

Ky Phanhsavath is 4th Degree




Our council brother Ky Phanhsavath became a fourth degree member of our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly 2688 on November 4th at St. Monica.


Parish Flag Retirement Ceremony



The Georgia Bulletin newspaper featured our parish Flag Retirement Ceremony held on November 5th in honor of Veterans Day.

In honor of Veteran's Day, All Saints Boy Scout Troop 434 and the church's Knights of Columbus Council held a flag retirement ceremony Sunday after the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Unserviceable flags (worn, torn, faded or badly soiled) had been collected in the weeks leading up to the dignified retirement. Dunwoody's Veterans Day observance is at 10:00 a.m. Saturday in Brook Run Park.

Our Council teamed with our parish Boy Scout Troop 434 to burn dozens of worn American flags outside the church after the 10:30 Mass on Sunday November 5th.



The formal ceremony is a beautifully-scripted boy scout event featuring the cutting up of a large American flag into its components and burning each with reverence and explanation. Veterans in the crowd were asked to deliver all other worn flags to the burning pits and salute the remains.

Brother Ed Cerbone is the Scoutmaster of our troop and arranged the event with our officers. A knight honor guard from Watters assembly added pomp to the ceremony.

Save your worn and damaged flags for proper destruction and never throw them away. They should be burned, hopefully in our next retirement ceremony.

Brother Tom Kaboski Family Update

Our former council brother, Tom Kaboski, and his wife Isabelle moved to Indiana with their family and newborn son Matthew who had some serious birth issues. He has transferred to a council in Granger, Indiana and keeps in contact with us. Here is an update on the health of his new son and the family that he recently sent us.

Please pray for health and good news for them. They are on a long journey to ensure the complete recovery of their son from birth complications.



Hey Pat and Lou ! So good to hear from you! Matthew has been making GREAT PROGRESS!!

Over the summer we worked to slowly wean him off of the ventilator. We started by taking him off of it for 15 minutes each in the morning and afternoon, and increasing the time every week. When we do this, the vent is removed and he gets warm humidified air through the tube to his neck. He does all of the work to breath with this warm humid air.

By the Fall, he had increased his time off of the ventilator to basically all day. We did a Sleep Study at the hospital in October to see how he would do overnight with warm humidified air instead of the vent. HE ROCKED IT!! As a result, he has been off of the ventilator for about a month and a half.

In addition, on Halloween morning, he was fitted with a small plastic valve fitting that allows us to take him off of the tubing setup all together (called a Passy-Muir valve.) It's a one-directional valve that allows him to breathe in through his neck and out through his mouth and nose. This may get a little confusing, but part of this process is to deflate the cuff that blows up and had sealed his trach tube in his throat. This had been blown up previously and used to seal off his upper airway so that the ventilator could push the air down to his lungs without it escaping out thru his mouth and nose.

With this new Passy-Muir valve, the cuff is deflated to facilitate him exhaling out of his mouth and nose. The cool part of this is that the air now passes across his vocal chords again ... so he can talk, cry, and laugh !! The entire time he'd been on the vent, he couldn't make a sound.

His cuff is deflated permanently, so he is talking up a storm. We are working on sounds and letting him explore his voice. In addition, this helps us to develop his ability to take feedings by mouth. We did a Swallow Study in September and he passed with flying colors ! We were cleared to progress to stage 2 baby food and increase the amount and frequency of his oral feedings.

He's still 95th percentile measured against kids born on his due date (9/29/16). And against kids born at full term, when he was born 3 ½ months early (6/17/2016), he is still 75th percentile. He's growing wonderfully. We still have a lot of work to do with physical therapy (crawling, walking, etc.) however he is making progress. He is sitting up on his own, and slowly walking in his Gait Trainer (baby version of a walker).

We are expecting to have the trach tube removed from his throat in Spring 2018. Hopefully his feeding tube will come out of his belly by the end of the summer or early fall 2018. We just have to keep him healthy and work on his oral feeding / physical therapy. It sounds simple, but there is still a lot of work ahead of us.

In early November, we attended the Ronald McDonald House Fundraising Gala in Indianapolis. They did a story on Matthew and our family. It was shown at the event to over 400 people in attendance. They raised a little over \$95,000 through the various auction/donation activities. Plus, Isabelle and I got a night out as one of our Nurses spent the night at the house watching Matthew. Sophia and Daniel had a sleepover with our daycare provider. I also attached a family picture from a recent photo shoot we did.

Also, in August we were able to retire Matthew's helmet. We were successful in correcting the flatness issue that resulted from his sedation during his multiple surgeries at the hospital. He's not wearing his Bucky Badger "W" helmet, but I did sit with him a couple weeks ago and watch Wisconsin vs Michigan!!

November Parish Bingo— The Beat Goes On !!



We recorded 105 players on November 16th. This was a slight decrease from our 120 October crowd, but welcome. We continue to achieve excellent charitable funds from this monthly event.
