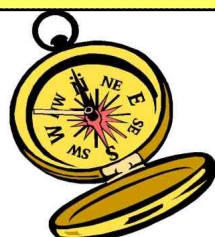

### Grand Knight's Report

Worthy Brothers:

I'd like to begin by reflecting on the four goals we established for this fraternal year and how we're doing against each of them.

Our first goal was to become more active in charitable activities, and to expand our outreach with our time, talent, and treasure. Our Program Chairs have been doing an excellent job across the board, and we are processing the first of several charitable requests at our November meeting.

We've run programs like the Altar Servers

Recognition Day, the Habitat for Humanity build day, the "What's in the Box?" computer workshop to better-than-expected numbers. We lent a hand to Fr. Bryan Small down at Emory by helping install outdoor lighting, cooking a barbeque for new students, and repainting a deck. We also made a significant commitment in our budget to increase the amount of charitable money available for legitimate, worthwhile programs.

Our second goal was to improve our spiritual awareness both individually and as a group. We held our first Council Retreat at Simpsonwood on August 26 & 27. Twenty-five Brothers spent two days in a reflective setting focused on building relationships and respect for the Eucharist. We also tripled our attendance at our annual Mass of Remembrance for our departed Brother Knights. And we've begun our annual "Keep Christ in Christmas" Christmas card sales program, which this year features a new magnetic sign for placement on your car that helps remind everyone of the true meaning of Christmas.

Our third goal was to become more active in supporting vocations. We created new budget categories to support this effort, but we haven't

gotten any programs off the ground, as yet. This clearly has to move up our priority list of "things to do."

Our last goal was to "have fun" and to do things for "the greater glory of God." Our recent family picnic was a great example of how we can come together to enjoy each other's company and some good food. We have several fun events just around the corner, including Desserts with Santa, the Christmas Crèche lighting, and the Council Christmas Party to look forward toward.

Our Membership Committee is working hard to enlist and qualify potential candidates, and we're looking for a large group of candidates during our 1<sup>st</sup> degree exemplification at the end of November. We've also started a "Wear your Knight's Badge or Shirt" program at least one Sunday a month to make us more visible in the parish community-at-large. Overall, I'd give us a strong B+ in working toward our goals.

In the days of the early Church, a meal service was an indispensable sign of belonging, of acceptance, and of participation in God's great banquet. Sharing a meal was a most intimate act of friendship and family. Jesus did not

choose to make his last, communal act a Passover meal by accident.

Today, the Thanksgiving meal, itself, and the love shared among friends and family gathered around the table are real-world symbols of the meaning of Eucharist.

I hope you'll be able to spend this day with your loved ones and friends, taking time to reflect upon the bounty that God has bestowed upon us, and remembering those who are less fortunate than ourselves.

# Council Benevolence Recommendations Approved

At the October business meeting, these three applications recommended by the Charity Committee were favorably approved by the Council. If finalized by vote of the Council at the November meeting, the monies will be released.

The three requests voted favorably by the Council are:

**Assistance League of Atlanta** — \$1,000 — requested by Lou Hlad. Their thrift shop in Chamblee funds six distinct charitable endeavors ranging from rape victims to clothing poor school children. Six wives of Council members belong to this all-female organization. Many other All Saints women belong including president Lynn Farrell.

**People Making Progress** — \$750 — requested by Mario Commito. They help young adults with disabilities find meaningful jobs and housing. Mario's own daughter has been a recipient of their assistance.

**Georgia Chapter of Alzheimer's Association** — \$1,000 — requested by Jim Mammoser. Jim is past President and Director of the Georgia Chapter. One of our past deceased Knights, Jim McCabe, was a recipient of their aid.

**There are several other applications pending more information or documentation before committee approval.**

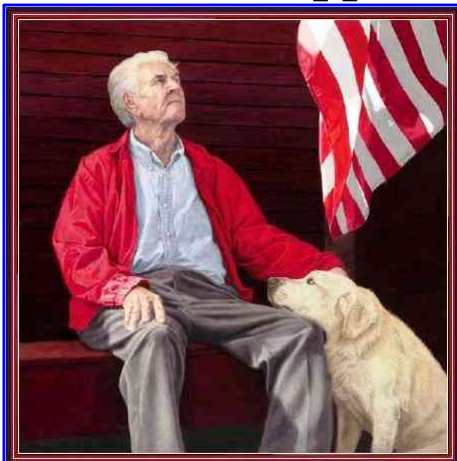

## Veterans' Appreciation Cookout — Sunday November 12th



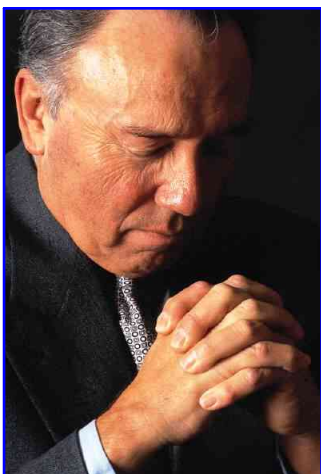

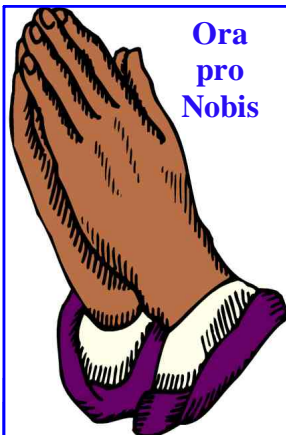
