## Grand Knight's Report

Worthy Brothers:

This report may be a little more desultory than most, as I'm totally taken in by the rapture that is Spring in Atlanta. Lots of stuff to talk about, but no central theme to tie them together. First, a couple of things I've been ruminating on since the month of April.

At a recent event one of the member's wives asked me, "What did you learn, and what surprised you the most, during your year as Grand Knight?"

These questions are always dangerous to someone like me who tends to start from a position of critical analysis, usually with the negative items first. But, I considered my answer carefully, and replied with three items.

First, I was struck with how very different leadership skills in a volunteer organization must be than in a more traditional for-profit business organization. I told her that it had taken me some time to appreciate that one leads by encouragement rather than by authority, and that people really respond to the trust you place in them.

Second, I continued to be surprised and encouraged by the overwhelming response of several members who give generously of the time and talent to support our Council. This was coupled, as well, by the wonderful diversity of activities that many of the members are engaged in across the parish and in the community.

This led me to my third observation, which was more of a frustration, that I wasn't always sure that our activities as a Council were capturing the minds and hearts of our members and encouraging them to lead Gospel lives. In my heart, I really believe that the Knights have this

obligation. I finished my answer on the optimistic note that we're engaged in a long-term process, and we have to take little steps before we take great strides.

That last point was, in part, motivated by the second thing I've been contemplating. At the monthly 4<sup>th</sup> Degree meeting, the Grand Knight of another council gave a list of activities they had engaged in to support parish life. This

council had taken a very long time to "come up to speed," but they really hit the ground running when they did. A lot of their activities were focused on prayer events within their parish community and bringing a Catholic, Christian perspective to the challenges of daily life.

I believe we have that same enthusiasm here at All Saints, and I'm hopeful that next year we can do more to tap into it. In my view, the Knights ought to be "in-the-lead" on many programs and events that raise Chris-

tian consciousness within our community.

While we do a great many things, we need to do more as outreach to our faith community. This will undoubtedly be emphasized in next year's programs.

Now to the pragmatics of running the Council:

First, elsewhere in this newsletter you'll see the Nominating Committee's recommended slate of candidates for next year's Officers of the Council. Nominations will be open from the floor at our May and June meetings, and the vote will be held at our June meeting.

Second, our Float Committee has started work to prepare for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade. We're asking for donations from the individual members to support this activity, as we don't believe

This is an important event that brings all the Georgia councils into contact with one another, and helps focus our activities on the State level.

Last, May ends with the first of the Summer holidays, Memorial Day. I'd like to have the Knights of Council 11402 come up with ideas how we might mark this day, which remembers all of those who have given their lives to defend our freedoms and liberty. Send me your thoughts.

Joseph is the son of a former Grand Knight and is married with young twins. He was a former chef and his talents were already evident in his Fish Fry participation.

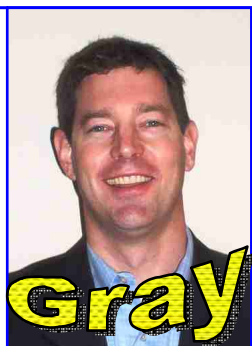
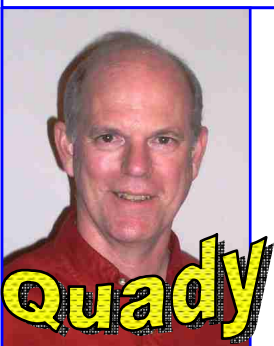
We hope that many more 3rd degree brothers follow his example. There is another 4th Degree Exemplification in October and we will be encouraging many brothers to participate.

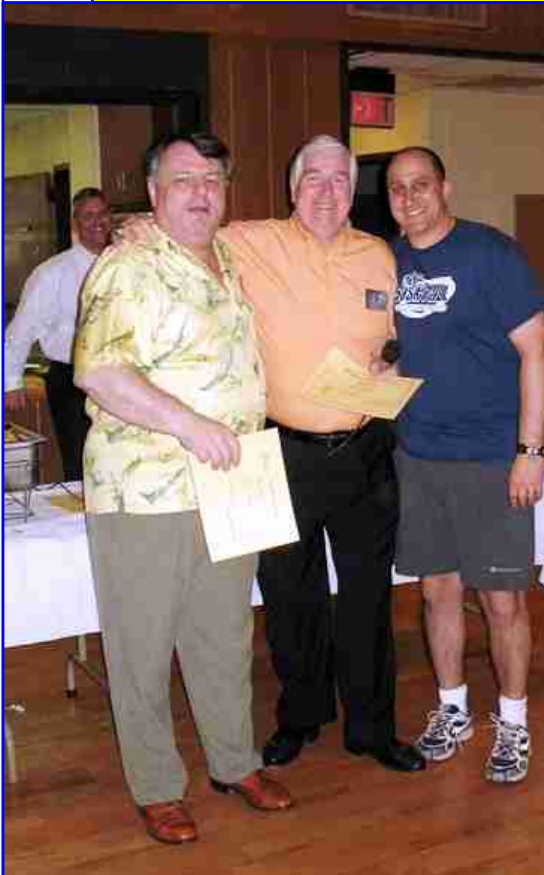
