

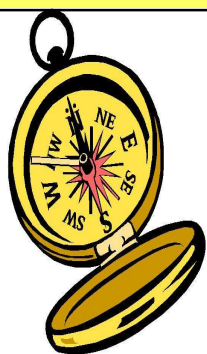

# 15th Annual Fish Fry Smashes All Records

Our 15th Annual Tony Ardagna Fish Fry smashed all previous records across the board on every single respective night to total a record 7,570 meals for the Lenten Season. This was an increase of 834 meals over last year's previous record. A new single night record of 1,242 meals blew past the old record of 1,139, much to the surprise of our beleaguered cooks. Good publicity in the Dunwoody Crier and on the WXIA Channel 11 Alive segment called "Unique Eats" by our parishioner TV anchorman Fred Kalil surely helped swell the numbers, as did fine weather this year.

We raised the prices of all adult meals one dollar because of the increased costs of some fish and paper products this year. We did not raise the \$4 price for children's meals, side dishes, or beverages. This made our meals still a popular bargain for families. The addition of fried shrimp for the first time was a positive. Here are the final details of the amazing 834 meal increase over last year's record. Thank you all.

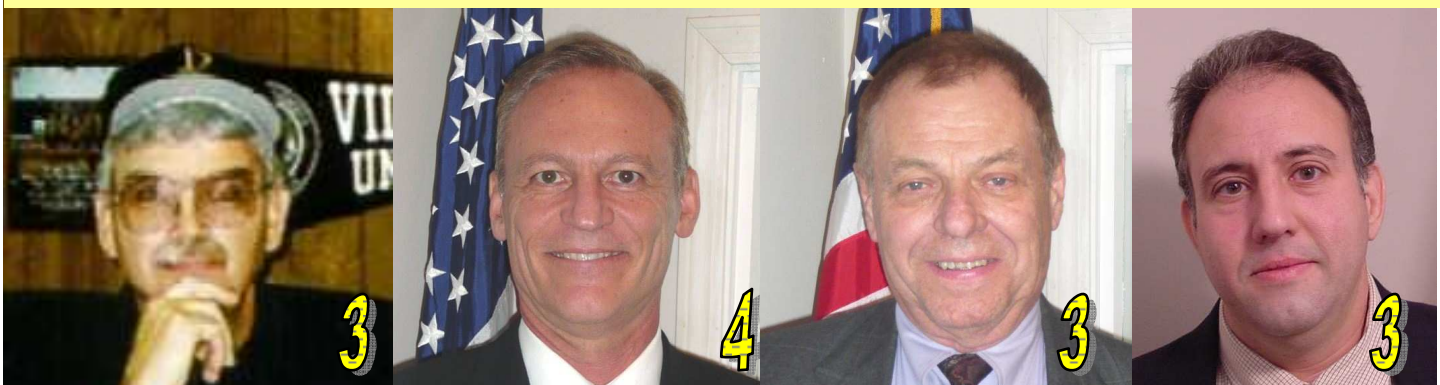

# Nominating Committee for 2011-2012 Elections

The Nominating Committee chaired by Sir Knight Lou Hlad and also composed of Sir Knights Don Myers and Ed Trainor have interviewed and spoken to all known prospective candidates for officer positions for the coming 2011-2012 Fraternal Year (July to June).

Trustee 1-year Term – Don Myers (former Trustee 2-year)

Appointed positions by the Grand Knight are Chaplain, Financial Secretary, and Lecturer. It is now anticipated that two of the three current incumbents will continue their positions. Monsignor Kiernan and John Buchholz are current incumbents who will continue.

Gert Kampfer, the current Financial Secretary has served superbly for 11 years and will not continue. John Stowell is suggested as the new Financial Secretary.

# Accessing Our Council Web Sites

Our new members (and many of our existing members) are frequently inquiring as to the method for accessing our council web sites and where these sites are located. Since they are always featured at the top of the second-last page of all newsletters, we are sometimes mystified as to why we get the second question. The council web site is [kc11402.org](http://kc11402.org) and our council picture album site is found at [kofc11402.shutterfly.com](http://kofc11402.shutterfly.com). The first requires a password and the second does not.

To access the council web site, go to KC11402.org on the internet. You will see a welcome page: Near the top of the page is a “Members Only” link that should be selected.



When the sign-in block appears, enter your last name on the top line and your six or seven digit membership number on your membership card as the password. Then hit submit.

Last name is not case-sensitive and should omit any apostrophes, blanks, or dashes in your last name.

Having gained entry as a member, you may access any portion of the site. Of most interest is the picture section of your brothers, their email addresses, their wives names, and their degree rank. Get to know your brothers as best you can. Other sections include information about the knights, officers, our awards, forms, charities, history, minutes, reports, etc. The site is very useful to all members.

## Accessing Council Picture Album Web Site

We have a web site at [kofc11402.shutterfly.com](http://kofc11402.shutterfly.com) to which we have been adding pictures of events for some years. Simply access the internet site and select an event whose pictures you wish to review. There is no password. We especially invite prospective candidates and new brothers to see the wide scope of the things we do to interest them in joining.

A recent interview of our insurance field agent, John Knight by Lou Hlad yielded this very important information for all of the knights served by John.

**Lou Hlad:** What is it that Knights of Columbus Field Agents do?

**John Knight:** Field agents administer our not-for-profit insurance program. We meet candidates prior to and after their First Degree, making sure that they understand the organization and how to use their insurance program. We also work with current members to review their overall insurance setup and suggest enhancements. Finally, we meet with grieving family members to start the arrangements for death claims.

**LH:** Who do you serve?

**JK:** I serve about 1,000 families at the above St. Thomas More, Holy Cross, All Saints, St. Thomas the Apostle, St. Peter Chanel, Mary Our Queen, and Our Lady of the Assumption (OLA) councils.

**LH:** What insurance products do we offer to our brothers?

**JK:** Our not-for-profit program offers Life Insurance, Annuities, Disability Income Insurance and Long Term Care Insurance.

**LH:** Is the program easy to use?

**JK:** It's Simple! Just give me a call on my cell (404) 569-5265, and I'll make an appointment to chat with the you and your wife at the kitchen table. It takes only about an hour to have enough information to make good decisions for your family's future.

**LH:** What is the biggest mistake that people make?

**JK:** Waiting until its too late! Another field agent was talking with a brother Knight a few weeks ago. He couldn't decide whether to make an application. He said he would decide the next week. He was killed in an accident prior to the next appointment. **Tempus Fugit - Memento Mori**

# Council Supports Soap Box Derby for Third Year

For the third consecutive year, All Saints 11402 will lend its McGivney Hall to the Dunwoody Soap Box Derby supporters for the purpose of building race cars for the Friday/Saturday June 3/4 events. Last year there were about 28 cars entered in the race in two divisions (Stock and Super Stock). This year there may be over 35 cars and a third division (Super Kids) will be featured.

The Super Kids division will feature wide-bodied race cars that hold two occupants side by side. One is the driver and one is a passenger with some sort of a disability. Normally disabled youths are not able to participate in the event. Supporters are now looking for youngsters with disabilities that would have parental permission to ride as passengers in the race. Winners in each of the three divisions would go on to race in the national finals in Akron, Ohio.

The race is supported primarily by the Dunwoody Kiwanis Club-- an organization that specializes in youth mentoring. We are fortunate to have as our council member the president of that organization (Rob Swanson) and the race technical director (Al Alberghini). His wife Addie Alberghini has served as the race director. Rob Swanson's wife, Susan Swanson, is the new director of the Super Kids Division. Thus, our council ties to the Derby event and its sponsors are very strong.

Four clinic dates are planned for McGivney Hall-- April 30th, May 14th, May 21st, and May 28th.



This new race is specifically for kids ages 8-17 with disabilities that would otherwise prevent them from competing in the All American Soap Box Derby race. Racers from Clayton, DeKalb, Gwinnett, Henry and Rockdale counties are eligible to enter the race.

Super Kids racing cars are built by our Soap Box Derby Association, so the Super Kids are not responsible for building their own cars. They ride down the hill in a car that accommodates two kids, an experienced driver who drives the car and the Super Kid who has a fun experience.

We need help for our clinics, site preparation, and on the race days of June 3/4.

### Calvary

Jesus Christ, 33, of Nazareth, died Friday on Mount Calvary, also known as Golgotha, the place of the skull. Betrayed by the apostle Judas, Jesus was crucified by the Romans, by order of the Ruler Pontius Pilate. The causes of death were crucifixion, extreme exhaustion, severe torture, and loss of blood.

Jesus Christ, a descendant of Abraham, was a member of the house of David. He was the Son of the late Joseph, a carpenter of Nazareth, and Mary, His devoted Mother. Jesus was born in a stable in the city of Bethlehem, Judea. He is survived by His mother Mary, His faithful Apostles, numerous disciples, and many other followers.

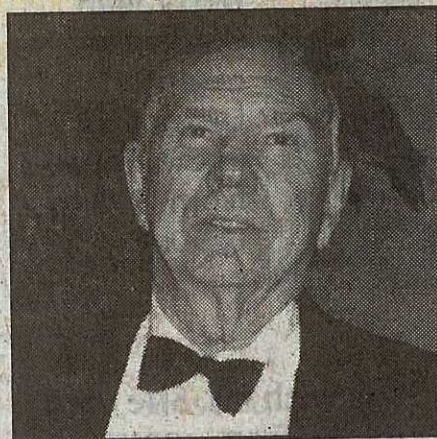
Jesus was self educated and spent most of his adult life working as a Teacher. Jesus also occasionally worked as a Medical Doctor and it is reported that he healed many patients. Up until the time of His death, Jesus was teaching and sharing the Good News, healing the sick, touching the lonely, feeding the hungry, and helping the poor.

Jesus was most noted for telling parables about His Father's Kingdom and performing miracles, such as feeding over 5,000 people with only five loaves of bread and two fish, and healing a man who was born blind. On the day before His death, He held a Last Supper celebrating the Passover Feast, at which He foretold His death.

The body was quickly buried in a stone grave, which was donated by Joseph of Arimathea, a loyal friend of the family. By order of Pontius Pilate, a boulder was rolled in front of the tomb. Roman soldiers were put on guard.

In lieu of flowers, the family has requested that everyone try to live as Jesus did. Donations may be sent to anyone in need.

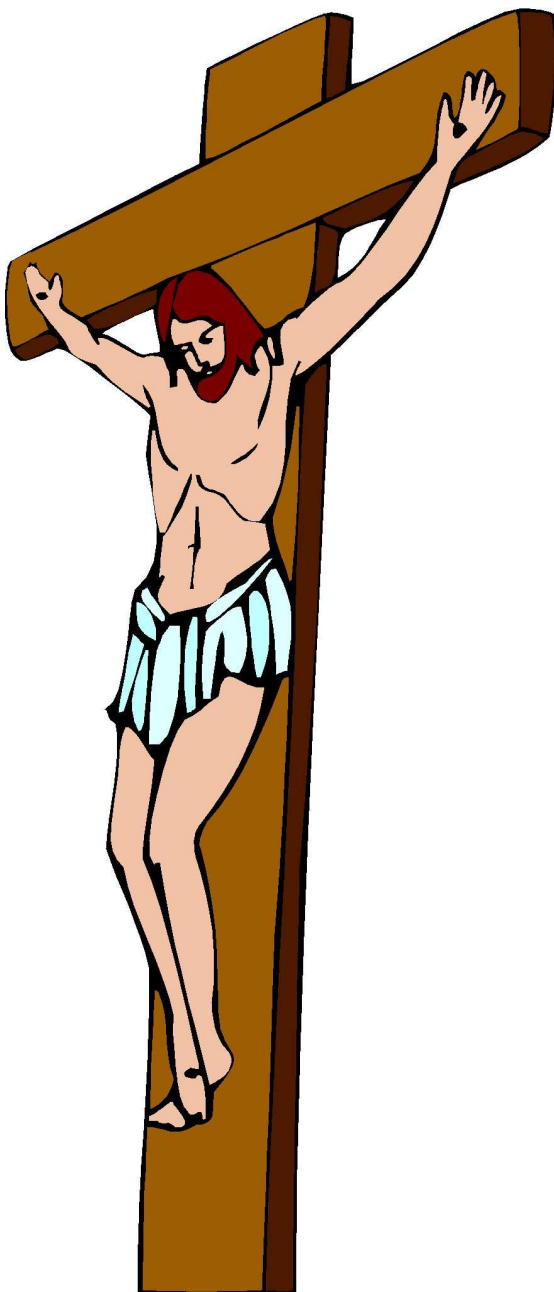

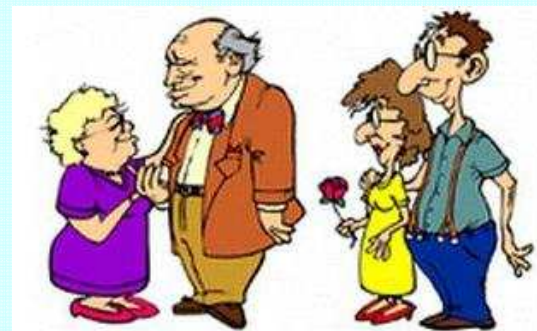
