All Saints Honors Msgr. Donovan

All Saints was chosen as the venue for the funeral Mass of Monsignor Walter J. Donovan, 96, who served the Archdiocese of Savannah-Atlanta for 68 years. Retired for many years, he no longer had a home parish and resided next door to our own retired Monsignor Kiernan at St. George Village in Roswell.

Scores of priests, uniformed students in blue and khaki from Msgr. Donovan High School in Athens, and friends and family filled the church on August 1st for the funeral. About 50 priests in matching vestments con-celebrated the Mass with Archbishop Wilton Gregory and Bishop Luis Zarama.

Our 4th degree Knights of the Fr. Charles Watters Assembly and several other Assemblies provided honor guard squads that stood watch overnight at the open casket in groups of four and provided the guard for the Mass the next morning. Our own Sir Knight Bob Mitchell was the Commander of the entire contingent.

All members can help in the submission of new candidate names, but that is only the first step in a long chain of events that lead to degree progression and member retention. We also have many sick brothers that are reported to us, but their later health situations are not followed and reported. Some brothers require mentoring as well.

If you have some spare time and have good people skills, can follow up on developing scenarios, and are comfortable with computers, please think thoughtfully and prayerfully about a job on our membership committee. We need to increase the effectiveness of our outreach communications.

September Insurance Tip --Raising Awareness About Life Insurance

Since 2003, each September has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of the product among the general public. Each year, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) puts out the results from a recent survey, and unfortunately, the numbers they report continue to be discouraging.

A recent survey found that 76 percent of people polled did not have a personal financial advisor. Sixty-eight percent of that same survey group said their opinion of the current economic conditions was somewhat unfavorable or very unfavorable.

In other words, a majority of those surveyed were uncomfortable with the economy and the uncertainty it brings, yet they did not seek professional assistance. Maybe they spoke with their friends and family. Maybe they hoped the instability would go away on its own. Maybe they did not know to whom to turn.

Sponsoring Next Parish Eagle Scout



Eagle Scout candidate, Michael Wieland, is the next prospective parish Eagle in a string of young men now numbering somewhere in the mid-forties. He has been a member of our Troop 434 since 2005.

He proposes to renovate the parish campus outside altar area in the woods just adjacent to McGivney Hall to turn it into a prayer meadow. Michael will lead a team of scouts to install benches, clear a path, remove rotted railroad ties, repair altar stones, cement benches in place, install flood blocks to direct water, construct stands for saint statues, and add mulch to the area.
