## Two Sir Knights Find Their Way “Home”



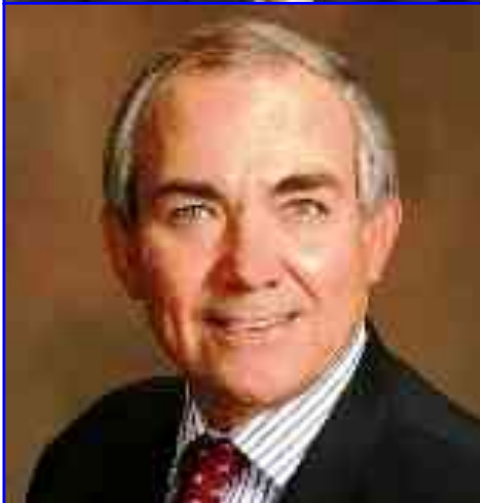
### Sir Knight Robert Heald (pronounced ‘healed’)

# Council Budget for Fraternal Year 2006-2007

As discussed in the last business meeting, this year's fraternal budget may look a little out of balance.

We have decided to intentionally spend a good deal more than we collect (this year only), because we have been seeing a more than healthy positive cash flow over the last few years.

Being a charitable organization, the officers have now decided to ramp up our restricted and unrestricted charitable contributions to a greater level to draw down our cash positions. These positions are much more than adequate for future operations.

Our twelve-year-old bylaws are now being reviewed by a committee to bring them more in line with bylaws of other councils and also Supreme. We expect an increase in the \$200 spending limit that must now be voted upon during business meetings. Also, inflation has made this maximum limit too restrictive for such a dynamic organization.

As always, we have a board of three trustees that oversee all the monetary transactions that occur and audit our books regularly.

## Charity Requests Solicited for Consideration

As outlined in the budget explanation on Page Three of this newsletter, Our Council is making a major effort to increase its charitable outreach this fraternal year in time, talent, and treasure. Our healthy financial position and the charter of our organization make this imperative.

This is not an attempt to blindly throw money at projects with very little foresight. Our resources are quite limited and any distributions must be well thought-out and meaningful. For this reason, the Order has a process for making requests, discussing them, publicizing them, debating them, and finally approving them.

We have a special *“Request for Charity” Form* that may be obtained from the Council. Its completion begins a process that takes about three months for large amounts. The form is a cover page for what should be a lucid business case for making a donation to some worthwhile charity. It is submitted to our Deputy Grand Knight, Frank Callan, who calls a meeting of the Council Activity Directors and our three Trustees to consider it and decide upon a suggested amount.

If approved, a motion is raised at the next Business Meeting for consideration. It is then publicized in the next newsletter, and formally voted upon at the following meeting. We have three such requests pending now and we invite others.

## All Saints Parish Hoedown Needs Volunteers

This year the All Saints Parish Hoedown has been moved later to Saturday September 16th. Our Council will again be manning the two beverage concessions. Volunteer signup sheets will be circulated at the September 5th business meeting. We will also be opening McGivney Hall for additional seating. This is a great recruiting opportunity for the Council to show off the hall and acquaint non-members with our facilities and to make them and their wives feel at home.

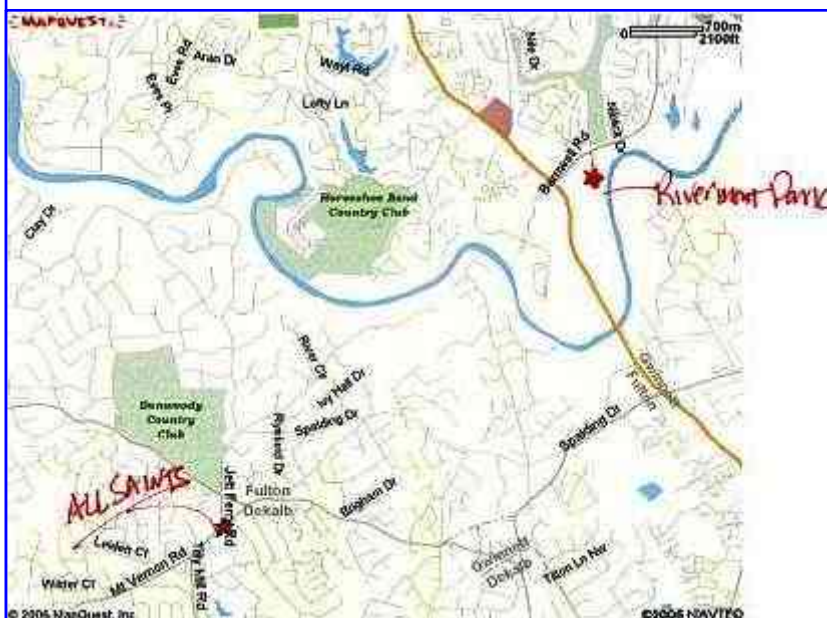

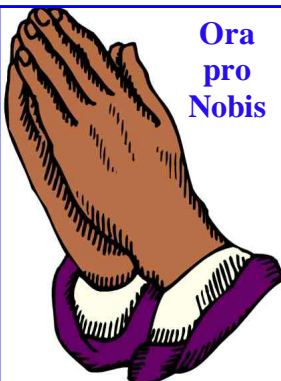
