New Brother Alexis Uwilingiyimana—A Special Story

Our Brother, Deacon Ken Melvin has asked the council to give special attention to the needs of our newest Brother, Dr. Alexis Uwilingiyimana, who survived the Rwanda Massacre and is now living with the Deacon. Alexis is trying to forge a new life in the U.S. and has need of a used automobile, among other things. The Deacon's story:

Dr. Alexis Uwilingiyimana, MBBS, MPH from Rwanda is our newest "son" at Deacon Ken's home.

As many of you know Mama Linda and Deacon Ken are prone to "Adopting" people that can use a little help along the way. Alexis studied in the minor Seminary in Rwanda and when the Bishop asked if he was ready to take vows he said "Father I would like to serve by being a doctor".



Alexis will be living with us for the next year or two or three. He is a survivor of the genocide in Rwanda where he lost his entire family. Alexis needs a reliable used car donated to him (eligible for a tax write-off.)

With all of that said, he has successfully completed six years of medical study and graduated from the Rwandan National Medical school and just last month finished his MPH in Global Health at Emory University. Alexis will become a U.S. citizen late next year.

He is now studying for his medical boards with a goal of doing a pediatric residency in the U.S.

He is currently searching for "shadowing" opportunities to enhance his clinical skills and a letter of recommendation with a local Pediatrics practice.

Shadowing or volunteering is when the young "Unlicensed" doctor works with current physicians to gain in clinic knowledge prior to residency.

Since the August 26th exemplification of Alexis, Deacon Ken has reported that, almost miraculously, Alexis has received a shadowing opportunity from a group of pediatricians in the area. *Now he needs a reliable used car.*

We have just received an invitation from PAMPA pediatrics for

Alexis to "shadow" with them at their clinics.

They are a premiere group of sixteen physicians with four clinics on the North side.

This is in addition to DeKalb Refugee Clinic in Decatur.

Therefore we have reached our short term goals for shadowing.

As we work with the Georgia Pediatric association we will further define the

hours needed and the pediatric sub specialties we need to study

to obtain a residency in a top tier teaching hospital.

This good news however, makes the need for a donated car more immediate.

CharityMobi, Inc. the sponsoring agency for Alexis is a 501 (c) 3 public charity and therefore can give a letter to the donor declaring it as tax deductable charitable donation.

All Saints "Habitat for Humanity" House #21

In 1994 All Saints committed to support the construction of one Habitat for Humanity house. Now 20 years later we are preparing for the construction of our 21st house on August 23, 2014.

KofC 11402 has been an integral part of this project for many years, providing volunteer labor and lunch for one Saturday on each of the builds. Twenty families had the "unreachable" dream of owning a safe, warm, and sustainable home to raise their family and with your support the dream became reality.

Once again the parish will be required to raise \$55,000 to seed the construction, working with the HFH affiliate. Financial and volunteer support from All Saints allows the selected homeowner to secure an affordable mortgage of approximately 90K at "0" interest secured by the HFH Atlanta affiliate. The Atlanta affiliate has recently celebrated their 30th anniversary and has now constructed over 1,200 homes. This

effort has changed the lives of 5,000 family members for generations to come.

The support of Council 11402 is critical to the success of this project and we hope we will have a significant number of Knights participate in the project this fall. Remember, besides the "Knights" day (September 20th), you are encouraged to participate on any one of the seven Saturdays of the build. Day 1 of the project was August 23rd and will run for seven consecutive Saturdays, excluding 8/30 Labor Day weekend. Day 7 and dedication of the home will be on October 11th.

Signup Days for the Habitat House volunteers was held at all Masses on the weekend of August 2/3. We still need more workers. Consider spending time with us one Saturday helping with the construction. Absolutely no skills are required. We will guarantee a great time working alongside your fellow All Saints parishioners. Minimum age to work is 16 and this is a great opportunity for High Schoolers to earn service hours. Information packets are found at the doors of the church.

This year we had nearly one hundred (100) Altar Servers, YPM servers, parents and members of Knights of Columbus attend our annual appreciation outing. That was thirty two (32) different families, or fifty-six (56) children and forty-three (43) adults attending if you enjoy smiles and laughter there was no shortage at this Knight's outing at White Water.

After team building exercises (ask an altar server "what is the human knot?") in the White Water parking lot, everybody put on their bathing suits and sunscreen and headed to White Water. The Knights rented two covered pavilions just in front of the wave pool and this served as our storage and meeting location and many stories of bravery were shared here!

The kids spent the afternoon enjoying the exciting rides (Have you ever ridden the Tornado!?) It is amazing when you mix water, fun and sun that children become very hungry. We also rented a picnic pavilion where our hungry children and parents enjoye all you can eat food and drink at the park provided by White Water....yes, this also included all you can eat ice cream, too.

The kids then spent the rest of the afternoon enjoying more fun in the sun with exciting rides at White Water and the fellowship of their fellow altar servers. Prayer, food, fun, games and getting wet - what a combination!

Every year I think of ways to make this event better. I can honestly say I am not sure we can.



September Tip -- Raising Awareness About Life Insurance

Since 2003, each September has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of the product among the general public. 



Bill married Karen Tukeva in 1998 and a year later they both retired and enjoyed the chance to travel in the U.S., Europe and South America. In 2007 Bill began having problems with his balance and after repeated visits to Emory and the Mayo Clinic, was diagnosed with a rare, neuro-degenerative disease called Progressive Supranuclear Palsy or PSP. Eventually this disease took away his mobility and ability to swallow and speak. Bill battled PSP for seven years with incredible dignity, strength and grace, but finally complications from it led to his death. He never, ever, complained. Bill's family wishes to express thanks to the doctors and staff of Emory University Hospital and his wonderful caregivers, especially Charronda and Carlo Williams.


