Grand Knight's Report

Brothers:

May is a relatively quiet month for our council after a very busy April in which we raised almost \$6,000 for our charities through the Union Sale, built a fence around the community garden at Peachtree Charter Middle School, and successfully staged a third degree ceremony for candidates from all around the metro area.

Once again a huge pat on the back to our Big Onion, John Buchholz, and his team, headed up by Dean Trantow, Kevin Murray and Wiley Maloof, for distributing almost 3,000 bags of onions to local parishes, and selling over 500 bags to All Saints parishioners.

The fence at the middle school was the brainchild of our past Grand Knight, Greg Crnkovich, in response to a plea from the school's PTA, which was in dire need of volunteers to build a fence around their community garden (all food grown in the garden is donated to St. Malachi's Food Pantry, which feeds the poor).

Below is what the school published on its website:

The All Saints Catholic Church Knights of Columbus Council 11402 and friends worked two Saturdays during the Spring break to construct the fencing. Our Knights are fiercely loyal to Dunwoody community service and rallied around our middle school garden project! The fence provides definition for the Living Classroom, protects the garden from critters, and adds property enhancement as the perimeter is planted with perennials and art in the garden.

I can't be more proud of our council for its work on the two projects above, and every individual who helped make them a tremendous success. Thank you!

Congrats to the Knights of Columbus council at Gonzaga University in Spokane, Washington for fighting the good fight and regaining its club status on campus.

A few weeks ago, the university's student activities' board determined the council did not qualify for club status since it did not allow women or non-Catholics as members. News of the denial spread fast, and in the end, common sense prevailed.

Because it regained club status, the council may once again use the university's name in its title; raise funds on campus to advance its mission and activities; use campus facilities and recruit members and participants in membership activities.

Just how ridiculous was the original decision to strip the council of club status? In case you didn't know, Gonzaga is a Catholic university!

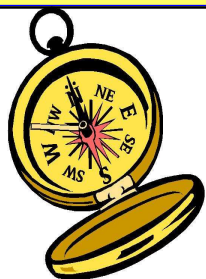
How Does Jesus Teach Us to Pray?

New First Degree Brothers on April 30th



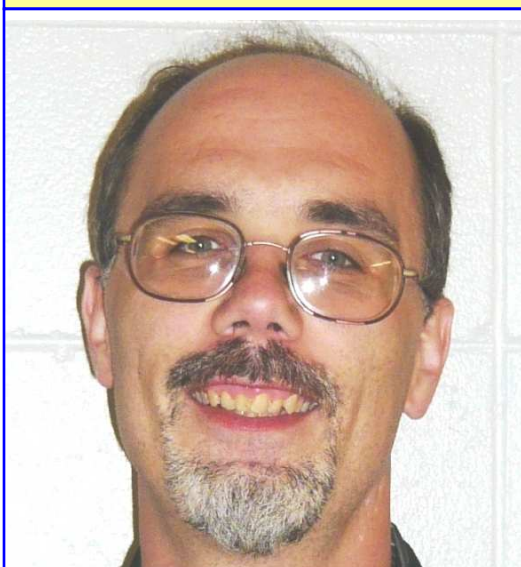

Grassroots campaign pays off for cycling buff

Advocate fought for dedicated bike lanes over Ga. 400 bridge.

Joe Seconder doesn't normally pop wheelies, but he's plenty happy that his uphill battle to get dedicated bike lanes installed on a new bridge over Ga. 400 has paid off.

That is no small feat, considering he was dealing with a state agency on a project that was al-

ready well passed the design phase. The Dunwoody cycling enthusiast mounted his late campaign to include the lanes in a \$10.5 million Georgia DOT project to replace Northridge Bridge in Sandy Springs.

"I knew back in December 2011 there was a public meeting about the bridge," Seconder said. "Sometimes, I just don't feel like going to all these public meetings."

When Seconder discovered early this year that dedicated bike lanes were not in the design plans, he got busy, phoning friends and transportation

contacts.

"This bridge is the single point of access between Perimeter CID, Dunwoody and Sandy Springs to cross the Chattahoochee River into Roswell," he said.

In mid-February, he won half the battle when the state agreed to include one dedicated bike lane on the eastbound side.

"To me, that was like saying they'll build a one-way bridge," Seconder said.

But to his surprise, GDOT invited Seconder, his supporters and

Sandy Springs officials to a followup meeting March 29 where it presented a redesign that included two bike lanes without changing the width of the bridge.

"I'll give him a lot of credit, but I have to give GDOT a lot of credit, too," said Roswell Mayor Jere Wood, an active cyclist who backed Seconder's campaign. "They have a whole new attitude down there."

The agency officially ad-

opted a Complete Streets policy last fall, requiring that it routinely incorporate bicycle, pedestrian and transit concerns into transportation projects. The Northridge Bridge project was finalized well before that policy took effect.

Georgia DOT engineer Darryl D. VanMeter said budget and time constraints would have normally precluded a late change in plans. However, the department had a productive exchange with bike advocates and Sandy Springs officials which led to the accommodation, he said.

Sandy Springs pitched in \$500,000 for the project to include decorative street lights and other amenities.

The city had initially proposed designated bike lanes.

"I think this is a great example of government listening," Sandy Springs Assistant City Manager Bryant Poole said. "The project had already been (awarded) and some modifications were able to be made."

Bob Dallas, who served as highway safety director under Gov. Sonny Perdue, was another Seconder recruit.

"When Joe contacted GDOT and asked them to look closer at it, they were able to work with the contractor ... to make the changes within the footprint of what was being built," Dallas said. "They sharpened their pencils."

Another of our council members. Bob Dallas, was recruited by Seconder to aid in the effort. It is refreshing to see our members so active in community affairs. We thank them for taking the time to make a difference.

The mayor of Dunwoody, Mike Davis, is a brother. Other active brother citizens in Dunwoody government and associations include Brothers Dennis Crean, Joe DeVita, Don Converse, and John Heneghan. Fidel Espinoza is a Dunwoody policeman and Brother Denis Shortal is Dunwoody Mayor Pro Tem.

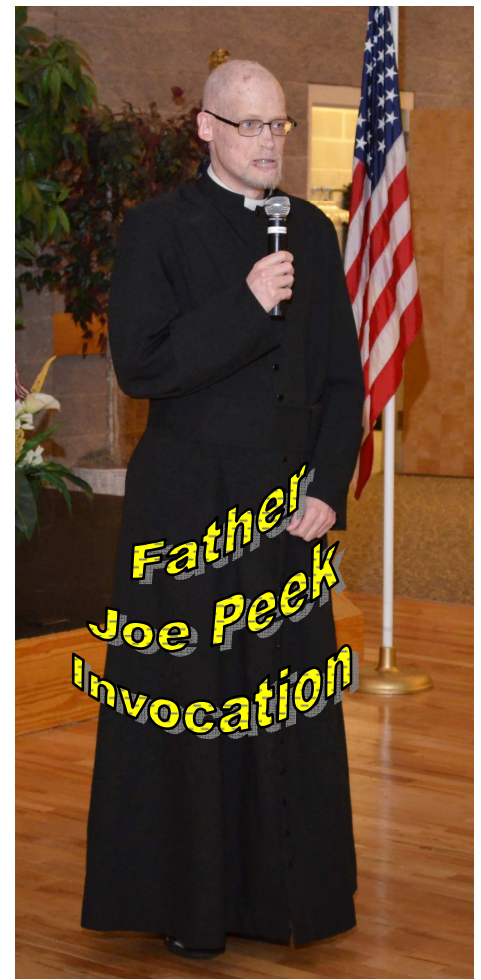

May Insurance Tip --- Only having “through work” insurance doesn’t work

Do you know anyone whose life or career has been drastically changed during these years of economic downturn? 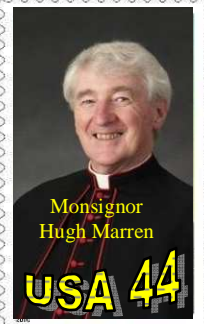
