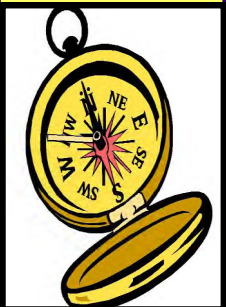

# Wulf Lindenau, Our New Chancellor

(from Prussia with love)

Wulf was born in Memel, East Prussia, Germany near the end of World War Two, and his parents are from German and Swedish and Lithuanian backgrounds. His mother traces her family to Swedish nobility and his father to a Prussian family which resided in the northern most areas of East Prussia.

After WW II his mother married an US Army Colonel, and he and his siblings (two brothers and a sister) became US citizens because of their mother's US naturalization.

Wulf was schooled in German and American schools, graduated from Heidelberg High School and joined the US Army, retiring after 20 1/2 years as a Major, with two tours of duty in Vietnam and

as a Professor at West Point, and several assignments as an Intelligence Officer.

Following this he served close to 23 more years as a civilian for the US Government. He retired for a second time as a GS-15, having served in the Treasury Department, the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) and the General Services Administration (GSA).

Wulf's civilian career started as a Security Officer with the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, Washington, D.C., and subsequent service with USAID, where he was the Agency's Director of Physical Security for all USAID missions worldwide. His US Government service culminated with GSA where he was the National Director of Operations for the Federal Protective Service (FPS) and then Director of FPS - the Police Force responsible for the National Capital Region, the "flagship" for FPS.

Retirement from the Government enabled service with organizations supporting veterans and Wulf served as the Commander of the American Legion, Washington, D.C., Commander of the Army / Navy Union, Washington, D.C., Commander General of the Military Order of Foreign Wars, and Vice Exarch for the United States of the *Ordo Sancti Constantini Magni*, an International Christian ecumenical society.

Wulf is married to Catherine, they have two children, a daughter Elizabeth - whose life is centered around the welfare of animals, and a son Christopher, a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy and Georgia Tech. Chris is married to Rachel, and he lives close to Wulf and Cathy, with their four beautiful children (Leah, River, twins- Colton & Sawyer). Beth is married to Brady, and they have a college student son, Tristan.

Wulf has a Masters Degree from Boston University and Catherine has a Masters Degree from Johns Hopkins. Wulf and Cathy moved to Georgia from Columbia, Maryland to be close to their son and his children - after all: grandparents are needed and want to help with the children...right??

# Dan Anderson, Membership Director

## Father Daniel Ketter appointed Atlanta's judicial vicar

SMYRNA—Father Daniel Ketter was recently appointed the judicial vicar of the Metropolitan Tribunal by Archbishop Wilton D. Gregory. Ordained in 2008, Father Ketter has served in the archdiocesan Tribunal since 2015. He earned a licentiate in canon law that same year from Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.

Father Ketter is a 1988 graduate of Marist School, Atlanta.

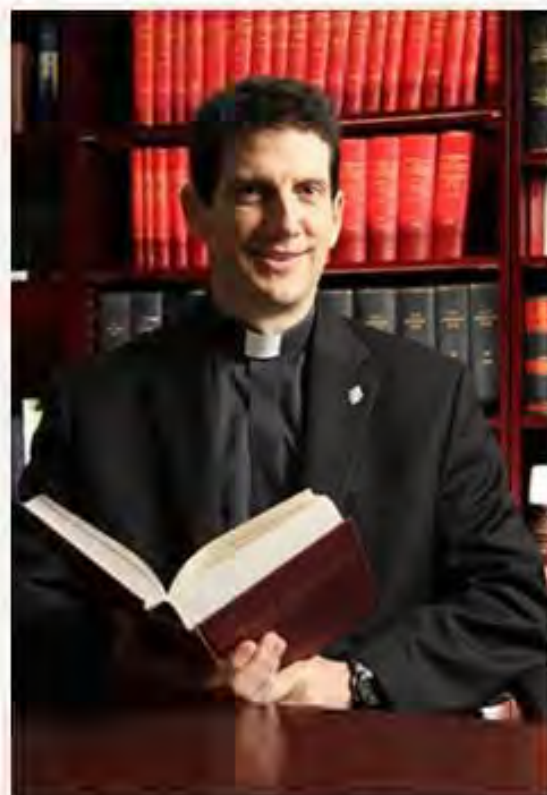
The ministry of the Metropolitan Tribunal includes all matters concerning the application and practice of canon law within the archdiocese. The Tribunal functions as the appeals court for the provinces of Atlanta, including the dioceses of Charlotte, Charleston, Raleigh and Savannah. The court also handles all matters of permissions and dispensations pertaining to marriage.

The judicial vicar is the presiding judge of the Tribunal.

Father Ketter answered a few questions from The Georgia Bulletin about his new position. The responses were edited for space.

**Georgia Bulletin:** You studied English in college and then worked in healthcare IT. What drew you to specialize in canon law, studying at Catholic University of America? What appeals to you about that area of the church?

**Father Ketter:** The only reason I pursued a degree in canon law was because the archbishop identified a need and asked me to help meet it. Like most priests I was anticipating spending my entire priestly ministry in our parishes and schools. However, we make a promise of obedience to the archbishop on the day of our ordination, which means that barring any serious reason to the contrary we serve where he determines there is the most pressing need. As priests we have to trust that God manifests his will to us through the assignments we are given by the archbishop.

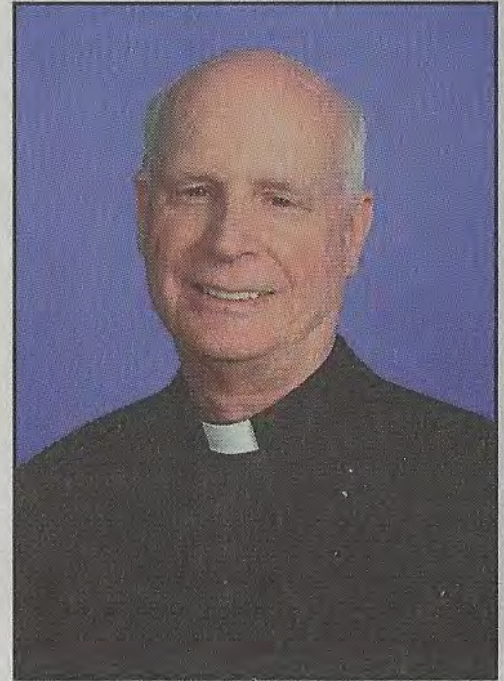
## Father William Rowland, SM, named acting president

ATLANTA—Marist School in Atlanta has announced that Marist Father John Harhager, who has served as the school's president for the past 10 years, has been elected vicar general of the Society of Mary, the religious congregation of priests and brothers that has owned and operated the school since 1901.

In accepting his new role, which began immediately upon his election Oct. 10 at a general chapter meeting in Rome, Italy, where the society is headquartered, Father Harhager stepped down as president of Marist School.

Adhering to the succession plan put in place a number of years ago, the Society of Mary has appointed Father William Rowland, SM, as acting president until the Marist Provincial and the Marist School Board of Trustees can appoint the new president. Father Rowland has held the roles of special assistant to the president at Marist School for the last eight years and alumni chaplain.

Every eight years, the Society of Mary holds a general chapter meeting in Italy attended by representatives from the society's provinces and mission areas around the world. The meetings set the direction for the society during the next eight years, make changes to the society's rule of life, and elect the international leadership, which includes a superior general and his gen-

Mr. Bob Rogers, President and CEO of Saving Grace, spoke on Monday October 9th in the All Saints Parish Social Hall on this important issue. A nice crowd of 50 people attended.

Street Grace is one of the pioneers in the human trafficking “space” – a \$290 million illegal industry in Georgia, alone. They are an Atlanta-based, faith-driven organization collaborating with faith, business and community leaders providing a comprehensive path to end Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking (DMST) in Metro Atlanta and throughout the United States. DMST is sexual activity in which there is a promise of the exchange of something of value to a child or another person(s) for sex with that child.

Street Grace mobilizes community resources – financial, human, and material – to fight DMST through awareness, education and action.

# October Parish Bingo— The Beat Goes On !!



We recorded 120 players on October 26th. This was a slight decrease from our 131 September crowd, but welcome. Our Bingo sales were \$1,783, our Bingo prizes were \$920 plus three gift cards, yielding Bingo gross proceeds of \$863. We also received \$238 from food donations, \$160 from drink donations, and \$183 from the 50/50 raffle sale. Cost of food and drink, 7% sales tax, state license fee, Crier ad cost, and cost of supplies are still to be deducted. Also, 42 players brought their Dunwoody Crier coupon ads in for free additional playing sheets. One widow was in attendance. We continue to achieve excellent charitable funds from this monthly event.

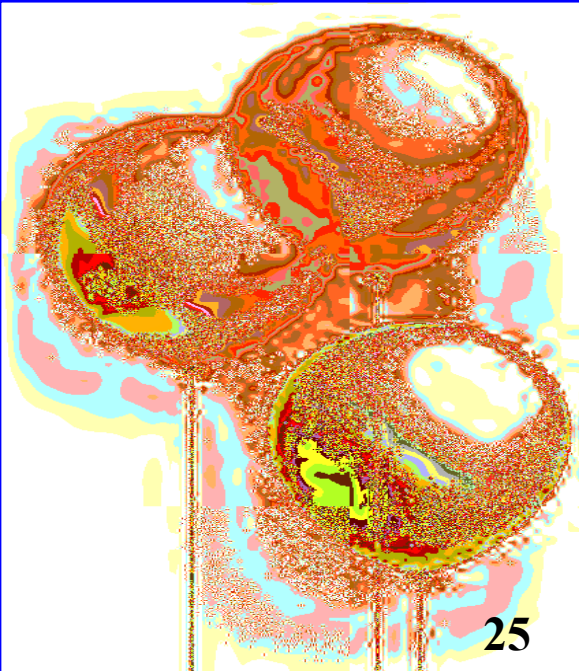

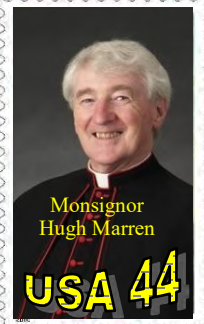
