sup>th</sup> degree, is eligible to run for any office. I hope that anyone who is not currently an officer, but wishes to run, will immediately notify a member of the Nominating Committee. That committee consists of Bob Mitchell, Stan Wasowski, and Don Myers, the three council trustees. Their contact information is near the back of this newsletter.

The Nominating Committee surveys current officers to see if they wish to run for another term and gives their recommendations to the council. These are only recommendations and may be can be ignored by the voters. An eligible member may even be nominated from the floor just before the voting for that office at the June Business Meeting.

Usually most of our officers wish to return, making the Nominating Committee's recommendations easy. This year will see a greater than usual change of officers. Grand Knight Fiscella and Treasurer Commito have not chosen to rerun for their positions. Trustee 1-Year, Don Myers, slides off the officer list as the trustees move down one slot each. The retiring Grand Knight traditionally becomes the Trustee 3-year term officer, but that is an elected position. The Chaplain and Lecturer offices are appointed by the new Grand Knight and are not elected positions. The Financial Secretary is appointed by the Supreme Knight for a three-year term.




# Monsignor Kiernan Still Active at 89

## Kiernan to lead Jekyll project

Msgr. R. Donald Kiernan, pastor emeritus of All Saints Catholic Church in Dunwoody is now a man on another mission. He calls it a "second col-

lection."

Kiernan recently observed two milestones - his 65th anniversary as a priest and an appointment to the advisory board of the Jekyll Island Foundation, a job he sought quietly for many years.

After his ordination in 1949 he was sent to a church in Savannah, before there was an archdiocese of Atlanta. That introduced him to Jekyll Island, a place for golf and relaxation. Kiernan went there often, especially since to this day he has never flown in an airplane.

"With this appointment," he said, "I now have a purpose and an opportunity to give something back to a place that is close to heaven as anywhere on this planet."

nounced this week that its next undertaking is the relocation and renovation of the Skeet House, the only historic building on Jekyll that isn't located in the historic district there.

The Skeet House, as its name implies, was built as a recreational facility for hunters. The foundation proposes to repurpose it into an educational classroom with an exhibit detailing the hunting and sporting history of the island. The venue will direct visitors to the Jekyll Island Club, the Turtle Center and the historic cottages built in the 1890s by the Rockefeller,

Morgan and Vanderbilt families of the Gilded Age.

Spearheading the fund-raising for the foundation is Danny Ross, a founding member of All Saints and a former city councilman. He sent a letter this week to people who might be interested in contributing.

Kiernan said the renovation and move would cost \$100,000. He said an anonymous donor has contributed \$5000 and he will personally donate another \$5000 to get the project going.

Kiernan is known across Georgia for his pioneering work with the Catholic Church,

witnessing the growth of the faith to more than 1 million parishioners and the construction of 90 churches in north Georgia.

He also is known for being the 1962 co-founder of the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police. He served as its director and chaplain for more than 20 years. Kiernan also was chaplain for the Georgia State Patrol, the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, the DeKalb County police department and was the first chaplain for the Sandy Spring poise department.

Anyone who thought that our Brother, Sir Knight Monsignor Donald Kiernan was sitting around in his room at St. George Village watching TV is very mistaken. He still has miles to go before he sleeps. We are proud of our member.

# All Saints Parish Onion Sale Sets Record



Once again, our Council has stepped up to the task of Selling Vidalia Onions and wound up setting a NEW RECORD of 560 ten– pound bags of these “Fresh From The Farm” onions. Thanks to the Management Team of John Buchholz, Dean Trantow and Bruce Malinoff, PLUS over 70 Super Sales Volunteers, we SOLD OUT by the end of the 5 PM Sunday Mass.

This year we supported 9 Councils for a total of 2,300

ten-pound bags. Normally we would have had more councils (last year the total was nearly 3,000 bags) but we lost 3 councils when we had to defer the selling date due to the lateness of the Onion Crop.

This year’s participating councils were (by number of bags sold):

All Saints – 560, Basilica of the Sacred heart – 75, Mary our Queen – 95, St. Andrews – 200, St. Benedict – 300, St. Brendan – 200, St. Brigid – 400, St. Joseph’s (Athens ) -200, St. Monica – 275

This Sale wouldn’t be possible without ALL YOUR HELP – and the help of Deacon Ed Krise and his staff at Courier South, who year after year have allowed us to use their Norcross warehouse to receive the onions, redistribute them to pallets for the individual Councils, and then handle the "on-time" delivery.

It is always hard to try to figure out just how many onions to order for All Saints. For for the last few years we have sold out by the end of the 12:15 Mass. This year we decided we would order a few more onions and show the 5 PM Mass attendees what a Vidalia Onion looked like. Thankfully, they liked what they saw. We set a new record and made more \$\$\$\$ for our Charities.

But, it wouldn’t have happened if we hadn’t had great results from selling to the attendees at the Chinese Mass at 3 PM. Thanks to Brother Ky Phanhsavath, who is part of this small Catholic Community, we sold 17 bags at this Mass. He literally stopped the people in their tracks with his sales pitch (in Chinese-of course) to buy our onions. Still not sure what he said, but IT WORKED!

There are lots of similar stories of Council Brothers and family members who went far and above the norm to help our Sale be such a success. Thanks to all who BOUGHT onions,


