Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

Fish Fry Results.

With our 2018 Fish Fry season now over, our Co-Fish leaders, Brothers Tom Simon and Dennis Caniglia, have great news to report!

This year, we served 7,948 meals (down slightly from last year) and finished the season with a net profit of \$18,000. Our highest night was during our 4th Friday with 1,334 meals served!

More importantly, we served as a gathering place for all of Dunwoody to celebrate our tradition of eating fish on Lenten Fridays. We were proud to show off our parish as the premiere place to socialize during Lent.

During one of the Fish Fry evenings, I randomly sat down at 18 tables and 12 of those tables consisted of visitors from outside our parish. They came from other Catholic parishes as well as the Jewish and Protestant communities. The visitors who travelled the furthest came from south Atlanta- near Eagle's Landing... and two from Boston!

Over 239 brothers, spouses, family members, Scouts, and other parishioners volunteered their time to make our Fish Fry a success.



New 2nd Degree March Brothers





Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit High School is now fully operational with all four grade levels serving about 530 students.

The school operates in a seven story building at 222 Piedmont Avenue which was donated and is totally free of debt.

The school is one of 32 Cristo Rey schools across 21 states and DC that make up the largest network of high schools in the country that exclusively serve low-income students.

The students pay off their tuition of by interning at corporations who have volunteered to hire them.


Very Successful 2018 Fish Fry Wraps Up

March Parish Bingo— Over 100 again!



We recorded 105 players on March 22nd. This was a slight decrease from our 130 February crowd, but welcome. Our Bingo sales were \$1,840, our Bingo prizes were \$915 plus three door prizes, yielding Bingo gross proceeds of \$925. We also received \$195 from food donations, \$161 from drink donations, and \$180 from the 50/50 raffle sale. Cost of food and drink, 7% sales tax, state license fee, Crier ad cost, and cost of supplies are still to be deducted. Also, 50 players brought their Dunwoody Crier coupon ads in for free additional playing sheets. Two Knight widows were in attendance. These are excellent continuing results.



Brother Al Alberghini's Close Call

Good Samaritans

To the Editor:

After a particularly frightening event, we spent a long week at Emory St. Joseph Hospital. We're now home and have many people we would like to thank and acknowledge for that.

A week ago while dining with friends at Carbonara Trattoria, my husband, Al, suffered two incidences of syncope, which presented like a major diabetic event and he passed out twice. Owner Rafik Cressaty and his staff never missed a beat, with the bartender immediately supplying us with orange juice – the usual quick low-sugar solution.

Fortunately for us, there were medical personnel dining there as well who immediately came to our assistance. "Dr. Steve" was the first to get to us and jumped right in to stabilize the situation, leaving his own table to remain with us throughout. A nurse also left her party to assist us. We apologize for not remembering

her name in the excitement, and hope she sees this letter and knows how grateful we are to her.

After efforts to get Al back on his feet failed, these angels called 911. DeKalb Fire Department arrived first and began emergency efforts. Shortly afterwards, DeKalb EMT's arrived and transferred him to the hospital.

The staff at Emory St. Joseph ER, efficiently and professionally assessed the situation and administered the proper cardiac treatment measures. It was decided that Dr. Anshul Patel would replace Al's pacemaker with one that also contains a defibrillator. He's now getting his legs under him again and has experienced only mild discomfort.

We are proud and grateful that we have the best services and people living and working in Dunwoody on behalf of all of us. While we hope never to face another such incident, we know that we will be in the best of hands.




