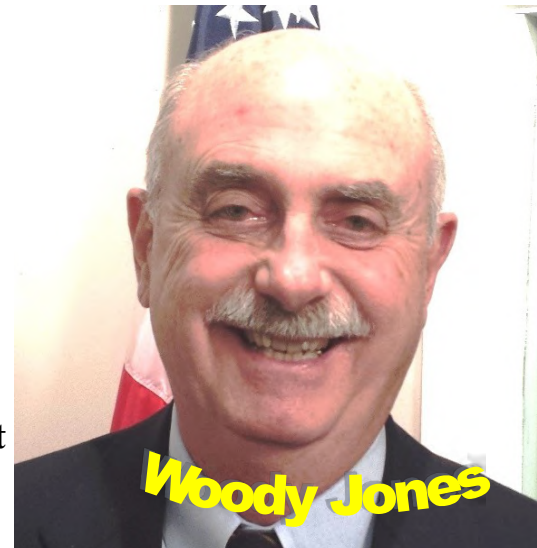

2018 Dues are Now Due (that's why they call them "Dues")

Our council kc11402.org web site handles electronic payment of council dues. You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You, of course, must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does.. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. There is a new second line choice that allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your normal 2018 annual dues of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "**KofC Council 11402**" to our Financial Secretary, Ralph O'Connor, at 390 17th St., NW, Unit 5069, Atlanta, GA 30363. His email is ralph390@comcast.net.

If a member is less than 26 years old on December 31, 2016, annual dues are only \$20. If you are a designated "Honorary" member (65 years old and a Knight for 25 consecutive years), your dues are only \$10. Priests, deacons, or members of a religious order pay no dues. Anyone who has been a Knight for 50 unbroken years likewise pays no dues. This year the Order has decided that Seminarians who join the Knights pay no dues as well.

These above rules are for Council 11402 dues only. Watters Assembly dues of \$30 are separate. We could not make it easier to pay your dues. Dues are assessed each January 1st. 2

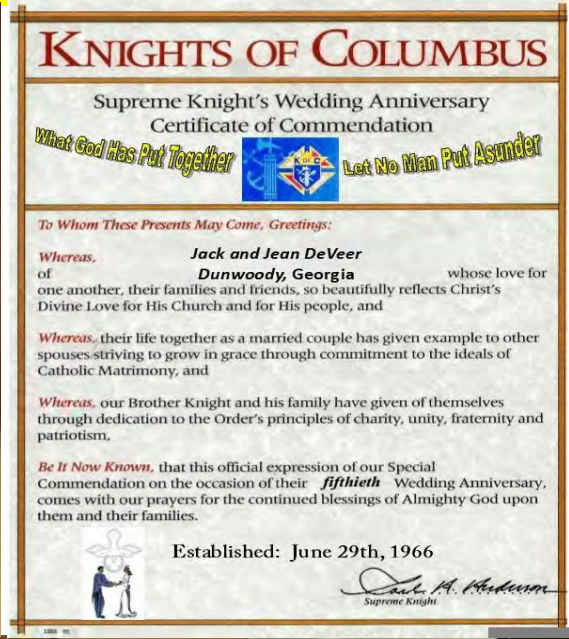
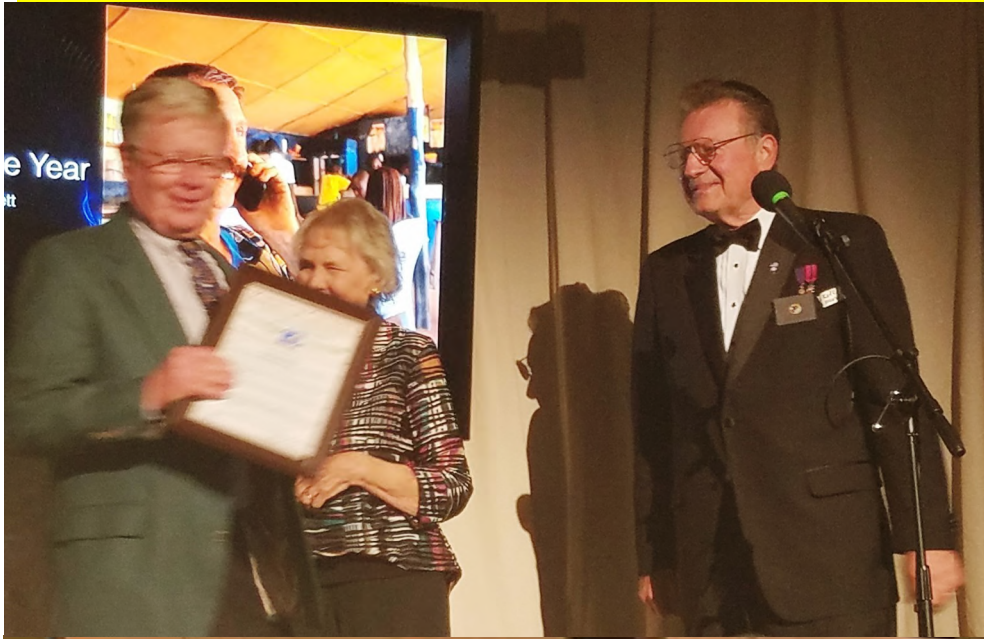
Bernie/Florence Marino Wed 60 Years!

Council Helps Establish Ghana Church

Our All Saints Council was instrumental in establishing the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Enchi, Ghana according to this article from the *Georgia Bulletin* Newspaper.

Council Sir Knights, Deacon Rick Medina, Father Anthony Eshun, Father Dan Rogaczewski, and Monsignor Hugh Marren teamed with the Dr. Billy Haynes Family to help fund the \$430,000 cost of the structure. Bishop Simon Assamoah, a frequent visitor to All Saints Parish from Ghana, was also a crucial player in the project as bishop of the diocese.

The parish took up a Sunday collection to help fund the building.

Georgia Catholics help rural Ghanaian village to build church

DUNWOODY—Deacon Rick Medina, who serves at All Saints Church, Dunwoody, and as executive director of Catholic World Mission, made a summer trip to Enchi, Ghana.

Father Dan Rogaczewski, parochial vicar at All Saints Church, and the Haynes family—Dr. Billy Haynes, his wife, Laura, and their son Zach—traveled with Deacon Medina for the dedication of the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Enchi in late June. Catholic World Mission helped fund the construction of the church along with other projects.

Father Rogaczewski represented the All Saints community, a major

contributor to the project. The Haynes family represented the Ghana Friendship Project group, a nonprofit based in Georgia, which spearheaded the funding of the church. The group flew to New York, from there took a 10-hour flight to Accra, the capital of Ghana, and then experienced a difficult, 13-hour drive to Enchi.

Construction of a church, which cost \$430,000 in U.S. dollars, would have been an impossible feat for the people of the rural Ghanaian village, but they believed in a miracle.

Enchi's parish priest, Msgr. Simon Assamoah, assisted by Msgr. Hugh Marren, pastor of the Dunwoody

church, began working with benefactors to see the project to completion.

"I have learned and experienced many miracles in life with my many travels to the poorest communities around the world," said Deacon Medina. "Miracles start where reason stops and faith takes over. Miracles happen when people have the right attitude especially when the going gets tough, when answered prayers seem delayed, when things look

impossible."

Watters Org Honors Heritage Girls

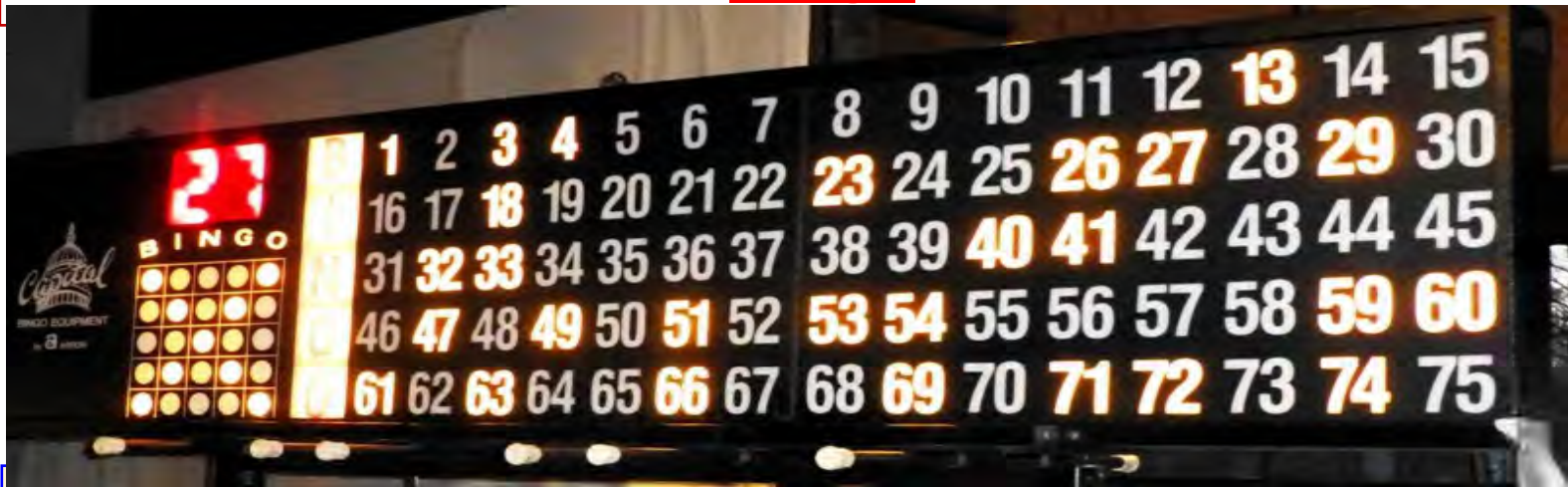
