Last week saw the beginning of Lent (Ash Wednesday was February 22nd) and with that comes the WORLD FAMOUS ALL SAINTS FISH FRY.

The practice run was on Friday February 17th and saw a practice event record of 298 meals served from the inaugural use of the new gym kitchen facility.

For our new members (and for those who may not have had the chance to participate in the past) the Fish Fry is a great opportu-

nity to get to know fellow Knights and to be a part of an event that has become almost legendary.

There are some "skill positions," (the Clam Chowder recipe is a closely guarded secret, rivaled by the Coca Cola Formula and Colonel Sanders 11 herb and spices – and NO, even I do not know it!!).

There is always room for new guys among the servers and especially on the take down and cleanup shifts. Those later shifts used to be billed as 8-11 PM, but with the efficiency of the new facility, it looks like we are getting done before 10 PM. That said, the clean-up crew, (formerly known as the "Knights of the Lower Realm") always seem to generate the most memorable stories. It has even been rumored that an "adult beverage" or two has been consumed during the telling and the hearing.

For those going to volunteer at the Fish Fry, I suggest coming a little earlier than you usually would and spending a few minutes of quite time visiting your best friend.

All Saints Acolyte Program Expansion



All Saints 11402 has a unique service program in all the world. Our brothers serve on the altar for every funeral held at our parish. They also serve at times for special occasions. There is about one funeral per week on average.


Currently 75 brothers are arranged into five teams, each with a team captain. Their director is Norb Braza at nlbraza@aol.com and 770-393-8645. Four teams rotate duties for funerals during the week and the fifth team is the weekend team for brothers that have fulltime jobs.

Each brother acolyte wears a navy blue blazer, grey dress slacks, white shirt, black dress shoes, and a special blue tie with KofC logos. The tie is given to all members free of charge to ensure uniformity of appearance. A typical Mass team consists of a cross bearer, two candle bearers, water and wine bearers. If available a sixth brother is used for incense bearer and to balance the team on the altar. Serving on the altar for Mass is a huge honor and responsibility.

All altar movements are choreographed for uniformity, dignity, and reverence. Training is not difficult. The altar items, candles, and chairs are handled before Mass by the team and stored away afterward. Any attendee at an All Saints funeral can not help but be impressed by the beauty of the unique ceremony. We constantly receive thanks and compliments from family and friends of the deceased. The team is always invited to church receptions held afterward.

If you were an altar server in your youth, or even if you were not, we hope that you will consider joining this beautiful ministry started by our own Sir Knight Monsignor Kiernan in 1997. He was having trouble finding altar servers on school days and turned to the Knights. We have handled every funeral at All Saints since that time. Consider joining one of our teams. We are in special need of additional weekend acolytes. This timeframe allows our younger working brothers to take a very important and active part in council activities. And if truth be told, it is a lot of fun.

Joe Kane Awarded Knight-of-Month





Fish Fry Move to the Gym Successful



Our growing Lenten Fish Frys had exhausted the small facility of the Social Hall over the past several years. The Knights and Monsignor Marren decided that these events needed to be moved to the gym where there was a much greater seating capacity.

Because the kitchen capacity in the gym was also very inadequate for event this size, the existing hand-ball court was converted into a second kitchen. New tables and 400 chairs were ordered. The folding, padded maroon chairs had not yet arrived by our first two frys, but have now arrived to enhance the comfort of patrons. A complete electrical rework was required to sustain the fryers, ovens, freezers, heating lamps., and overhead lighting added. Instructional signage had to be reworked.


Please bear with us as we revise our procedures affecting food movement and preparation, as well as the traffic and patron flow on the lowest level of the campus. This is a work in progress and will be enhanced by our positive and negative experiences. We appreciate your feedback.

Our trial fry had 298 meals served, our Ash Wednesday Fry had 735, Friday #1 Fry had 967. and Friday Fry #2 had 1,200 meals served. We continue to ramp up our meals each week into future record territory.
