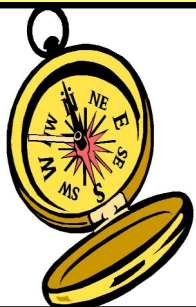

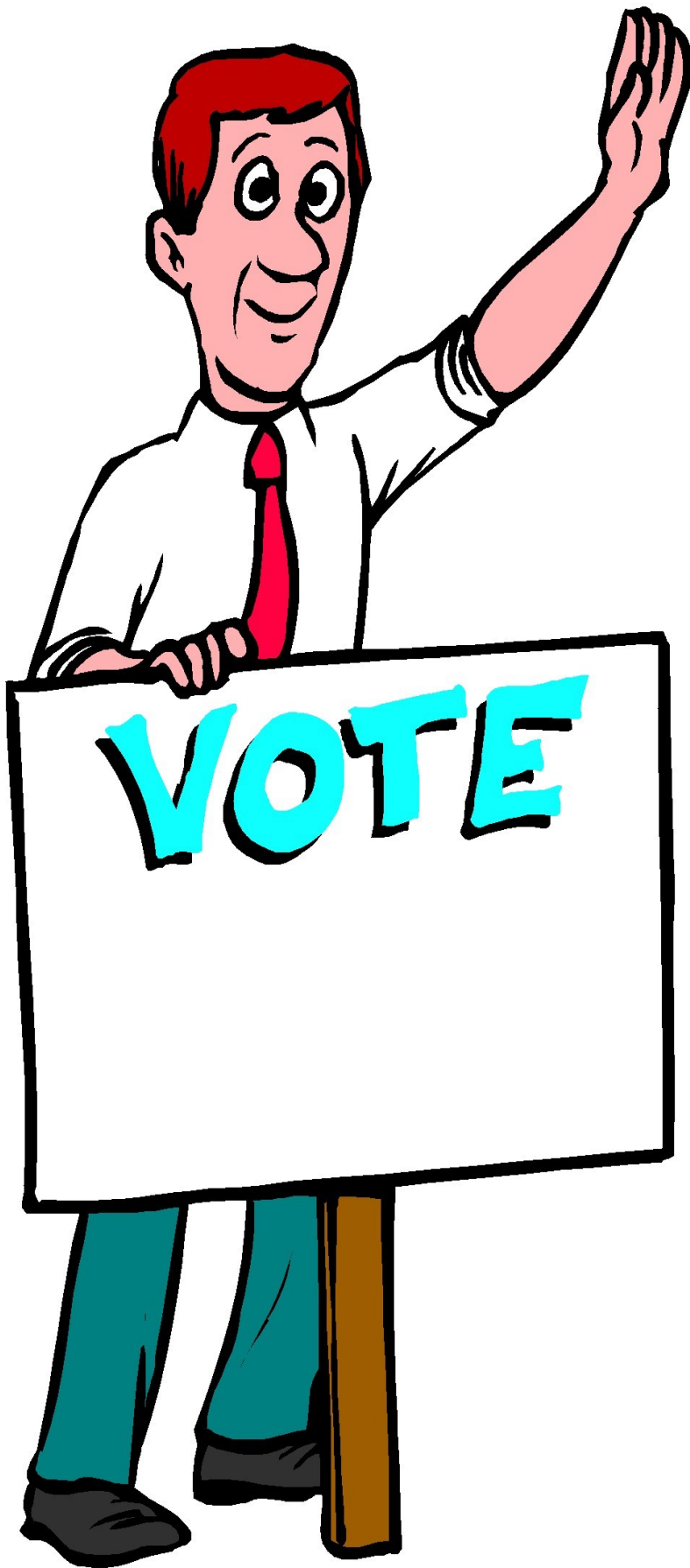

Consul General Stephens assumed his post in Atlanta in July 2015 as the second Irish Consul General for the US Southeastern region, responsible for Georgia, Alabama, Florida, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee. Since joining Ireland's Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade in 2001, Mr. Stephens has served at Ireland's Embassies to Tanzania, the Holy See, the European Union, Nigeria and Malaysia. Immediately prior to his current post, while working as Assistant Chief of Protocol for the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade in Dublin, he was responsible for arranging many of President Michael D. Higgins' visits abroad and incoming Presidential visits to Ireland.



Consul General Stephens received his BA in History from Trinity College Dublin, and holds an MSc in Political Economy of Transition in Europe from the London School of Economics. He hails from Dublin and is married with four children.

James William “Bill” O’Brien Passes

AUGUST 20, 1930 - APRIL 2, 2018 (AGE 87)

O'BRIEN, James William (Bill) passed away on April 2, 2018, in Fairfield, Ohio.

He was born Aug. 20, 1930, to Thomas Daniel and Mayme Lockhart O'Brien in St. Louis, Mo. His family moved to a farm in Shelbyville, Mo., when he was a small child. It was here that he met the love of his life and married his high school sweetheart, Betty Maxine Fry, on Dec. 25, 1949. She survives him.

He is the loving father of George (Mary) O'Brien, Diane (Rick) Shaffer, Lesa (Rick) Kathman, and Linda (Antonio) del Valle; grandfather of Peggy O'Brien, Michael (April) O'Brien, Katie (Corey) Fagin, Matthew England, Sarah (Jeremy Daniels), Anna Kathman, Vanessa (Matt) Kiepora, Adriana (John) Hummel and Isaac del Valle; great grandfather of MacKenzie, Madelyn, Tyler and Lucas O'Brien, Connor, Cohen and Kinley Fagin, Paisley and Matthew James Daniels, Elena Kiepora and baby Hummel and step-grandchildren Aiden and Henry Daniels and Alex and Troy Kathman.

He will be greatly missed by his children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren as well as many nieces and nephews and a host of other family members and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his brother Thomas Daniel and his grandson Matthew England.

Our father loved music, basketball, golf, dancing and people. His brother, Tom, taught him to twirl and while in high school he won the 1945, 46, 47 and 48 regional and state champion twirling competitions (he was always twirling the broom sticks at home). He was also captain of his 1947 football team and his 1947 and 48 basketball team. He loved refereeing football and basketball and coached elementary basketball for 9 years in Quincy, Bloomington and Peoria, Ill.

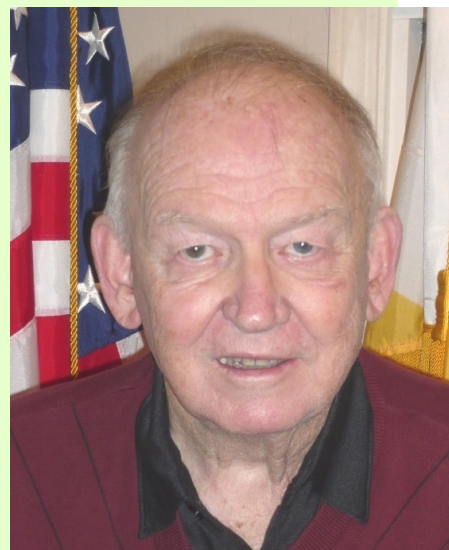
He sang in the church choirs in all the cities he lived and was a member of the Knights of Columbus and a lifetime member of the Elks. He traveled extensively with his career and kept a log of all the churches he attended and golf courses he played. He taught himself to play piano and loved to sing and play at gatherings in their home. He and his wife loved dancing together and also enjoyed clogging in the Atlanta area.

He went to work for Combined Insurance Co. of America in June of 1950 making sales calls across 19 counties of northeast Missouri - he did not own a car -- but was innovative and successful. From 1956 to 1981 he went to work for Western Adjustment and Inspection Co. (GAB) living in Hannibal, Mo., Quincy, Bloomington, Peoria Ill., Cincinnati, Oh., and eventually settling in Atlanta, Ga. In 1984 he joined AIG Aviation as Executive VP and was promoted to President of the Claims group. He was head of the worldwide Aviation Arbitration Board for several years and stayed with AIG until his retirement in 1997. During his retirement he wrote a book of anecdotal stories about his 47-year career of settling insurance claims titled T'aint Covered.

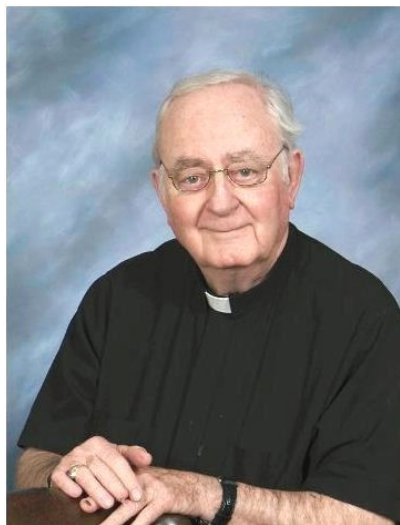

Fr. Daniel Joseph McCormick

ATLANTA—Father Daniel J. McCormick, 90, the first priest ordained for the Archdiocese of Atlanta, died Thursday, April 19. The son of Daniel and Mary Ursula McCormick, he was born Dec. 2, 1927, in Lynbrook, New York. Following high school in Malverne, New York, he served in the U.S. Navy from 1946 to 1948 on a destroyer and in the submarine service. He attended St. Joseph's College in Philadelphia from 1948 to 1950 before transferring to St. Philip Neri in Boston, a school that specialized in accelerated Latin. In preparation for ministry in the Savannah-Atlanta Diocese, he attended St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, Maryland, finishing his studies in philosophy in May 1957. In July 1956, the Diocese of Atlanta was established, and Father McCormick was the first priest ordained by Bishop Francis E. Hyland for the new diocese on June 1, 1957. Upon arrival in Atlanta, he was temporarily assigned to St. Thomas More Church, Decatur, and assisted at St. John Chrysostom Melkite Church, Atlanta.

His first permanent assignment was at St. Anthony of Padua Church, Atlanta. He taught religion at St. Joseph High School in downtown Atlanta and worked with the children at the St. Joseph orphanage in Washington. He also studied sociology at Fordham University, New York, in the early 1960s and briefly served as assistant director of Catholic Charities in Atlanta in 1963. Father McCormick served as pastor and parochial vicar at many parishes, including St. Patrick Church, Norcross; St. Bernadette Church, Cedartown; St. Lawrence Church, Lawrenceville; St. Mary Church, Rome; St. John Neumann Church, Lilburn; and Holy Trinity Church, Peachtree City.

He also spent over two years with the monks at Holy Spirit Monastery in Conyers before returning to active service as an Atlanta diocesan priest. He served in multiple other parish assignments and as chaplain to the Roswell police and to the Georgia Sheriffs' Association. He served as a parochial vicar at All Saints Church in Dunwoody for over two decades and also served as a chaplain at the Atlanta Veterans Hospital. Father McCormick retired in 2013 and resided at All Saints Church until his death. He was involved for many years in marriage preparation, including setting up a program for pre-marriage preparation, and in the Catholic Family Movement. Beginning in 1994 he served in the Province of Atlanta Court of Appeals where he was defender of the bond. He served as Vicar for Clergy of the Atlanta Archdiocese. In 2007, Archbishop Wilton D. Gregory, having attended the 50th anniversary celebration for Father McCormick, talked about the pioneer priest in his Georgia Bulletin column. He said, "This first priest of the Archdiocese has endeared himself to countless thousands of people in this local Church over the years. ...

Father McCormick has endeavored to live out the promises that he made on June 1 in 1957 to be a priest in service to the people of God in the Archdiocese of Atlanta." Father McCormick, in reflections he wrote in 2007 for his jubilee, said, "My life, if it has any distinction, does so because of the many and varied people it has been my privilege to know. Life has been something like a magnificent bouquet of many flowers, all of which were gifts at some important time for me. ... I am a grateful priest, transformed into something of Christ. Transformed, 'in persona Christi,' that I might give you the love He has given me through you." A vigil and rosary for Father McCormick will be held at 7 p.m. on Thursday, April 26, at All Saints Church, 2443 Mt. Vernon Road, Dunwoody.

The funeral Mass was celebrated on Friday, April 27, at 10:30 a.m. at All Saints Church. Interment¹⁴ follow immediately at Arlington Memorial Park, 201 Mt. Vernon Highway NW, Sandy Springs. 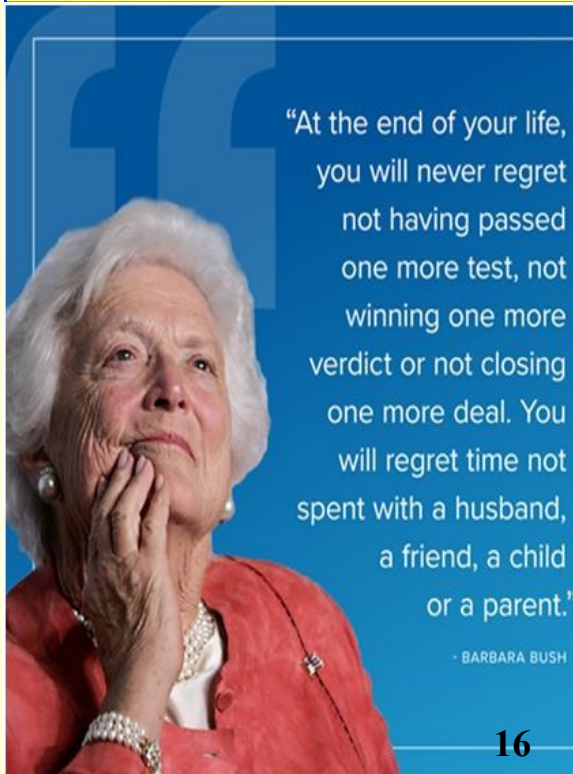

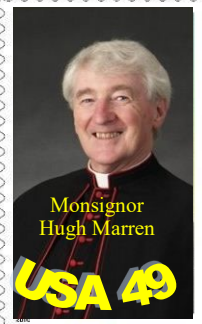
