## Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

We swing into the Fall season with an exciting host of activities and a record 299 members. Try as we could we could only add 7 new brothers at our Sept. 22nd 1st degree exemplification. We will have to wait until November 17th to surpass our 300 goal.

Happily, it will only be short-lived, because on the feast of the Immaculate Conception, December 8th, a much more important goal of spinning off a new council at Mary Our Queen Parish is scheduled.

We carry a group of 7 brothers on our roles that our committed to transfer to MOQ on the day they are chartered. We will also transfer a couple of Sir Knight brothers to act as officers for the new council. It is unknown how many other members attending MOQ will seek to transfer.

Several other councils in the area will see some of their members transfer as well. This is a very good thing. Anytime a new council can be added to the Order, Columbianism is strengthened.

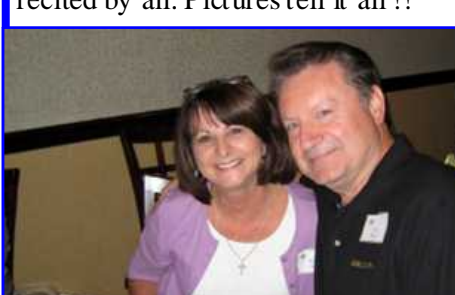


# Council Night at Altobeli's Italian Restaurant

On Saturday, September 12th, Council 11402 was the center of the KofC universe in the northern region of Georgia.

As is becoming our custom, the first Third Degree Exemplification of every new fraternal year seems to be held in the All Saints Social Hall. And there is nothing small about it. About two dozen councils from all over the state send candidates. Dignitaries and Georgia State officers were visible all over the Hall.

Last year we turned 116 second degree brothers into third degree brothers (who are considered full knights). This year we did the same thing for 107 more brothers. That's 223 more members in just two years who are now eligible to be officers and leaders in their home councils.

Every year we flirt with the Georgia candidate exemplification record which is thought to be in the mid-130's. With all the observers coming with their members, we host more than 200 brothers every year. Not only do they come, but they expect lunch when it's over. For two years now, our cooker has gotten a maximum stress test and done the job beautifully. Our special thanks go out to chefs Dennis Caniglia and Joe Fuentes and the other members of our crack cooking team.

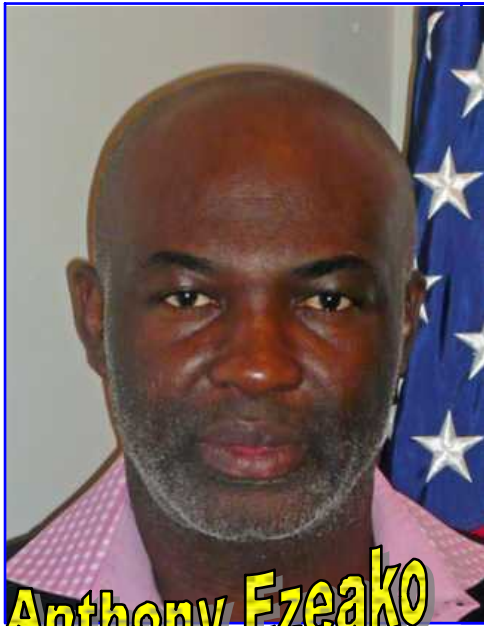
We wish these men many blessings and hope their knight careers are very fruitful.

# Mad Rush to Defend Roman Polanski

## Catholic League President Bill Donohue issues comments on the mad rush to defend film director Roman Polanski:

The Catholic League has long suspected that, in many quarters, the outrage over priestly sexual abuse has had more to do with the status of the accused than the crime itself. Now the evidence is indisputable: a child can be drugged, penetrated and sodomized—and the guilty can cut and run—and still maintain hero status. Provided he is a celebrity.

Actress Debra Winger showed up at the Zurich Film Festival “to honor Roman Polanski as a great artist, but under these sudden and arcane circumstances, we can only think of him today as a human being.” Either that or as a child rapist. She was not alone: the Zurich Film Festival jury proudly displayed red badges reading “Free Polanski.” It was also nice to know that Woody Allen, a man who speaks from experience, came to Polanski’s defense.

Whoopi Goldberg showed off her usual brilliance when she declared that Polanski’s crime “wasn’t rape-rape.” No, only priests are guilty of real rape. Noted photographer Otto Weisser agrees: “He made a little mistake 32 years ago.” That’s right—it’s only a big mistake when priests do it. Richard Cohen of the *Washington Post* also notes that it’s been “over 30 years” since Polanski molested the girl. Similarly, movie critic Tom O’Neil exclaims that it is “mind-boggling why they’re still pursuing this.” Yet there is no statute of limitations afforded priests—men long dead have been accused of crimes extending back to the 1920s.

Harvey Weinstein is so noble: “We’re calling on every film-maker we can to help fix this terrible situation.” The terrible situation, of course, isn’t what Polanski got away with—it’s his pursuit by the authorities. “To put him on trial or keep him in jail does not serve society in general or his victim in particular,” says journalist Anne Applebaum. She, and others, would carry more weight if the “he” included priests.

No wonder so many Americans look upon the celebrity worshippers with utter disdain. Double that for Catholics.

## Transfers to the New “*Mary Our Queen*” Council

No council likes to lose members to another, but when a new council is forming, it is imperative that all the surrounding councils encourage and aid its formation. By now you should all know that a new Council in Norcross at *Mary Our Queen Parish* is being formed. The tentative date of December 8th, 2009 (**The Feast of the Immaculate Conception**) has been set as the Charter Date. A minimum of 30 members is required.

Our Former District Deputy and brother, Guy Stryker, was the driving force in the formation of MOQ and he received permission from the pastor, Father Dye, to proceed. He has interviewed several brothers from All Saints, St. Brigid, and Atlanta Council 660 who have expressed interest in transferring to this new council.

Our new District Deputy, Greg Crnkovich, will inherit this council within his and our District 13 and our Insurance Field Agent, John Knight, will service their insurance requirements. DD Crnkovich is requesting that all of his councils poll their members to determine who is interested in becoming a charter member of MOQ.

Each must then fill out a standard Form 100 with the transfer option checked. The Form should have the name, address, member number, and contact info for each prospective member as well as his signature. The Financial Secretary should initiate these forms. They should have the name and number of the council gaining the member and also the date left blank. These items are still under development.

This group of Form 100’s becomes the “starting roster” to be shared with new members, so that prospective officers can be invited to enter their candidacies. They will not be processed until confirmation is obtained that the new Council will proceed. Then the Grand Knights, Financial Secretaries, and Chancellors (Membership Directors) of the affected councils will be advised prior to actually processing them.

# Area KofC Soccer Challenges Gain Support

The Knights of Columbus have for some years sponsored a *Fall Soccer Challenge Tournament* event across the country. Our council has not participated because of the lack of a local soccer field that could be used. Our sister council Holy Cross 10355 in Chamblee has reserved such a field and invited other local councils to participate.

Holy Cross Church is located just off Chamblee-Tucker Road about a mile north of I-285 and is very convenient to us.

Since Holy Cross Council 10355 has a soccer field and no gym and our council has a gym and no soccer field, a partnership was a “no brainer,” They in turn will attend our *Winter Basketball Foul Shooting Tournament*. Holy Cross Council recently was moved under our new District 13 Deputy Greg Crnkovich. This gives both councils a unique opportunity to share this and many other events, such as exemplifications.



This below section of the KofC Soccer Challenge Manual gives the synopsis of just how the event works.

The Soccer Challenge is similar to the foul shooting event in that each youngster gets to kick a certain number of foul shots at the goal. Age group winners advance to district shootouts and then to state finals. A parent signature will also be needed.

The Second Area Soccer Challenge was held at St. Benedict Parking Garage on September 27th.

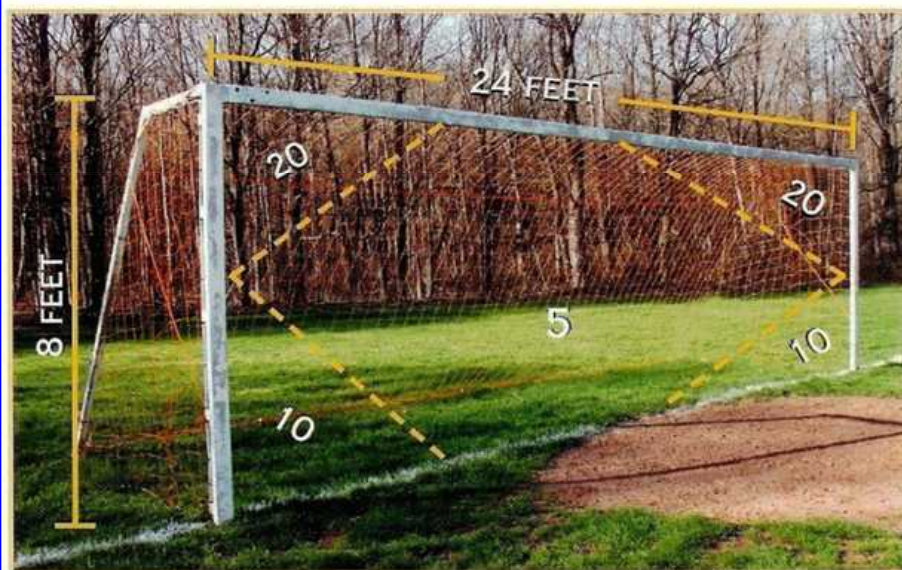
The Third Area Soccer Challenge was held at St. Brigid on the weekend of October 10/11.

It is a pleasure to see this new tradition growing quickly across the Atlanta area. We expect huge participations as it takes hold.

## COMPETITION

The Knights of Columbus Soccer Challenge is a competition designed for players to demonstrate the most basic of soccer skills — the penalty kick. Each player will be allowed fifteen shots at the goal from the penalty line (12 yards from the goal).

The goal will be divided into a series of 5 scoring zones. The upper corners of the goal will be designated as 20 point zones. The lower corners will be designated as 10 point zones and the central region is a five point zone. To construct the five scoring zones attach a piece of rope approximately six and a half to seven feet in length diagonally across the four corners of the goal as shown in the diagram below. Use tent stakes to secure the bottom ropes to the ground.



## SCORING

To score this competition each participant will be given 15 penalty kicks. Points will be awarded depending upon the area of the scoring zones through which the ball passes. For example, after the player's fifteen penalty kicks, his/her scores are 5/10/20/5/5/5/5/10/10/5/20/5/10/5/5, his/her total score would be 125. A score of 125 would be marked on the entry form/score sheet. Normal rules of soccer regarding penalty kicks apply for all levels of competition. Penalty kick violations include stepping on or over the line prior to the kick, and any contact made with

the ball counts as a kick. Scorers should record shots made and missed according to the instructions on the entry form/score sheet. It is also recommended that multiple scorers be assigned to each goal for scoring accuracy and comparison. All scores should be verified before the next contestant is allowed to shoot. The use of video tape recording is not recommended to resolve questions on scoring totals. **Judges and scorers are given final authority in verifying all scores and violations.**
