We are about to begin a busy season. We have received the traveling sacred icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe. On Saturday September 3rd at the 5:00PM mass, it will be installed in the sanctuary for its week-long visit to All Saints. We will have a procession and honor guard for that event. The following Tuesday, September 6th there will be an evening Mass at 7:00 PM followed by the Marian Prayer devotional in the church. I encourage all to attend.

After the Mass and devotional, we will retire to McGivney Hall for our regular monthly business meeting. (Note the Mass and devotional will be instead of our regular 7:00 rosary. Our Council will be providing lunch on the October 1st build day – be prepared for a culinary masterpiece!

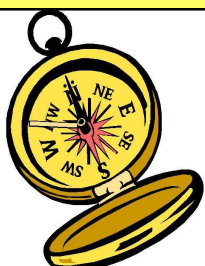

Fiscella to make run at Ross seat

Bob Fiscella, a Dunwoody resident since 1993 and current vice president of the Dunwoody Homeowners Association, has announced he will run for the Dunwoody City Council District 2 at-large seat being vacated by Danny Ross.

Fiscella is a residential realtor with Keller Williams, and a one-time Emmy Award-winning sportscaster with Fox Sports and CNN. He has been an active member of All Saints Church since moving to Dunwoody, is currently president of his Springfield neighborhood association, and the out-going vice president of Kingsley Rac-

quet & Swim Club.

"I've really enjoyed getting involved in this community, and would love to continue to do so as a member of city council," Fiscella said. "Councilman Ross has done a great job to ensure our tax dollars are wisely spent, and certainly that would be one of my priorities."

"I can't think of a better person to sit on the council than Bob," said Sandy Springs Police Department major and Dunwoody resident David Bertrand. "He takes the necessary time to understand all sides of the issues, and his trust factor is off the charts."

Fiscella is a graduate of the University of Texas with a degree in broadcast journalism. He has been married to Rita Fiscella since 1995. His 12-year old son Jack is a sixth grader at Peachtree Charter Middle School; his nine-year old daughter Danielle is in fourth grade at Dunwoody Elementary School. Previously, both attended Vanderlyn Elementary.

Fiscella is also a familiar sight at Murphey Candler Park, helping coach and support his son's baseball and football teams, and his daughter's softball teams. He is an avid blogger; his site is www.dunwoodyusa.org.

The August 31st issue of the Dunwoody Crier announced the candidacy of our Deputy Grand Knight, Bob Fiscella, for the unfilled seat of Councilman Danny Ross (also an All Saints parishioner).

All Saints Wins Another Double Star Award

The August *Knightline Newsletter* from Supreme has made it official. All Saints 11402 was cited as Double Star Council for a fifth consecutive year.

Of the 1,078 councils in the world that won a Star Award, only 348 won the coveted Double Star (a third of all star councils). Based on the total of 14,000 worldwide councils, the 348 is only 2.5% of all councils.

The number of these 348 that have won 5 in a row is unknown, but must be miniscule indeed. We do know, however, that our sister council, St. Brigid, has also now won five in a row. It is quite possible that we two councils are unique.

Another sister council from our Charles Watters Assembly, Mary Our Queen, has won their very first Double Star. Only 8 councils in Georgia won a Double Star, and three of them are in our Charles Watters 4th Degree Assembly.

Kudos to past District Deputy Greg Crnkovich. Kudos also to our star recruiter, Frank Callan, who was instrumental in five prestigious awards.

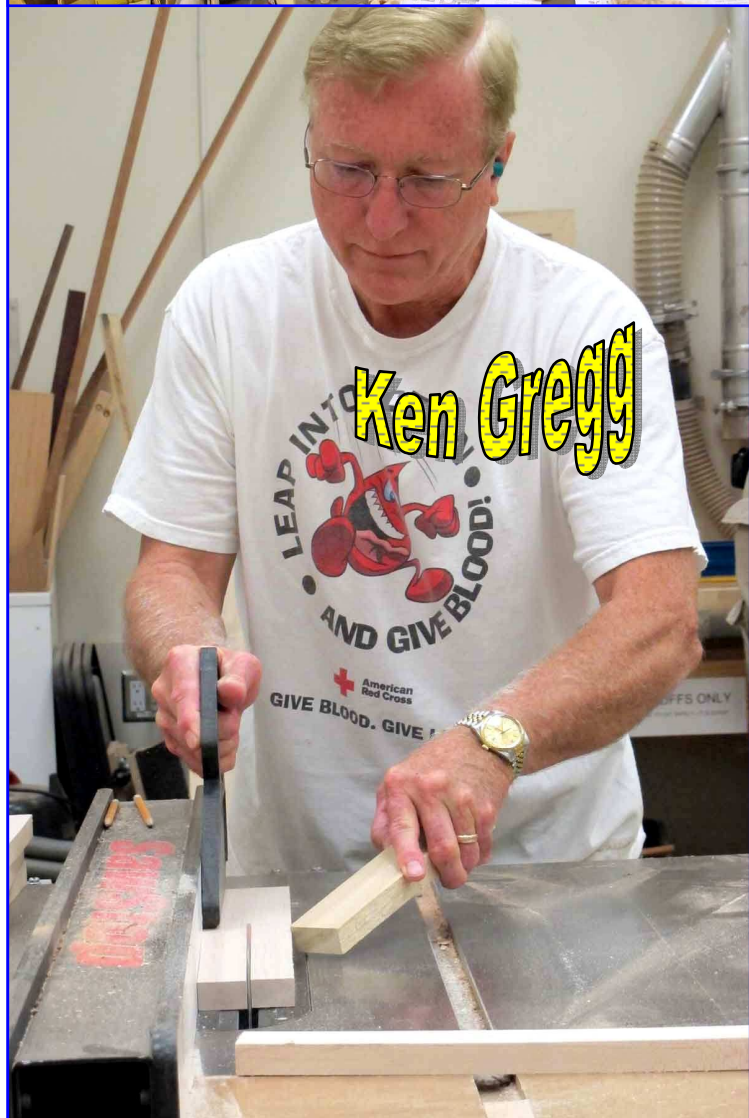

Council provided cookout for returning students at the Emory Catholic Center on August 24th for brother Fr. Bryan Small.

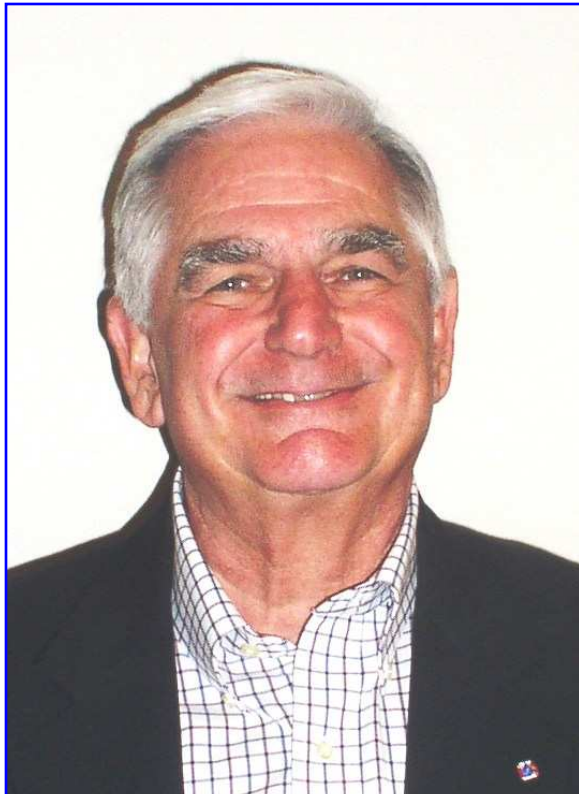
Council voted \$250 for Brother Ken Gregg’s annual hospital toy distribution (see story).

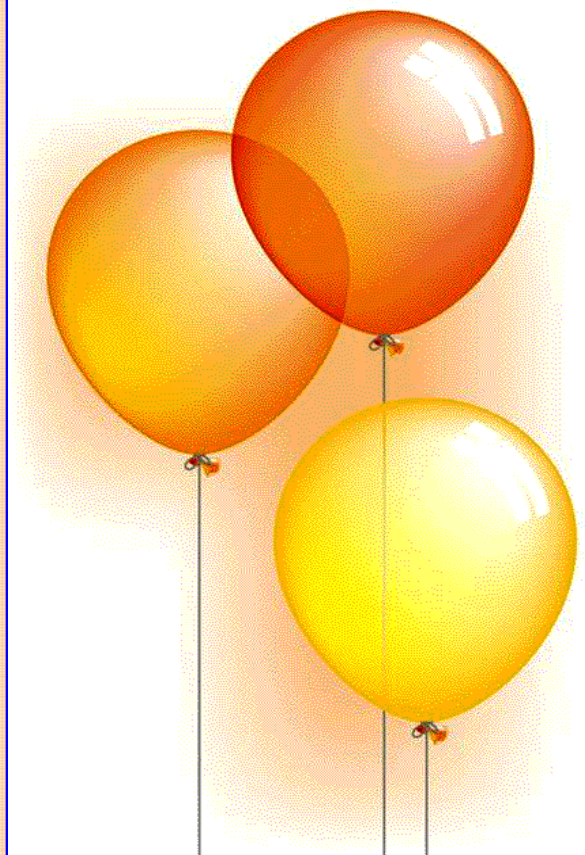

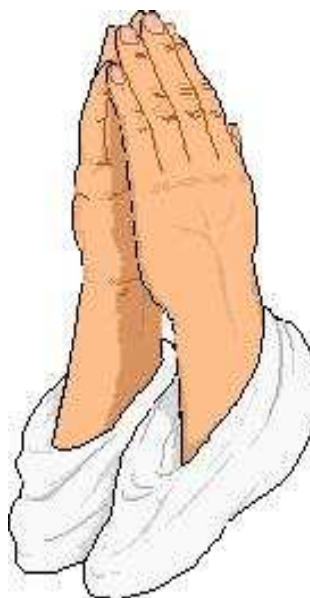

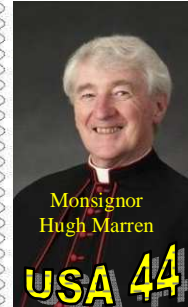
