Every year the Church recognizes two great holydays at the beginning of November. The first is, of course, The Feast of All Saints, followed by The Feasts of All Souls the next day.

This is a wonderful time to remember all the friends, relatives, loved ones and special people in our lives, both living and deceased. We hope you and your families will join with us in praying in a special way this month, by focusing on remembrance.

Council 11402 had some very special visitors this past month. On Tuesday, Oct. 23rd our State Deputy, Dan Baker, came to our 1st Degree, accompanied by two delegates from the Supreme Council. State Deputy Baker presented us with our Double Star Council plaque, that will soon be placed on our wall in McGivney Hall.

State Deputy Baker was very gracious in his remarks concerning the work and effort that Council 11402 continues to be involved in supporting our parish, our community, and our state organizations.

Elsewhere in this newsletter you'll read about upcoming events in November and December, but there are two I'd like to highlight. First is our annual *Keep Christ in Christmas Campaign*.

You may remember that last year, our council under the leadership of Financial Secret ary Gert Kampfer was awarded 1st Place among Georgia Councils for selling approximately **\$2,440** in Christmas Cards. Gert was ably-assisted by Sir Knight Bill Lehman, who dutifully sat through several weeks in the Social Hall continuing to sell cards.

This year, we're introducing two new items: tree ornaments. These are stamped, polished brass ornaments reproducing the "KCIC" manager scene from the car magnets we sold last year, plus a special commemorative ornament illustrating the All Saints campus. These are exclusive this year to Council 11402 thanks to Sir Knight Joe Fuentes. Supplies will be limited, so you'll want to get yours quickly! The second event is our now annual Veteran's Day Appreciation Picnic to be held on Sunday, November 11 from 1:00-4:00 PM. Sir Knight Kirby Baden has moved the affair "upstairs" into the Social Hall, and promises to have an even better presentation of memorabilia and items of interest from our All Saints veterans.

Please come and enjoy the picnic and show your appreciation to the fine men and women who answered our nation's call in time of war to help keep this the great, free nation we enjoy today.

> Many of you have read that the Ace Home Place store across the street from All Saints will soon be closing its doors. Last month, we announced that KC 11402 would begin a fund-raising drive to help get its owner Brother Knight Matt Dewhurst a handicapped-accessible van. Passed and Pending Council Benevolence Requests

At the October business meeting, these charity requests first raised in September were <u>passed</u> by the membership:

- Mario Commito's \$1,000 request for *People Making Progress* to aid intellectually-disadvantaged young people;
- Joe Fuentes' \$1,000 request for the *Sabrina Fair Fund* to aid a single parish mother with no medical insurance.
- Kent Polzin's revised \$1,000 request to offset <u>Jessica Harm's</u> medical bills—a teacher at OLA with no insurance.
- Kirby Baden's \$1,000 request for the *Elaine Clark Center for Special Children*.

Deputy Grand Knight Lou Hlad advised that the Charity Review Committee had reconsidered their postponement of a vote on the \$1,000 request by Wiley Maloof for Sister Sponsa's *Our Lady of Fatima Home* in Liberia. Research into Council records revealed that it had indeed been over a year since we last donated to this very worthwhile charity. The motion was then proposed and seconded. It is being publically noted here and a final vote will occur in November.

Grand Knight Greg Crnkovich spoke at length about a new benevolence initiative to aid our paralyzed brother, Matt Dewhurst, by raising the funds to purchase a special handicap-fitted van with a wheelchair lift to give him mobility. This campaign was first envisioned by Greg and then discussed by the officers who concurred. The amount of funds required would be considerable and the campaign would have to go on for several months and encompass perhaps several independent fund raising events to reach its final goal. Costs and possible public grants are being investigated.

Any member may fill out a <u>"Request for Charity"</u> Form available at McGivney Hall, and thereby provide a detailed justification for the charitable need. The Charity Review Committee (consisting of the five program directors, the deputy grand knight, and at least one of the three trustees) will meet to consider the relevance and the amount of any gift to then propose it to the Council for further consideration, debate, and final vote of the membership assembled.

Veteran's Day Memorabilia for Nov. 11th Picnic

For Veteran's Day, Sir Knight Kirby Baden will be setting up another veteran's memorabilia museum, this year in the parish <u>Social Hall</u>. The Veteran's Day Picnic is Sunday, Nov 11th, after 12:15 Mass until 4 PM. It is free.

A Bigger and Better Second Tootsie Roll Drive

On the weekend of September 29/30, we held our second Tootsie Roll Drive of the fratemal year to benefit the **Georgia Special Olympics** and the **Elaine Clark Center for Special Children** in Chamblee. The drive is formally named the *Campaign for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities* by the Knight Organization.

This was the first time we had attempted two drives because ——the first one in May was so successful, the charitable need was so great, and we had so many doggone leftover Tootsie Rolls that we didn't know what to do with them.

For the second campaign, Greg asked that we think about branching out to neighboring venues to increase our sales. Frank Callan was able to enlist the very kind managers of Kroger, CVS Pharmacy, and the Ace Home Place to agree to allow us to solicited on their properties. As always we also manned the doors of the Parish at all Masses. The number of Knight volunteers was heart-warming, some overcoming lingering illnesses to aid the cause.

We were able to collect a total of \$904 from the three store areas, another \$2,454 from the church doors, and even \$30 dollars from Marist High School. That gave us a total of \$3,388 for the second drive. Our first drive in July brought in about \$1,900 gross and \$1,450 net after expenses of \$450. That netted us about \$4,838 for charity from the two drives. This is very gratifying for a candy sale. Many people don't even take the candy because they value their fillings more.

Thank you so much for all the Brothers and their families that gave of their time to help persons with disabilities.
