Grand Knight's Report

Brothers.

By now you've heard that our 2009 Lenten Fish Fry broke all records for meals served (6,713 total)

The most amazing thing was that we seem to do it so effortlessly. Maybe after 15 years, we have now become a well-oiled machine. Thanks for making it look so easy. I know it's not.

Our April 25th *Fish Fry Workers Appreciation Party* served over 120 folks (workers and spouses) that included for the first time the Women's Guild volunteers that served desserts to top off our meals.

Our membership continues its steady rise toward the magic 300 member number. We added five at our 1st degree on March 31st (story inside) and will

add still others on May 12th and also June 9th—before the end of fratemal year 2008-2009 on June 30th. As a result, we already had to purchase a dozen new chairs for our McGivney Hall.

Even better, our new insurance field agent, John Knight (story inside) is busy signing up additional insurance members needed to make us a *Double Star Council* for an amazing third straight year. It gets more difficult every year.

An ever-rising 10% membership increase is required. Georgia is in a neck-to-neck fight with Alberta for the most new members for the year.

Our "Big Onion," John Buchholz, again ordered another 18-wheeler with 2,000 ten-pound bags of Vidalia onions to distribute among seven KofC area councils for our second-biggest annual fundraiser. As usual, our guys and ladies sold our consignment of 480 bags with no difficulty. Thanks to all the folks that worked the weekend Masses.

This year for the very first time, a regional soap box derby race is being held on our doorstep May 30th. This wonderful national youth event is a natural for the Knights. We are jumping in boldly.

We allotted \$500 to purchase our first reusable race car and our next newsletter will show some of the fun that the young kids and our very old kids had at this event, that is sure to grow into a major yearly happening like the Dunwoody 4th of July Parade.

Our next important event is the 60th Ordination Anniversary Party for our own chaplain, Monsignor Kiernan on May 2nd. Please make every effort to attend the Saturday 5 PM celebration Mass. We'll have a major presence with altar acolytes and a large honor guard. A grand outdoor party akin to the annual Hoedown will follow. The Council will again man the adult beverage concession.

Wear your badges to the Mass and also to the party afterward. McGivney Hall will be open for public

use and this is a wonderful time to recruit new members and publicize our council.

We lost a very wonderful brother last month. Sir Knight Bill Lehman lost his bout with cancer and went to his eternal reward. As a fourth degree brother, his name will now be engraved on a chalice to be presented to a newly-ordained priest — the Order's special gift of perpetual daily Mass remembrance.

It was our privilege to give him a very memorable wake and funeral with 15 honor guards, an acolyte team in full tuxedos, and a rotating team of sentries around his coffin at

the viewing. We should all be honored so well.

His widow, Mary Ann, said that the non-Catholics in attendance had never seen anything like it and were "mesmerized." We will miss Bill's always smiling face at the chamber door checking all our membership cards and rosaries.

Every time we lose a Brother, we are well reminded to "remember to live (well) and (yet) remember our mortality"—said succinctly in Latin —

"Memento vivere et memento mori."

We served over 1,000 meals three times this year and came within an eyelash at our last fry. The 554 meal increase over last year represented a 9% increase in any economy where everything else was declining.


Columbus Day Knights of Columbus Golf Tournament
