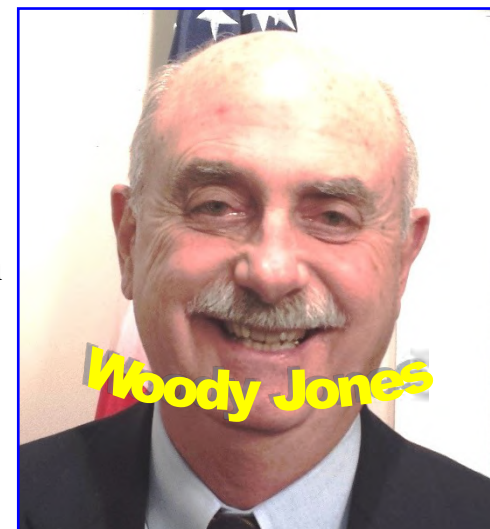

## 2018 Dues are Now Due (that's why they call them "Dues")

Our council [kc11402.org](http://kc11402.org) web site handles electronic payment of council dues. You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You, of course, must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does.. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. There is a new second line choice that allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your normal 2018 annual dues of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "**KofC Council 11402**" to our Financial Secretary, Ralph O'Connor, at 390 17th St., NW, Unit 5069, Atlanta, GA 30363. His email is [ralph390@comcast.net](mailto:ralph390@comcast.net).

If a member is less than 26 years old on December 31, 2016, annual dues are only \$20. If you are a designated "Honorary" member (65 years old and a Knight for 25 consecutive years), your dues are only \$10. Priests, deacons, or members of a religious order pay no dues. Anyone who has been a Knight for 50 unbroken years likewise pays no dues. This year the Order has decided that Seminarians who join the Knights pay no dues as well.

These above rules are for Council 11402 dues only. Watters Assembly dues of \$30 are separate. We could not make it easier to pay your dues. Dues are assessed each January 1st.

# ONLINE Membership Push

Supreme is strongly pushing ONLINE membership as a quick doorway into KofC membership for reluctant joiners. Any practicing Catholic male who is interested in joining the Knights, but never pulled the trigger, can join online and then move at his own speed to council membership via 1st degree exemplification later.

An online member is a full member getting all magazines, electronic info, and a membership card, but not assigned to a council. Online membership is \$30. He can come to meetings if he chooses, but not vote. He can purchase KofC insurance. His info is sent to a local council for follow-up. If and when he decides to join a council, he is fully vetted, goes through a 1st degree, and his online membership data and initiation fees are forwarded to his council of choice. This process makes it easy for reluctant joiners to ease into council membership as time and schedule permits.

Millions of men are interested in the KofC, but feel they don't have the time to become active council members because of travel or family concerns. Tell your reluctant friends that these excuses have just disappeared.

# Deacon Bill Garrett to Retire

ATLANTA—Debra Orr, who started [Notre Dame Academy, Duluth](#), and Deacon Bill Garrett, who helped [Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit High School](#) get off the ground, both will be leaving their positions.

Orr, the head of school, will step down at the end of the school year as members of the first graduating class of Notre Dame High School receive their diploma. Deacon Garrett, the school president, plans a gradual move toward retirement, with an exit date of 2020.

Both schools are independent Catholic schools, outside of the [Archdiocese of Atlanta school system](#).

Deacon Garrett started as the public face of Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit High School in 2013. He spoke at scores of Atlanta parishes to recruit students, and businesses leaders to sponsor students, in the unique work study program. He helped oversee the construction of the first Catholic school in downtown Atlanta in nearly 50 years. The campus is now home to some 535 students.

“While I look forward to the next chapter in my life, my heart will always be with Cristo Rey,” he said in his resignation letter. “Forever I will be a champion of the students, faculty, staff and school.”

Cristo Rey school leaders are recruiting for a new president.

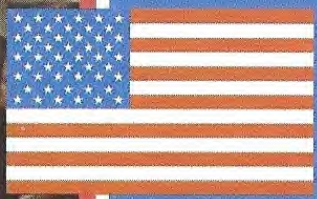
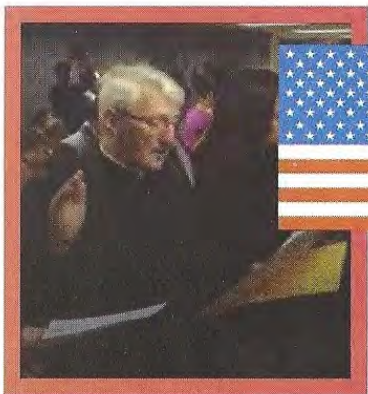
# Council Supports Parish CRHP

## All Saints' famous Fish Fry to kick off

Dunwoody is not only home to the state's largest 4th of July parade, but its largest fish fry, and the Knights of Columbus at All Saints Catholic Church expect to serve a record number of meals during the 2019 Lenten season, which begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6.

"Last year we averaged more than 1,100 meals a night and this year we're anticipating that number to be even larger," said Knights' fish fry coordinator Tom Simon, affectionately known as the Big Fish. "It's a great meal at a great price among great friends."

Simon said when the Knights started its fish fry more than 20 years ago, the church's parishioners made up 95 percent of its diners. That's no longer the case.

"We are truly a community

event," Simon said. "We estimate more than 50 percent of our diners are non-Catholics. We have regular groups that join us from St. Luke's, Dunwoody United Methodist and Temple Emanu-EL. You don't have to be a Catholic or a Christian or even religious to enjoy our great atmosphere. We are extremely family friendly."

The fish fry menu includes entrees of broiled salmon, fried

shrimp and broiled or fried cod with sides of French fries, roasted potatoes, green beans, rice and hush puppies. A new twist this year is turning any entrée into fish tacos. Historically, the most popular item on the menu is the made-from-scratch New England clam chowder,

of which the Knights say the recipe is a tightly-guarded secret. "Don't ask because we won't tell," Simon chuckled.

Prices range from \$5 for kids meals to \$10 for fresh salmon. The first fish fry is from 5pm-8pm on Wednesday, March 6 and continues every Friday night through April 19 at the All Saints gymnasium. All proceeds benefit Knights of Columbus charities.

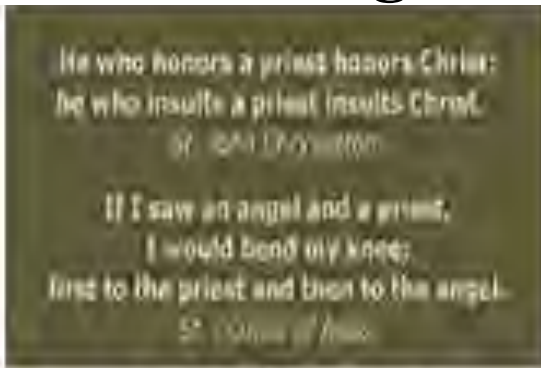
