

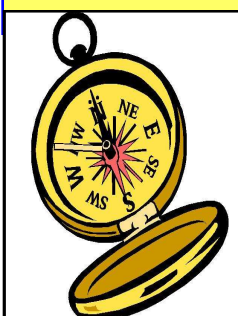

## Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

October was another busy month.

On October 1st, we had K of C day at the 18th All Saints Habitat for Humanity house.

At our October 4 meeting, we approved over \$11,000 in charitable contributions:

Monastery of the Holy Spirit - \$5,000  
KofC Charities (PWID) – over \$2,000  
Birthright - \$1,000  
Dominican Sisters - \$1,000  
People Making Progress - \$1,000  
FODAC (Friends of Disabled Adults/Children) - \$500  
Fr. Ho Lung – Missionaries for the Poor Jamaica Mission - \$500  
Special Olympics Softball - \$250

The \$5,000 contribution to the Monastery of the Holy Spirit will allow the council's support to be memorialized on one of the columns in their meditation garden.

On October 13<sup>th</sup> we combined with brother knights from St. Benedict's in hosting a Dinner and Wine Auction for the benefit of St. Joseph's High School in Ghana, Africa. The event raised nearly \$50,000 for the school.

We had our annual Oktoberfest on Sunday October 16<sup>th</sup> at Rivermont Park, and if you missed it, you missed a great time. State Deputy (and Past Grand Knight at All Saints) Rick Sisko presented our council its fifth Double Star award and our Third Place International Service Award for Youth Service. Representatives from the Kiwanis were there to share in the recognition for the Soap Box Derby project.

On October 18th we held the Council's annual Mass of Remembrance. The honor guard and the acolytes lighting the 34 candles honoring our Council's 34 Brother Knights who have gone to their reward made this a memorable event, as did the large number of attendees at the Mass.

Thanks to the efforts of Great Pumpkin, BJ Van-Gundy, his Faithful Gourd, Bruce Malinoff, and a cast of thousands (well – a lot of other volunteers) the First Annual All Saints Pumpkin Patch appears to be

a rousing success!! Last chance to get a pumpkin will be the weekend of October 29/30 after which the pumpkins will disappear (again, with the help of a cast of thousands of volunteers), thereby returning All Saints to its pre-Pumpkin splendor.

The All Saints Habitat for Humanity House was finished and dedicated on October 23rd, and that weekend we also helped sponsor the pre-school picnic, complete with hay rides for the kids.

Our Wednesday night Poker Players graciously accommodated the First Degree team with a schedule change allowing our monthly First Degree to take place on Wednesday the 26<sup>th</sup>. Three new Brothers were added to our ranks.

The *Keep Christ In Christmas* card sale has begun outside the church and will move into the Social Hall during the weekend masses in November.

Later in November the Fudge from the Monastery of the Holy Spirit should arrive, just in time for Christmas giving (don't forget the fruitcake, coffee, and biscotti as well).

Mark your calendar for *Desserts with Santa* on Saturday morning, December 3rd, and the annual Knights of Columbus Christmas Party Saturday evening December 10th.

Over the weekend of October 22/23, I was in New Jersey visiting my parents. When I told my father what our council was doing, he was amazed. He said that, while his council had been active, it is significantly less so because many of the Knights of his generation have passed on and there was no "new blood" to take over the activities.

While All Saints is particularly active now, we need to make sure that what happened to my dad's council does not happen here. The way to insure that is to recruit new brothers.

# Jean-Paul & Antonette Roy - 60 Years Wed



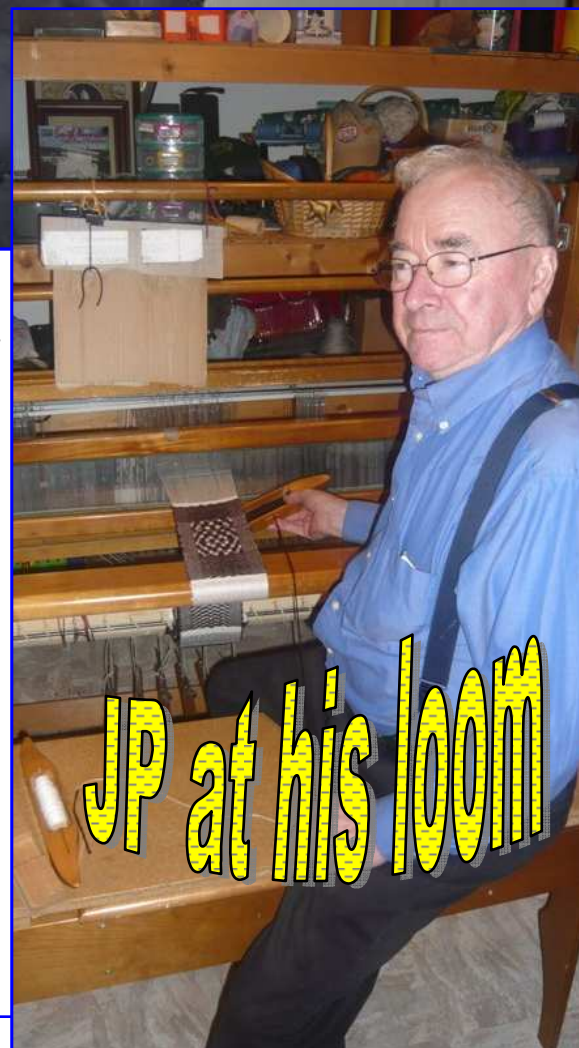

Welcome to all new brothers.

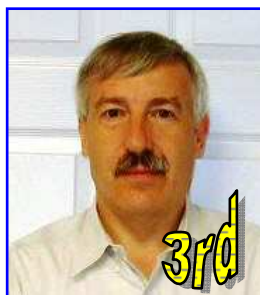

# Pumpkin Patch is a Huge New Success

Not known for timid thinking, your Knights this year embarked on a fundraiser that looks like it is here to stay as an annual event. Two truckloads totaling about 3,500 pumpkins were delivered to All Saints with the blessing and encouragement of Monsignor Marren. The idea was first fostered by our Great Pumpkin, Sir Knight B.J. Van Gundy.

Originally the council had considered using the grassy corner across Mt. Vernon Road near the UPS store where Christmas trees are sold. It was the Monsignor who asked why they were not to be used as parish decorations and a source of seasonal fun. While other pumpkin patches around the area are displayed on sterile plots, ours provides a unique setting all around our beautiful campus.

Sales have been brisk and a special arrangement of income revenue sharing between the supplier and the council ensures no financial risk to the council and a guaranteed profit for Knight charities. Final arrangements for the disposition of unsold inventory has likewise been made. (An area goat farmer wants the leftover items as feed for his animals. Goats eat anything, you know.) We thank the scores of volunteers that helped with this project and loaned us their pickup truck to move the pumpkins around.

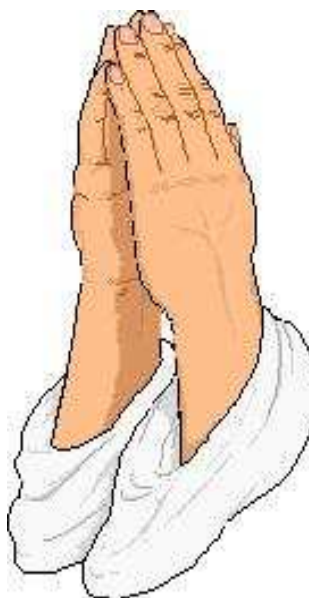

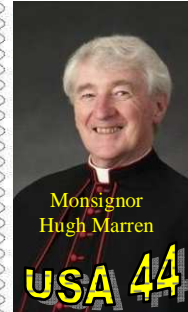
