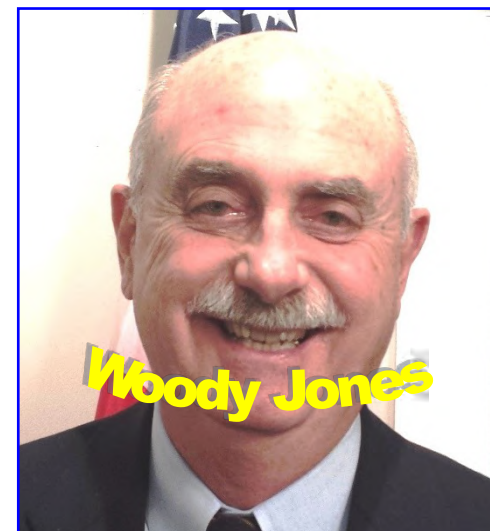

Monthly April Pro-Life Adoration is not scheduled this month, so we can celebrate Easter Sunday. We will continue next month.

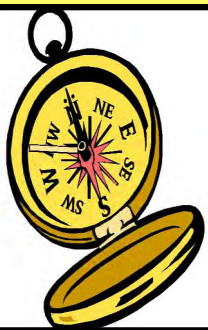
Fathers for Good Seminars meet the 1st and 3rd Sundays each month. Please meet in the Parish Library at 7:00 AM.

Fish Frys at 5/8th Point

Five fish fries behind us and three left to go. Following are the stats for the last two weeks. BJ compiled them later than normal due to travel each of the last 2 weekends, postponing their publication. The data from two weeks ago came out just before last Friday's fish fry, and I didn't get it sent out before we assembled that day.

3rd public Friday, March 22 - 1201 total meals - 4838 YTD vs. 4815 in 2016 & 4809 in 2017

Data on the number of taco packets sold the last two weeks is extremely low, but the kitchen reports significantly higher volume than the meal tickets report. No one seems to know exactly what is going on with this item. Maybe there will be some clarification this coming Friday.

All-time records - 8779 in 2016 & 8572 in 2017; single largest night - 1462 in 2017

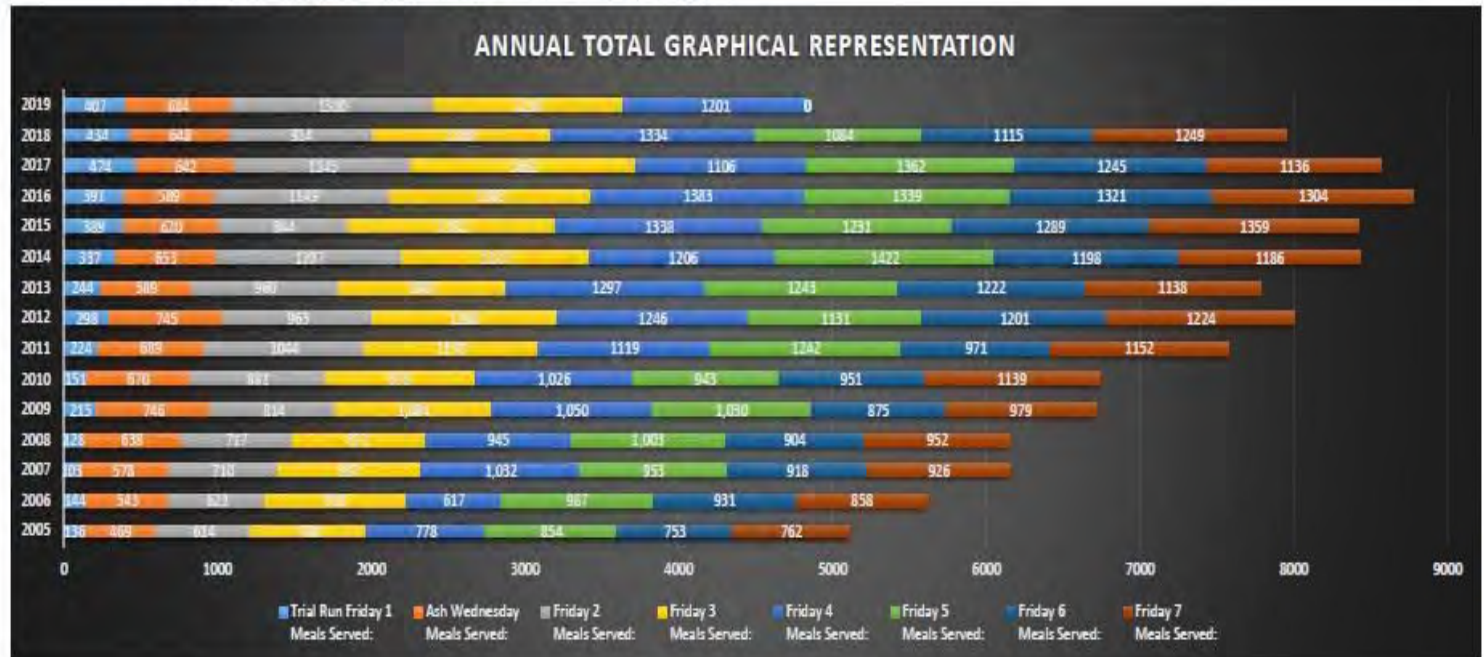
To break our all-time record, we would need to average 1314 meals each of the last three Friday nights, which is doubtful, given that many schools are on spring break the first week in April.

However, we are 338 meals ahead of this time last year. We need to average only 1037 each of the next three weeks to top last year's disappointing total of 7948 meals served. Since only two Friday nights in the last five years have been below this level, odds are high we can top the results from 2018.

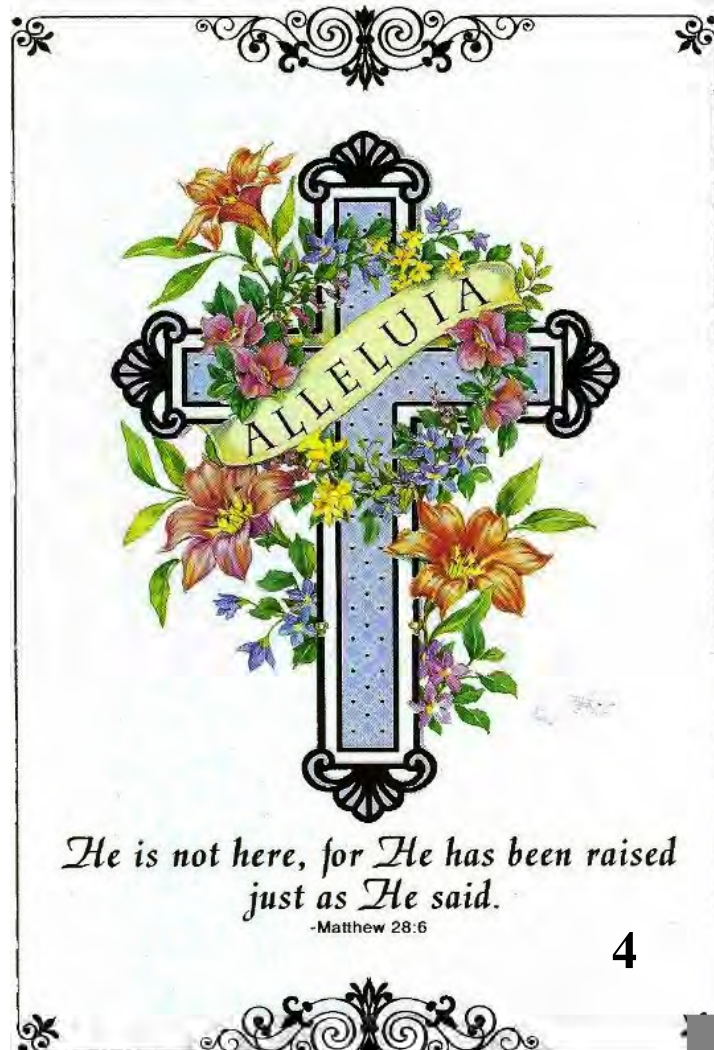

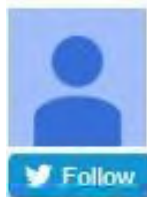

Archbishop Wilton Gregory of Atlanta. CNA file photo.

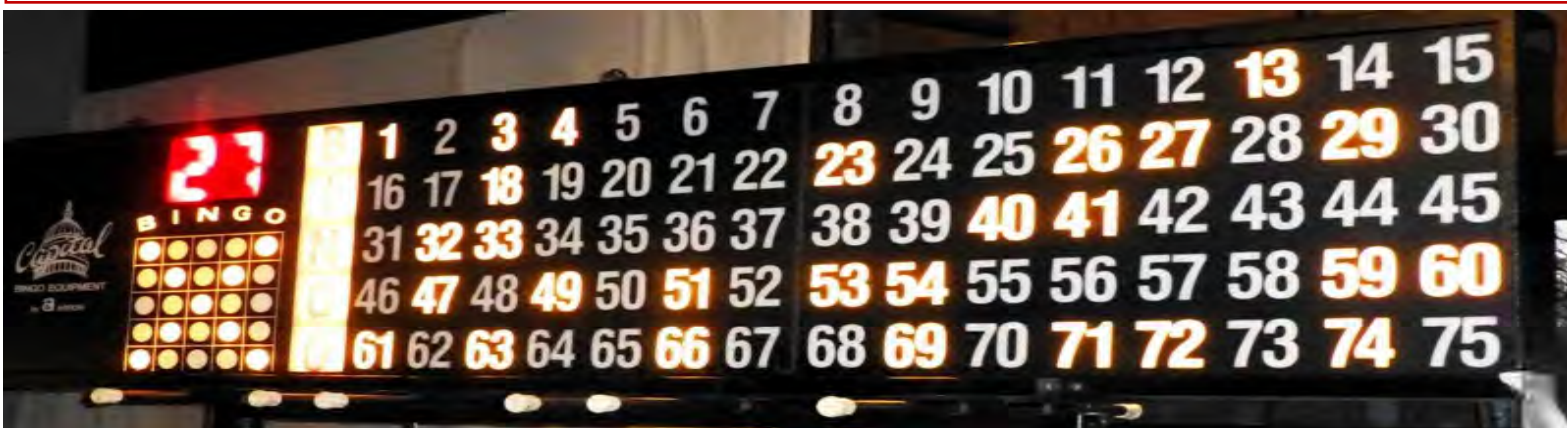

Washington D.C., Mar 28, 2019 / 01:29 pm (CNA).- Pope Francis is expected to appoint Archbishop Wilton Gregory of Atlanta to serve as the next Archbishop of Washington, multiple sources have independently reported to CNA. Gregory would become the seventh Archbishop of Washington, succeeding Cardinal Donald Wuerl.

A formal announcement could come as early as next week, sources say, though it has not yet been confirmed that the archbishop has accepted the appointment. Sources in Rome and the United States told CNA that Gregory was informed of the appointment earlier this week.

2018 Dues are Now Due (that's why they call them "Dues")

Our council kc11402.org web site handles electronic payment of council dues. You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You, of course, must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does.. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. There is a new second line choice that allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your normal 2018 annual dues of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "[KofC Council 11402](#)" to our Financial Secretary, Ralph O'Connor, at 390 17th St., NW, Unit 5069, Atlanta, GA 30363. His email is ralph390@comcast.net.

If a member is less than 26 years old on December 31, 2016, annual dues are only \$20. If you are a designated "Honorary" member (65 years old and a Knight for 25 consecutive years), your dues are only \$10. Priests, deacons, or members of a religious order pay no dues. Anyone who has been a Knight for 50 unbroken years likewise pays no dues. This year the Order has decided that Seminarians who join the Knights pay no dues as well.

These above rules are for Council 11402 dues only. Watters Assembly dues of \$30 are separate. We could not make it easier to pay your dues. Dues are assessed each January 1st.

ONLINE Membership Push

Supreme is strongly pushing ONLINE membership as a quick doorway into KofC membership for reluctant joiners. Any practicing Catholic male who is interested in joining the Knights, but never pulled the trigger, can join online and then move at his own speed to council membership via 1st degree exemplification later.

An online member is a full member getting all magazines, electronic info, and a membership card, but not assigned to a council. Online membership is \$30. He can come to meetings if he chooses, but not vote. He can purchase KofC insurance. His info is sent to a local council for follow-up. If and when he decides to join a council, he is fully vetted, goes through a 1st degree, and his online membership data and initiation fees are forwarded to his council of choice. This process makes it easy for reluctant joiners to ease into council membership as time and schedule permits.

Millions of men are interested in the KofC, but feel they don't have the time to become active council members because of travel or family concerns. Tell your reluctant friends that these excuses have just disappeared.

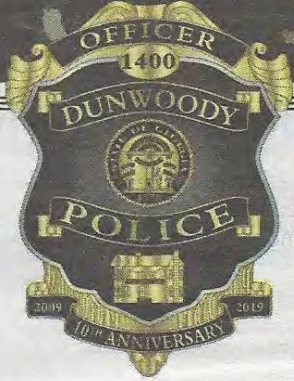

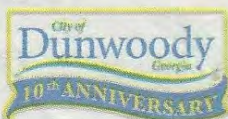

A breakdown of increased crime in Dunwoody last year

2,137 serious crimes include homicide, rape and assault.

In its annual crime report for 2018, the Dunwoody Police Department reported that while overall crime rose only slightly for the year and consisted of mostly property crimes, the category of violent crimes against people rose significantly, led by an increase in armed robberies.

According to the Dunwoody Police Department's annual report, released Tuesday, officers responded to 2,137 serious crimes, including homicide, rape and aggravated assault and property crimes such as burglary and larceny. That's about a 2 percent increase from 2017, though most of the increases stemmed from violent crimes, according to the report.

Violent crimes against people, which includes murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assaults, rose to 78 in 2018,

a 30 percent increase over 2017. Included in that category, there was a 56.5 percent increase in armed robberies, from 23 cases in 2017 to 36 in 2018, and the number of reported rapes more than doubled, from four to nine. There were two homicides in the city last year, up from one in 2017.

"Reducing crime is a major focus of our crime fighting efforts in 2019," Chief Billy Grogan wrote in the report.

The top property crime was larceny, with more than 1,800 incidents reported last year.

Officers made 2,004 arrests in 2018, an 11.5 percent decrease from 2017. The top offenses that resulted in arrests were shoplifting, failure to appear in court and drug offenses, according to the report. About 86 percent of the people they arrested were not Dunwoody residents. And don't forget about traffic citations – the top violations were speeding, following too close and having an expired tag.

Some other interesting stats from the 2018 report:

Officers responded to 59,506 calls for police service, almost 3,000 of which stemmed from alarms. Officers filed more than 5,300 incident reports and gave out more than 7,900 citations.

The police department also responded to 19 overdoses, three of which were fatal.

The department said there were 105 use-of-force incidents, though there were no excessive force complaints. "Use of force" is defined as the display of a firearm or Taser in a confrontational manner, the deployment of a firearm or Taser, physical force beyond soft hand contact, and the destruction of a rabid or seriously injured animal.

Eleven complaints were filed last year against 13 officers, three of which were sustained after internal reviews.

"Both of these stats reflect our commitment to excellence and fair and impartial policing," Grogan wrote.

Dunwoody, located in the northern tip of DeKalb County, has a population of nearly 50,000; its police department was founded almost exactly 10 years ago.

The impact of seeing ones doctor/medical team on a regular basis cannot be over-emphasized. Healthy seniors can then function and contribute their useful community involvement, all because they can get to their regular doctor/medical team appointments.

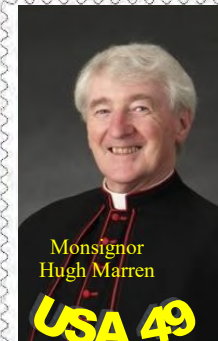
