
Winners will now compete in the State competition to be held on <u>Saturday March</u>, 7 at Georgia Tech Gym.





Council Reaching Out to Our Widows

Because our 50 deceased brother knights have left a large number of council widows still in the area, our officers have decided to reach out to them in a new ministry. It was always the intent of Fr. Michael J. McGivney to aid widows and orphans as a cornerstone of the Order, and we have now undertaken a long-overdue campaign.



The officers have put together a spreadsheet of the last known whereabouts of our beloved widows to be used as a contact list of them and their family relatives. This list has been used to mail them complementary VIP tickets to our fish fries. It will also be used to inform them and their relatives of the honoring of their deceased men at our Memorial Masses, to invite them to social events, and offer to assist them should they need our help with any unforeseen tasks around home.

A committee was formed under brother Joe Kane to pen letters advising them of our interest in their needs, to print special ID cards (shown above) indicating that their ticket prices are complementary, asking if they wish to continue receiving our newsletters and announcements, and trying to stay in close contact with them as part of our council family. We have thus far located 38 widows as part of this permanent ministry.
