Grand Knight's Report

Worthy Brothers:

IN SERVICE TO ONE, IN SERVICE TO ALL

This month, I call to mind the motto of the Knights. We have a Brother who is need of assistance, and at our next business meeting, the Officers of the Council will call on us to reach out and to live out this motto here in our own Dunwoody community.

Two years, ago, Brother Knight Matt Dewhurst was paralyzed in a tragic car accident. As a result, Matt is a now a quadriplegic, unable to move his arms or legs except for some small movement in his right arm and hand.

After intensive therapy, Matt was able to develop enough breathing control to use an air-assist to control the movements of a motorized chair. Matt is one of the owners of the Ace Homeplace across the street from All Saints, and for the past year has been making the two block commute from his home along the sidewalks and parking lots to his office in the store.

Except for these excursions, Matt is essentially homebound. The occasional trip to the Shepherd Center or the doctor's office is an ordeal for Matt and his family, as the extent of his impairment and the weight of the motorized chair make getting Matt into a vehicle a tremendous challenge. Matt needs a modified, accessible van to help him regain some of his mobility.

Fortunately, the Shepherd Center and the State of Georgia have programs that offer financial assistance for the acquisition and conversion of motor vehicles for use by persons with Matt's disability.

While generous, these grants are not sufficient to offset the total costs of acquiring and converting a van, and that is where Council 11402 can be of enormous help. I hope to enlist the Council's help in establishing a drive to raise sufficient funds to complete the purchase of a van for Matt Dewhurst.




Making the day even more special, we had a father and son pair both move from 1st to 3rd degree — John and Christopher Callison.

Our Council Serves the Parish Youth

From time to time the youth groups of our parish contact the knights and ask us to make their gatherings a little special by utilizing our extraordinary culinary talents (and our outdoor grill.) Usually our Youth Director, Mark Moots, receives the request with a fairly short notice and has to plan for the food, grilling items, and a couple of helper elves very quickly.

Days before Sunday September 9th, he swung into action and quickly arranged to host another outdoor youth happening in the lower parking lot on

that date immediately after the evening Mass. The grill was cleaned, fired up with two bags of fresh charcoal during Mass, and the small crew was ready for the dozens of raucous and hungry teens that appeared shortly thereafter.

Passed and Pending Council Benevolence Requests

At the September business meeting, these charity requests were discussed and/or voted by the membership:

Deputy Grand Knight Louis Hlad advised that an usually-high total of six requests were submitted this month. Four requests had been favorably considered by the Charity Review Committee for immediate further Council action. These four were then motioned, seconded, and then postponed for a final vote in the October Business Meeting:

- Mario Commito request for \$1,000 to People Making Progress. This organization helps intellectually-disadvantaged young people. We recently painted their headquarters and were very impressed with their mission and results. His daughter has been a beneficiary.
- Joe Fuentes request for \$1,000 to the Sabrina Fair Fund. This single mother member of All Saints recently had a double mastectomy and has no insurance. We would contribute to the bank fund established in her name by her friends. Her medical bills could go up to \$40,000.
- Kent Polzin requested \$500 to offset Jessica Harm's medical bills. This young teacher at OLA fainted after giving blood and suffered a broken jaw and lost several teeth. Because she is just starting at OLA, the waiting period for insurance had not expired. A motion to raise the amount to \$1,000 was then made and seconded.
- Kirby Baden requested \$1,000 for the Elaine Clark Center for Special Children. By timing our yearly gift in October this year, the Council would be eligible to be considered a silver sponsor of the Elaine Clark Benefit Golf Tournament. This amount would allow our members a playing discount, would allow our Council banners and signage in the clubhouse, and would still equally benefit the Center. The motion was made and seconded.

A motion by Wiley Maloof to give \$1,000 to Sister Sponsa in Liberia was postponed (but certainly not denied) by the Charity Review Committee pending review of the amounts and dates of our past gifts and recent success of the All Saints church donation to this cause. Our budget of \$15,000 for charity is finite and KofC rules stress local community gifts over international gift funds. Wiley presented a strong case for the gift and there seemed to be considerable sentiment from members to reconsider it. It will be brought up for re-consideration again in October.

A motion for \$1,554 by Joe Cavallaro to purchase a diverse collection of Catholic-subject informational CD's to be sold at the rear of the church was made. The committee did not consider this a charity and permission for such a service would have to come from the parish. This request was passed on to the Church Pastoral Board which denied it.

Veteran's Day Memorabilia for Nov. 11th Picnic

Sir Knight Kirby Baden will be setting up another veteran's memorabilia museum, this year in the parish Social Hall. He has asked that all veterans furnish him with a service-era facial photo and also a present-day facial photo. He will use special computer software to "morph" an old face into a new face on a large screen for fun. The Veteran's Day Picnic will be on Sunday, Nov 11th, after 12:15 Mass until 4 PM.

Council & Parish Health Ministry Spotlight Men's Health

Knowing that our McGivney Hall could never accommodate all those who wanted to hear our speaker, we migrated our September 18th program to the Social Hall. Sixty attendees sat in rapt attention watching videos and slides showing the newest techniques in robotic surgery. Our special September speaker, Dr. Nikhil L. Shah, currently serves as the Director of Minimally Invasive and Robotic Urology at Saint Joseph's Hospital of Atlanta.

During his training, Dr. Shah completed a National Institute of Health/National Institute of Diabetes and Kidney Urologist-Scientist Research Fellowship with Dr. Martin Sanda at the University of Michigan. In addition, he earned a Masters Degree in Health Management and Policy at the University of Michigan's School of Public Health.

Dr. Shah serves as a researcher and clinician. He acts as a proctor for robotic surgery and has traveled internationally to present papers and teach robotic surgery. (No one asked if he washes hands before performing surgery at a computer monitor.)

In addition, he has played an active role in medical leadership and policy related issues with the American Medical Association (AMA) and the American Urologic Association (AUA). He continues to remain active and currently serves on the AMA's Coding and Reimbursement Committee.

Throughout his training, Dr. Shah developed patient and spouse prostate cancer support groups in Detroit and Ann Arbor, Michigan. In addition, he has received federal funding to investigate patient and spouse interactions and satisfaction with prostate cancer treatment. He is continuing his clinical research efforts at Saint Joseph Hospital in Atlanta and maintains an active role in local, national and international medical relief organizations for underserved people.

He is an expert on major diseases affecting men, such as cardiovascular disease, cancer, stroke, alcoholism, drug abuse and psychiatric disorders.

In addition, he examined conditions surrounding aging which has become especially important with our baby boomers and the increasing age of America's population. Such conditions are osteoporosis, arthritis, the effects of declines in testosterone and sexual function, as well as prostate disease and cancer. He stressed natural foods rather than supplements and praised nuts.


Three New All Saints First-Degree Brothers

Atlanta Fourth Degree to be Held on October 13th

On Saturday October 13th, a Fourth Degree Exemplification will be held at the *Atlanta Airport Marriott Hotel*. The registration starts at 8:30 AM. All candidates must register before 10:15 AM. The ceremony starts at 10:45 AM.

Remaining schedule of events:

- 11:30 AM—1:00 PM Ladies Wine and Cheese Reception (during the exemplification)
- 1:30 PM—3:30 PM Master's Hospitality Suite open
- 4:30 PM—Vigil Mass in Hotel (fulfills Sunday obligation)
- 5:45 PM—6:45 PM Cash bar reception
- 6:45 PM—Doors to Banquet Hall Open
- 7:00 PM—Banquet begins
- 9:00 PM—Midnight (dancing) or 9:00 PM — whenever (Master's Hospitality Suite Open)

This event will not be without costs. You will need to wear a regular black tuxedo (no tails), a plain white tuxedo dress shirt (no frilly lace, no upward wing collar), a black cummerbund (no vest), studs and cuff links, a black bow tie, and shined black dress shoes. You will be presented a ceremonial baldric during the event (a colorful diagonal K of C sash that goes across your chest.) Armed Forces personnel may wear their full dress uniforms. Priests wear their black suits.

We suggest tux purchase for about \$260, rather than rental over \$100. Fourth degree Sir Knights often use tuxedos for other Assembly formal events or optional Color Corps duty. (If you ever go on an ocean cruise, they usually have a formal captain's tuxedo dress-up night.) 


