Brothers, welcome to our busy season!

October started with our regular meeting on the 7th and the activities took off from there. We had Adam Lindenau, the new parish Youth Director, speak briefly to us about the Youth ministry. Adam is an energetic and dedicated young man and our parish is fortunate to have him. We hope to have him join our council as well and develop some synergy in the family/youth areas.

The next day we had the parish Mass for Life at which the Knights provided the Acolytes and an honor guard, and parish youth processed in carrying crosses with the number of babies killed each year by abortion since the Roe v Wade decision in 1973. We provided some of the crosses for the procession and participated in the painting and signage for them.

That Saturday, we had Monsignor's 25th Anniversary Gala with the Knights providing an honor guard. We also provided and staffed the beverage table/trailer at the dinner afterwards.

We had our annual Memorial Mass for Deceased Brothers on October 13th with an honor guard and a ceremony in which a candle was lit for each of the 28 deceased knights of our council. It was quite a moving ceremony. A brief reception followed and the family members who attended the ceremony expressed their appreciation for the remembrance.

On Oct. 17th we participated in the **Farewell Mass for Archbishop Donahue** with one of the largest honor guards I've seen. Later that day we had our annual Oktoberfest Picnic at Rivermont Park. The weather was perfect with food fun family and fellowship shared enjoyed by all. Monsignor, who also attended, remarked at what a delightful event it was.

On October 23rd and 24th we had our food tent at the Dunwoody Music Festival. We served Brats (plus corn on a stick Saturday only) hotdogs and drinks. Rumor has it that we may even have made some money on the event! We also had face painting by Mary Ann Lehman, spouse of deceased Sir Knight William Lehman.

That weekend also saw the beginning of the **Keep** Christ in Christmas card sales. The 6:00 PM Mass on the 24th was a "Badge Mass."

On Tuesday the 26th we had a *First Degree Exemplifi*cation at McGivney Hall in which 5 men from All Saints and 1 from St. Thomas Aquinas joined our Order (pictures featured in the next newsletter).

Council Charity and Benevolence






Oktoberfest by the Chattahoochee River

Theresa Fuentes, 86, the mother of Sir Knight Joe Fuentes passed away on October 12th in Cerritos, California following a brief final illness. She was a seventh generation Californian and a direct descendant of the pioneering ranching Palomares land grant family. Their ancestral home is a State Historical Landmark and Park in the City of Pomona.

One of seven children, she enlisted in the U.S. Navy during World War II and served as a Seaman 1st Class in New York City and Washington, DC. A deeply spiritual woman she raised ten children and maintained a passion for art, fashion, business, and world travel.

She assisted her husband in the family paint store business in Pico Rivera, CA, and worked alongside him when he entered government and politics as a top-aide in both the California State Assembly and the U.S. Senate.
