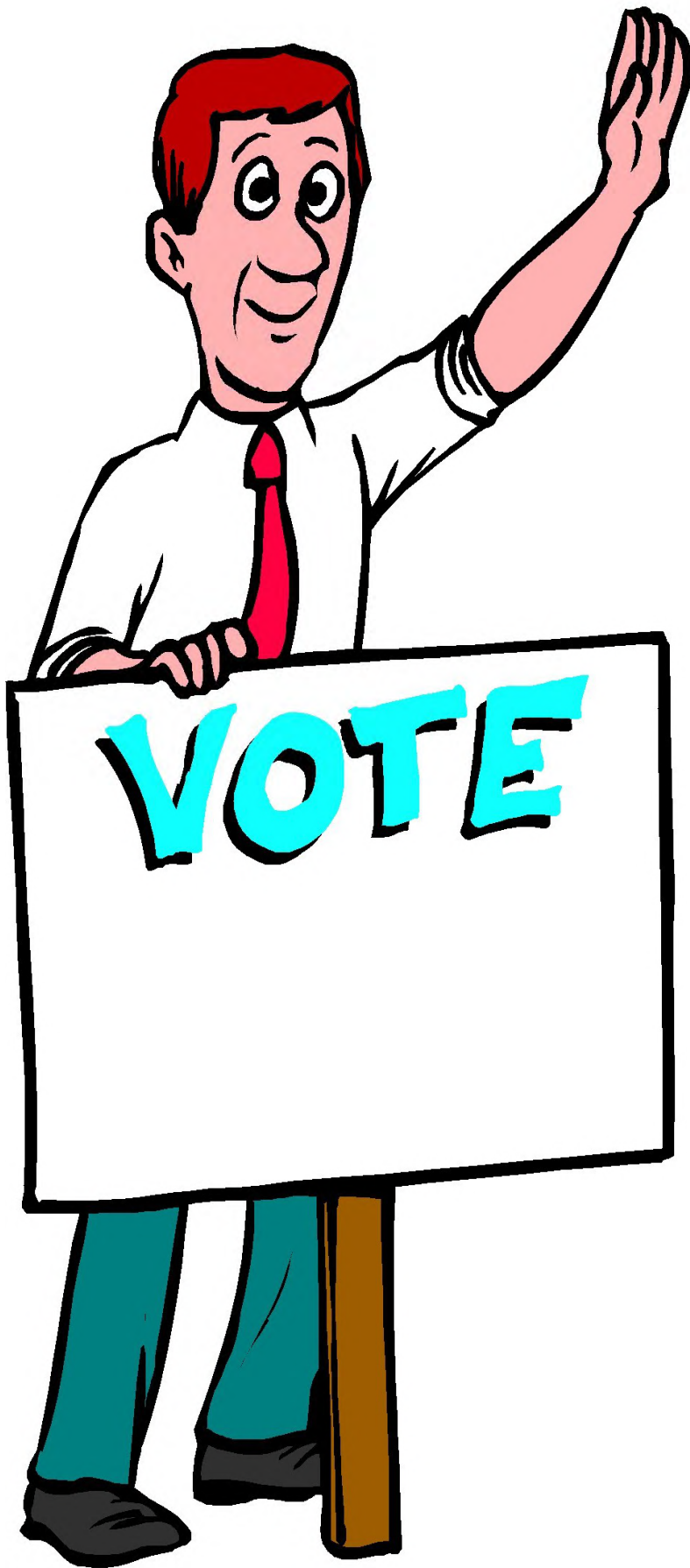

We added seven new members to the Order on May 28th at McGivney Hall. The five shown joined All Saints, one joined Mary Our Queen, and one joined the downtown Sacred Heart Basilica Council.

Three of the five new All Saints Brothers shown here are members of St. Joseph Maronite Rite Catholic Church at the corner of Glenridge and Hammond Drive. May Parish Bingo— Rolling Again



We recorded 132 players on May 24th. This was a large increase from our last Bingo crowd and welcome. Our Bingo sales were \$1,996, our Bingo prizes were \$915 plus three door prizes, yielding Bingo gross proceeds of \$1,081. We also received \$271 from food donations, \$199 from drink donations, and \$200 from the 50/50 raffle sale. Cost of food and drink, 7% sales tax, state license fee, Crier ad cost, and cost of supplies are still to be deducted. Also, 50 players brought their Dunwoody Crier coupon ads in for free additional playing sheets. Two Knight widows were in attendance. These are excellent continuing results.

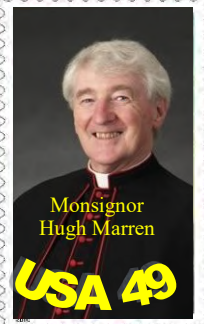
