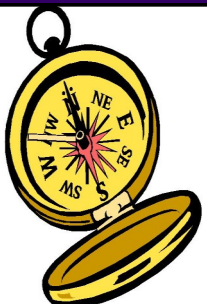

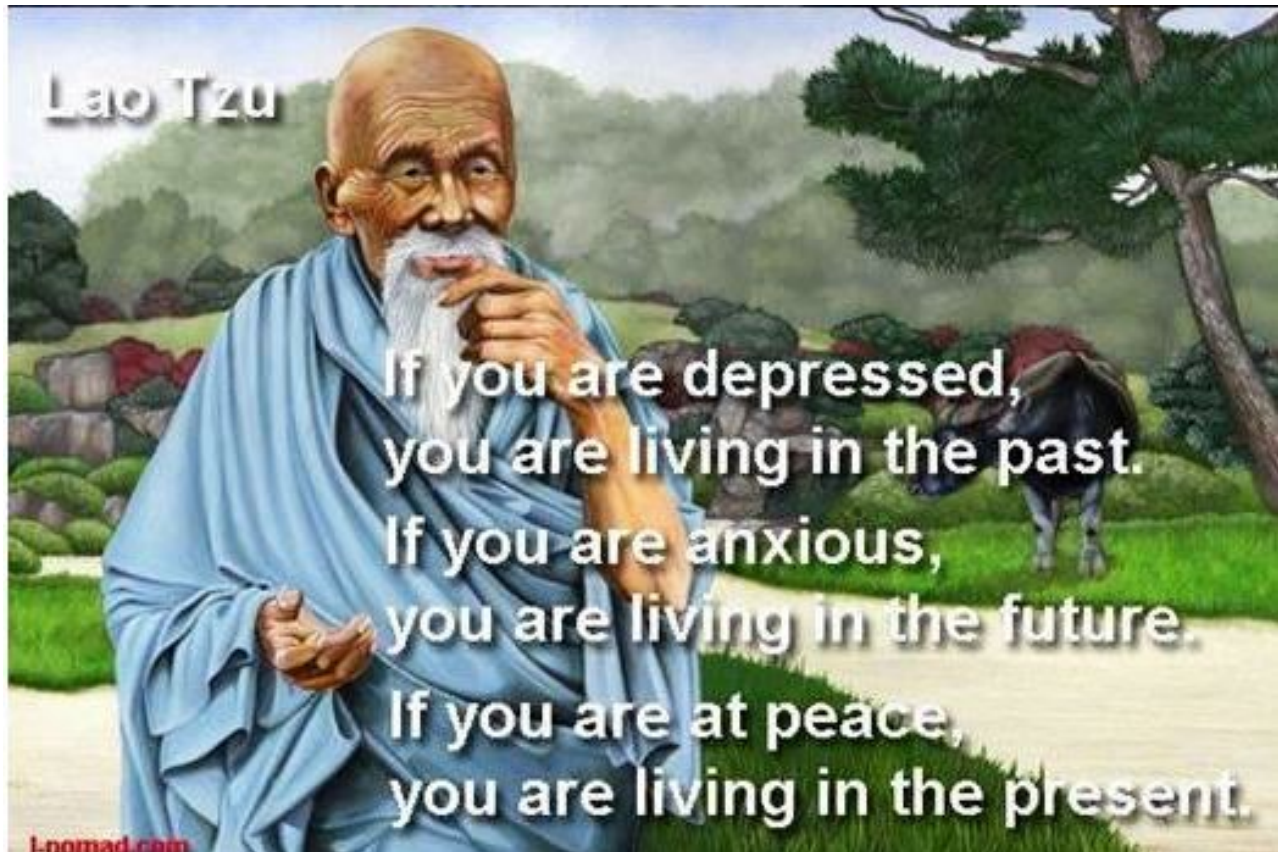

## Dallas is named to MARTA board

Bob Dallas of Dunwoody has been chosen to serve as a DeKalb County representative on the MARTA board. He was the unanimous choice of the six-member county commission.

"I very much appreciate their trust and respect on how important MARTA is to the citizens of DeKalb County," Dallas said. "As I noted during the commission meeting, I will work with all of the commissioners to represent their constituents on the MARTA Board."

Dallas is a lawyer with Casey Gilson and is chairman of the Dunwoody Planning Commission. Prior to that he served for years on the DeKalb

Planning Commission. In 2011 he ran unsuccessfully for mayor of Dunwoody.

Much of his public service work concerns pedestrian and vehicle safety, gleaned from service from 2003 to 2011 as director of the Georgia Governor's Office of Highway Safety.

Currently he is chairman of Pedestrians Educating Drivers on Safety (PEDS), a board member of Road Safe America and the Southern Bicycle League. He also chairs the transportation committee of the Dunwoody Chamber of Commerce.

# Moving Lockers for Cristo Rey

On Friday April 17th, our council brother, Deacon Bill Garrett, asked for assistance from Council 11402 in moving donated lockers and desk/chairs from Mount Pisgah Christian School in Johns Creek to the new Jesuit High School, Cristo Rey in Midtown Atlanta. The lockers and desks were located in trailers scheduled to be removed from the Mount Pisgah campus. Our Deacon Bill just happens to be the president of Cristo Rey Atlanta High School. There are 28 schools named Cristo Rey (Christ the King) across the United States and run by the Jesuits.

Mount Pisgah has built new, permanent facilities and will be removing the trailers where the lockers and desks were for twelve years. Mount Pisgah will be adding soon to its campus in the space created by removing the trailers. Moved were 120 lockers of light brown color, double stacked, and built in units of three. In addition, 150 desk/chair units were donated and moved. The entire project took about 1.5 hours with a total of 11 men working in a driving rain to fill two trucks. Two Knights from OLA Council helped as well.

Lockers and desk/chairs were transported into the basement of Cristo Rey the next morning with help of Knights from the Basilica of the Sacred Heart Council. About 8 of their brothers Knights and a couple of students did the move. This equipment will be used for the next two classes of students at Cristo Rey and will be installed in the building on May 30 (next chance to volunteer ☺).

Cristo Rey now has 154 rising sophomores and will be admitting 130 freshmen this Fall. School continues to go well, in part because of the overwhelming support of the community, most especially the local Knight communities.

We thank Brother Bill Luckert, Sir Knight Bill Driscoll , and Sir Knight Pat Fahey for managing this large volunteer project. Another notable council participant was Sir Knight Greg Crnkovich.

We thank Mount Pisgah Christian School for their generosity in donating their surplus equipment to the use of the Jesuits.





# Marklein Cycles for Cristo Rey High



Our Sir Knight Dick Marklein has opted to cycle 3,872 miles across America to raise \$30,000 for *Cristo Rey Atlanta*, the new Jesuit High School. Our council brother, Deacon Bill Garrett, is the president of the school.

His cycling adventure begins May 31st in San Francisco and ends July 21st in Portsmouth, New Hampshire. He will be personally funding all the expenses associated with the trip with all monies raised benefiting Cristo Rey science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) programs.

Other riders will accompany him, but he will be the only one riding for Cristo Rey. Donations are tax deductible and are already streaming in. The council has voted to donate \$500 at the March meeting.

## May Tip -- Only Have “Through Work” Insurance ?

Only having “through work” insurance doesn’t work.

Do you know anyone whose life or career has been drastically changed during these years of economic downturn? It’s very likely that someone in your immediate or extended family or group of friends is facing financial uncertainty now. Maybe there’s a possibility that you (or your spouse) could lose your job or change employers.

Too many people have often relied on group term life insurance as their only safety net. Often, this insurance is an employee benefit provided at low or no cost. The existence of this coverage might convince someone that personally-owned life insurance is not necessary.

These numbers are often capped, and this cap may be dangerously low when compared to your family’s actual needs. In fact, without a detailed needs analysis, any employer-provided coverage will likely cause a shortfall at the insured’s death.

In addition, the amount of group insurance offered is almost always reduced, sometimes dramatically, when you retire. You could one day find yourself without coverage, and if your health has changed (which it will as you age), you might also find yourself unable to secure individual protection. It will definitely be more expensive.

And then he is so anxious about the future that he does not enjoy the present; the result being that he does not live in the present or the future; he lives as if he is never going to die, and then dies having never really lived."

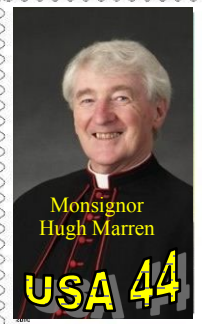
