## Order Pledges \$1.4 Million for Special Olympics World Games

THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS has announced a donation to cover the costs of athletes from the United States and Canada attending the 2015 Special Olympics World Summer Games in Los Angeles.

The Order’s \$1.4 million sponsorship will cover the expenses of every athlete from the two countries during the event. More than 7,500 athletes from 185 countries competed in the last World Summer Games, held in 2011 in Athens.

Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson made the announcement July 14 during a news conference at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. Joining him were Archbishop José H. Gómez of Los Angeles, who is a member of Our Lady of the Angels Cathedral Council 2540, and World Games CEO and President Patrick McClenahan.

“The Knights of Columbus were there with Special Olympics and its founder, Eunice Kennedy Shriver, from the very beginning,” said Supreme Knight Anderson, adding that Sargent Shriver, Eunice’s husband, was “a friend and proud member of the Knights.”

The supreme knight added, “Our support exemplifies our commitment to the dignity of every person, our dedication to assisting with our neighbors’ needs whatever they may be, and our deep appreciation for the great work done by Special Olympics.”

# The Holy See Replies to the U.N.

#### Holy See Replies to U.N. Committee

September 26, 2014

Bill Donohue comments on the Holy See's reply to a report issued earlier this year by the United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child:

The Holy See took this U.N. committee to task on three levels: the international body does not understand the reach of the Holy See's authority; it unjustly involved itself in canon law; and it advanced positions on parental rights and sexuality that are unacceptable.

The U.N. committee does not understand the difference between the Holy See, the Vatican City State and the universal Catholic Church. While the Holy See's "religious and moral mission" is universal, it is a mistake of monumental proportions to conclude that it therefore has universal juridical authority. It is important to recognize that "the Holy See does not ratify a treaty on behalf of every Catholic in the world, and therefore, does not have obligations to 'implement' the Convention within the territories of other States Parties on behalf of Catholics, no matter how they are organized."

The Holy See criticized this U.N. body for the way it "plunged into canon law," improperly equating this juridical system with that of other member States. Importantly, it emphasized that canon law is a "complex unity of divine positive law, divine natural law and human law."

On the issue of parental rights, the Holy See took the U.N. committee to task for disregarding the text of the U.N.'s Convention: the text affirms parental rights, yet the committee holds that the U.N. has a right to instruct member states on "sexual and reproductive health" issues. In effect, it is telling the Catholic Church to change its teaching on abortion. And by lecturing the Church to align itself with contemporary "gender" issues, and matters of sexual orientation, it is also showing its contempt for the Church's autonomy.

In short, those who wrote the U.N.'s report on the Holy See haven't a clue how the Catholic Church operates. Moreover, they unjustly injected themselves into the internal affairs of the Church.

## October Tip -- Still Have Just Group Insurance?

As a Knights of Columbus field agent, I hear about group life insurance every week. If you have it, it’s certainly not a bad thing, but it can be a misleading security blanket. Most times, the amount offered is far from what you need, and the only way to determine what you need is with a comprehensive needs analysis.

Your group coverage is not based on any analysis. Instead, they apply a formula: you make X amount in salary and the group life is either a flat amount (\$15,000 seems popular) or a multiple of your salary (somewhere between 1.5 and 2.5 is common). Either way, it has nothing to do with the number of children you have, the mortgage balance you carry, or the amount of money your wife would need if you die. It’s a completely random number.

It can also disappear at any time. All of us know people — friends, family members, neighbors — who have lost their jobs. When the job is lost, so is the group life insurance coverage. If the company experiences difficulty and budgets need to be cut, group life can be reduced or eliminated. And that decision could be made at the worst possible time for you.

Most group life insurance coverage reduces or disappears when you retire. Many times it can be converted, but at a very expensive premium (remember, you’re no kid anymore when you retire, and premiums do rise as you get older). Just because you turn 65 doesn’t mean you no longer need life insurance or need less coverage. Actually, the opposite is true.

Do you still own just group life insurance? It must be supplemented with a personally owned portfolio. I can tell you exactly how to blend your group benefit with your K of C life insurance so things can be in your control. Don’t let the feeling of security that group life provides distract you from the real issue: taking control of your family’s financial future!

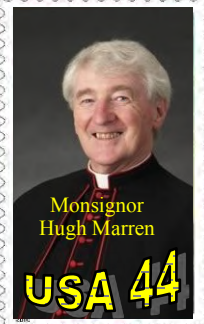
