## Grand Knight's Report

Brothers:

We are now more than halfway through the Fish Frys – and what an amazing start! While the numbers are down slightly from last year's record-setting Lenten season, the customer experience is better than ever. The lines are moving faster, the orders are more accurate, and the food is fabulous.

Thanks to all the volunteers that have made this possible. Your hard work not only helps unify our parish and community, but fills our council's coffers with the funds that our charities have come to rely on.

Later this month the College of Cardinals will form a conclave in Vatican City to pick the next leader of the church. Just who are the favorites to replace Pope Benedict XVI?

Of the 118 Cardinals eligible to vote - those under the age of 80 - 62 are from Europe and 28 of those are of Italian heritage. Does that make an Italian the favorite? Two Italians are among those considered "papable", or suitable to become Pope.

Cardinal Angelo Scola, 71, the Archbishop of Milan, is considered a brilliant theologian, a major supporter of the New Evangelization and a leader in Catholic-Islamic dialogue. However, his election could be hampered by internal divisions among the Italian cardinals.

Cardinal Gianfranco Ravasi, 70, is one of the great minds in the contemporary Church. Pope Benedict charged him with rekindling the Catholic Church's dialogue with non-believers. But he may be too intellectual and may not be the kind of reformer that the Roman Curia needs.

Cardinal Peter Turkson, 64, of Ghana could become the first Pope of color in the modern era. Turkson is president of the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace as well as a

biblical scholar who speaks six languages. However he has caused controversies in the past few years with some of his comments, including linked clerical sex abuse with homosexuality.

The leading candidate from North America is Cardinal Marc Ouellet, 68, of Canada. Ouellet served as Archbishop of Quebec from 2002 to 2010 before taking over as head of the powerful Vatican office that oversees the appointment of the world's bishops. Critics point to the poor state of the Church in Quebec during his tenure, and wonder if he would be able to reinvigorate the faith in the West.

Insiders have long said the Vatican has an unwritten rule that no American will ever head the Catholic Church. But Italy's fourth largest daily, Il Messaggero, said the Holy See may be seeing the light. Il Messaggero writes, "If the church's new evangelization will come through a smile not a frown, maybe Cardinal Timothy Dolan is the best candidate of all."

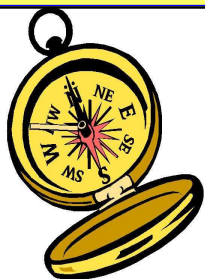
There are reasons to think Cardinal Dolan, 63, Archbishop of New York, could be a serious candidate. If the culture of the United States is currently in full vigor and affects the world at large, perhaps so, too, an American Pope can offer an authentic Catholic response to the age in which we live.

After all, it was a Polish pope who ushered in the radical changes that affected Eastern Europe in the 1980s, leading to the fall of communism.

Bruce has never come close to dunking a basketball (even when starting from a chair or a six-foot ladder).



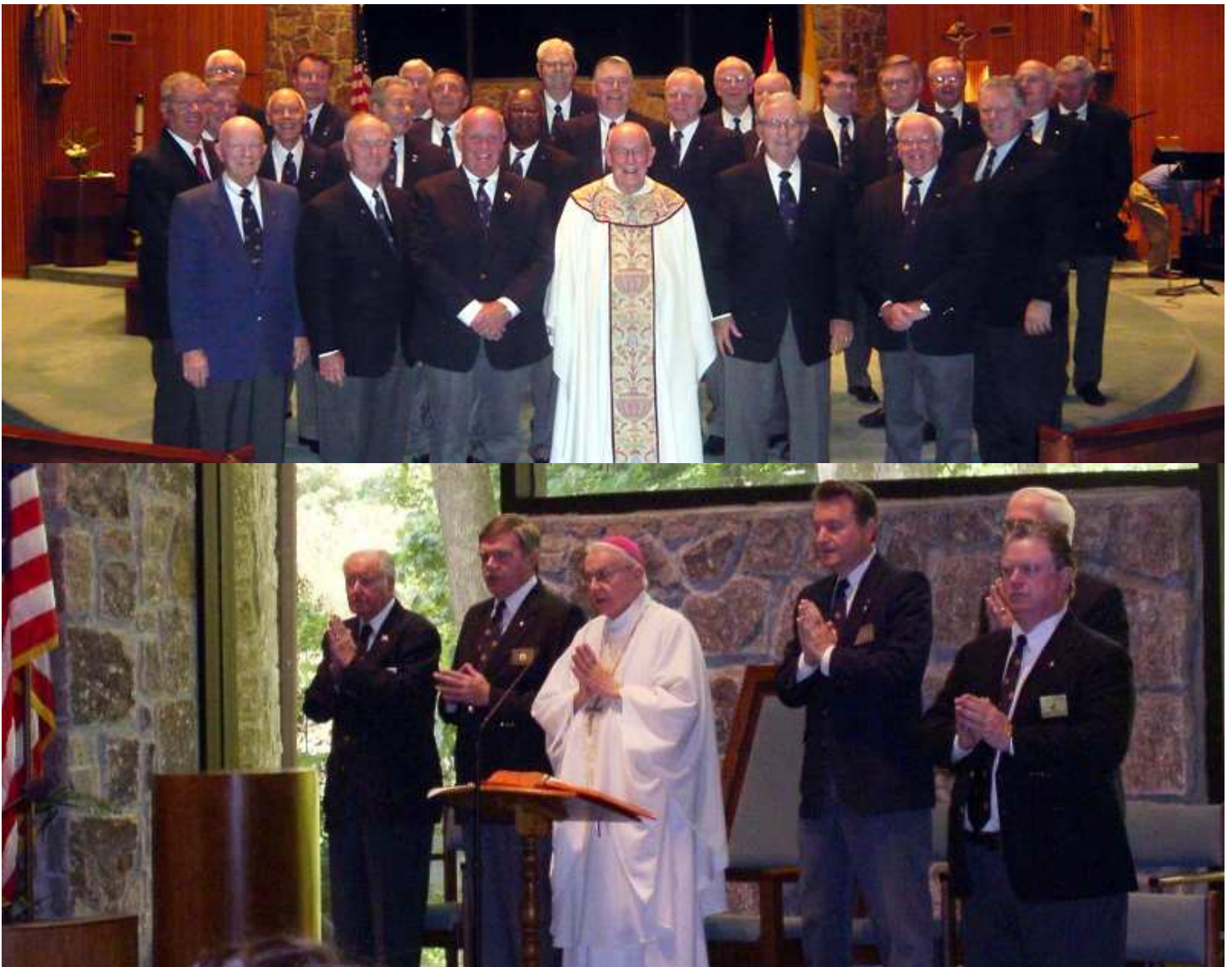
# Additional Acolytes Needed

All Saints Council 11402 has a special parish service ministry that may be unique over all the councils in the world. We know of no other council that provides rotating teams of knight altar servers that assist on the altar at all funeral Masses in their parish. We currently have about 70 brothers assigned to 5 teams that provide this service first requested by former pastor Monsignor Donald Kiernan in 1998.

Acolytes wear matching outfits composed of navy blue blazers, medium grey dress slacks, white shirts, black shoes and socks. The council provides each with a blue Knights of Columbus logo tie worth \$30. A full complement of Mass acolytes might consist of a cross bearer, two torch bearers, two water and wine handlers, and an incense bearer. Team members alternate roles and learn them all in good time.

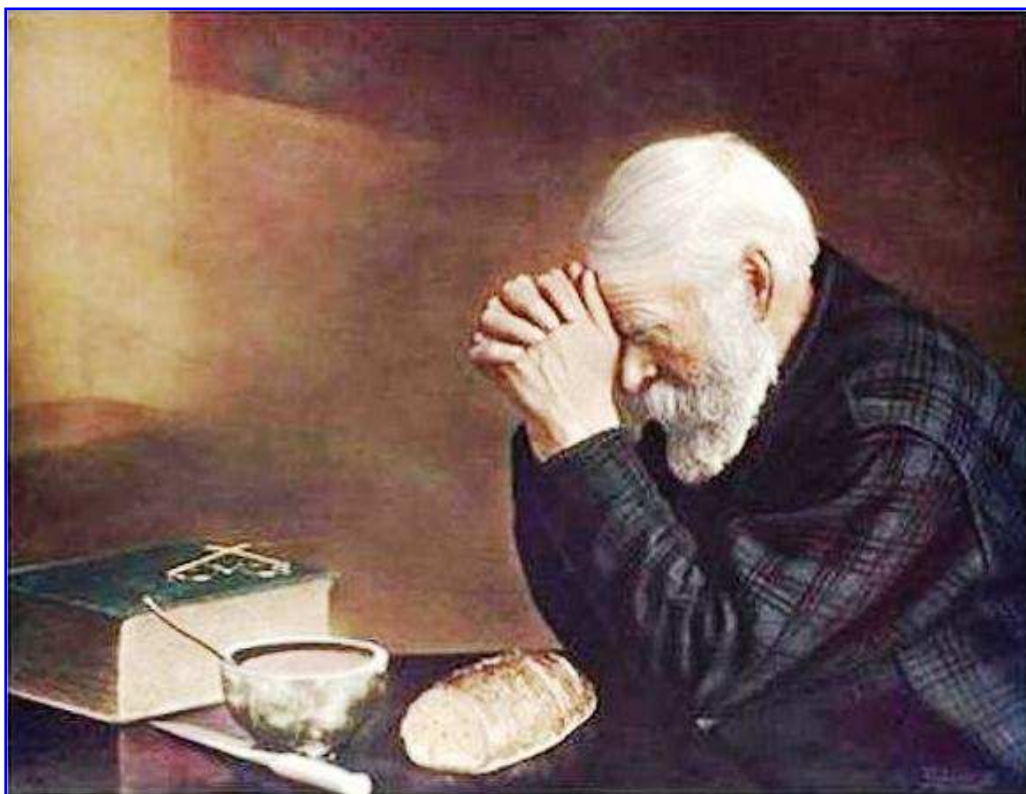

Each year our council volunteers to staff downtown homeless men's shelters for two Sundays. Our first homeless shelter day was Feb. 16th, and now our homeless shelter coordinator, Brother Len Dorrien, is asking for volunteers for Sunday, March 24th.

For this date, we will require another 8 volunteers. Three will be assigned to the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church shelter (downtown near the state capitol building), and 5 volunteers for the adjoining Central Presbyterian Church shelter.

Typically the 8 volunteers meet at our parish social Hall about 5 PM on the designated Sunday, put together breakfast sandwich goodie bags for 100 men. They are then briefed on their duties and ride together to the shelters.

Accompanying them in the caravan are a group of church women who have pre-cooked some elements of an evening meal for the homeless. The women reheat and complete the meal at the shelter kitchen and our male volunteers act as waiters and eat with the homeless men.

After supper, the women leave together and the men stay the night to supervise and take care of the needs of the homeless men until Monday morning. The homeless are given their breakfast sandwich bags and return to the streets. The volunteers return home by about 7 AM. You will find it a very rewarding ministry, if you have never experienced it.

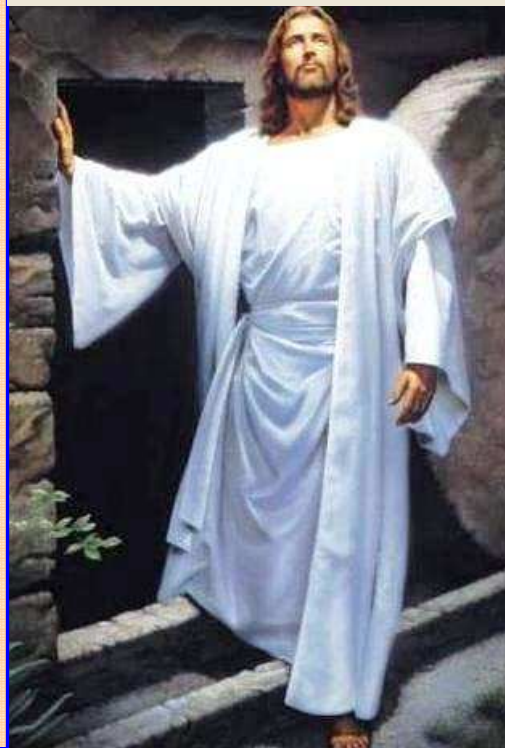

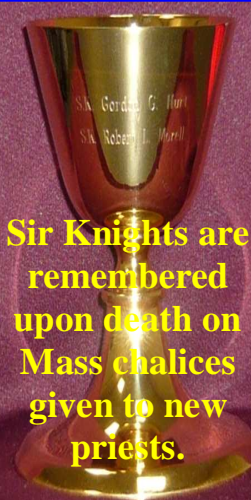

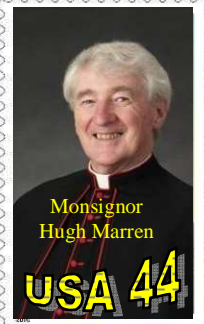
