
I am reaching out to Brother Knights who have not paid their annual DUES. This is the responsibility of a Knight. If your dues are not paid, the Council must pay

2018 Dues are Now Due (that's why they call them "Dues")

Our council <u>kc11402.org</u> web site handles electronic payment of council dues. You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You, of course, must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. There is a new second line choice that allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your normal 2018 annual dues of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "KofC Council 11402" to our Financial Secretary, Dan McDonough at 6230 Blackberry Hill, Peachtree Corners, GA 30092. His email is dmcd88@bellsouth.net.

If a member is less than 26 years old on December 31, 2018, annual dues are only \$20. If you are a designated "Honorary" member (65 years old and a Knight for 25 consecutive years), your dues are only \$10. Priests, deacons, or members of a religious order pay no dues. Anyone who has been a Knight for 50 unbroken years likewise pays no dues. This year the Order has decided that Seminarians who join the Knights pay no dues as well.

These above rules are for Council 11402 dues only. Watters 4th Degree Assembly dues of \$30 are separate. We could not make it easier to pay your dues. Dues are assessed each January 1st.



The Assistance League of Atlanta (ALA) is a 501(C)(3) organization of 300 women who run a thrift shop called "Attic Treasures" on Broad Street in Chamblee.

All profits from their shop go to their several charities which amount to about one million dollars per year.

Their membership includes about a dozen of our council wives and widows plus many other women from All Saints Parish. Some of their members have knight husbands from other local councils as well.

Their members are faithful patrons of our fish frys and that includes many of their non-Catholic members.

We have donated to this organization in the past and welcome the close and beneficial relationship we have with them. Our signage on hole 18 was a very good public relations benefit at a minimal cost.

Their tournament featured 122 players and earned a profit of \$41,000 (a note to our officers).

Watters Assembly Baseball Outing



We are happy for the Tada family and wish them the best of luck. Ted has asked for our prayers for his son-in-law.







ONLINE Membership Push

Supreme is strongly pushing ONLINE membership as a quick doorway into KofC membership for reluctant joiners. Any practicing Catholic male who is interested in joining the Knights, but never pulled the trigger, can join <u>online</u> and then move at his own speed to council membership via 1st degree exemplification later.

An online member is a full member getting all magazines, electronic info, and a membership card, but not assigned to a council. Online membership is \$30. He can come to meetings if he chooses, but not vote. He can purchase KofC insurance. His info is sent to a local council for follow-up. If and when he decides to join a council, he is fully vetted, goes through a 1st degree, and his online membership data and initiation fees are forwarded to his council of choice. This process makes it easy for reluctant joiners to ease into council membership as time and schedule permits.

Millions of men are interested in the KofC, but feel they don't have the time to become active council members because of travel or family concerns. Tell your reluctant friends that these excuses have just disappeared.


