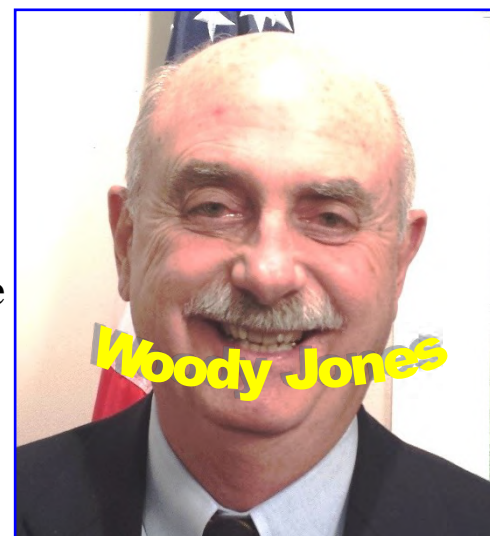

If you are no longer a practicing Catholic, please let us know. This automatically disqualifies you from membership. You must state this fact in writing.

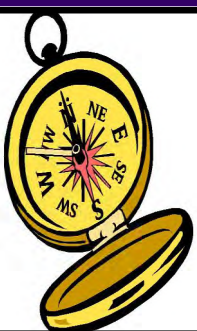

2018 Dues are Now Due (that's why they call them "Dues")

Our council kc11402.org web site handles electronic payment of council dues. You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You, of course, must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. There is a new second line choice that allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your normal 2018 annual dues of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "[KofC Council 11402](#)" to our Financial Secretary, Dan McDonough at 6230 Blackberry Hill, Peachtree Corners, GA 30092. His email is dmcd88@bellsouth.net.

If a member is less than 26 years old on December 31, 2018, annual dues are only \$20. If you are a designated "Honorary" member (65 years old and a Knight for 25 consecutive years), your dues are only \$10. Priests, deacons, or members of a religious order pay no dues. Anyone who has been a Knight for 50 unbroken years likewise pays no dues. This year the Order has decided that Seminarians who join the Knights pay no dues as well.

These above rules are for Council 11402 dues only. Watters 4th Degree Assembly dues of \$30 are separate. We could not make it easier to pay your dues. Dues are assessed each January 1st.

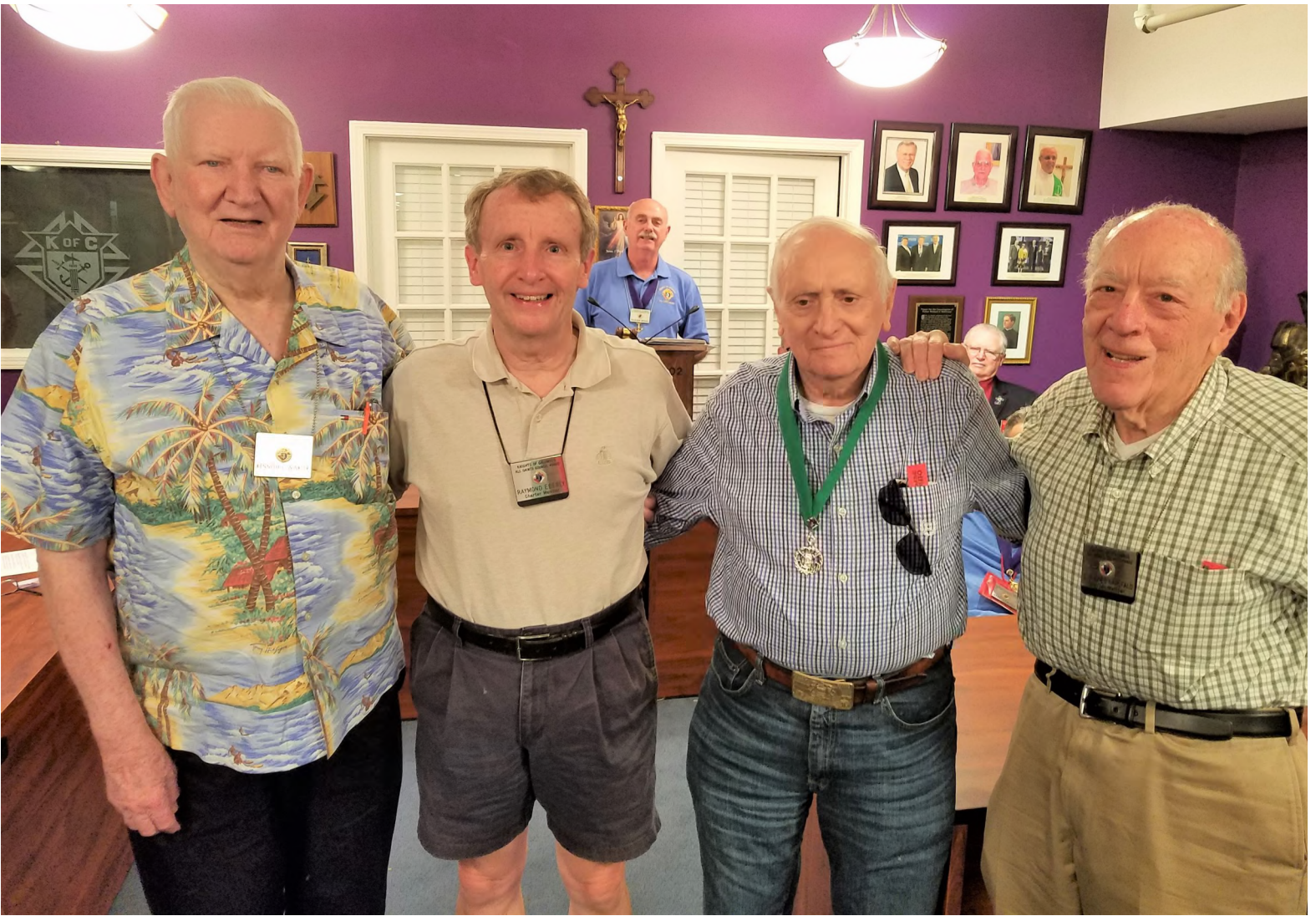


Our Council continues to be inundated by marriages of extraordinary length.

Creans donate to Dunwoody Nature Center

Our council widow, Marie Crean, (SK. Dennis Crean died 11/1/2015) has continued their lifelong support of charitable organizations (including the Knights) by contributing to the construction of this eco-friendly classroom to be built at the Dunwoody Nature Center. The council also does its part by supporting the annual Butterfly Festival there. This article was featured in a local Dunwoody magazine.

It will be named the Crean Eco-Classroom after our late brother. It is amazing how the goodness of our brothers even outlives them. We salute our widow, Marie Crean.

DNC constructs Eco-Classroom from recycled shipping containers

A new classroom at the Dunwoody Nature Center has an eco-friendly design in both its steel-reinforced structure and its green, plant-covered roof.

Though the building itself complements the design of the center's new cedar-planked North Woods Pavilion, its frame is made from a pair of old shipping containers.

"It's up-cycling at its best," said Executive Director Michael Cowan. "It's also a perfect use for the containers because the reinforced-steel frames will support the weight of the garden of native pollinator plants that will grow on the roof of the classroom."

The eco-classroom was paid in part through a FIPP grant from the City of Dunwoody and will be used for camps and programming, school field trips, Scout programs and other community events. As the center's current facility was once a private home built in 1946, its classrooms were once small bedrooms. The eco-classroom represents the first classroom designed specifically for teaching and is equipped with a modern white board.

The classroom will be named the Crean Eco-Classroom after the late Dennis Crean. Crean and his wife, Marie, have been long-time supporters of the DNC.

The roof will reduce heating and cooling costs via the insulation provided by the garden and will become relatively maintenance free once established.

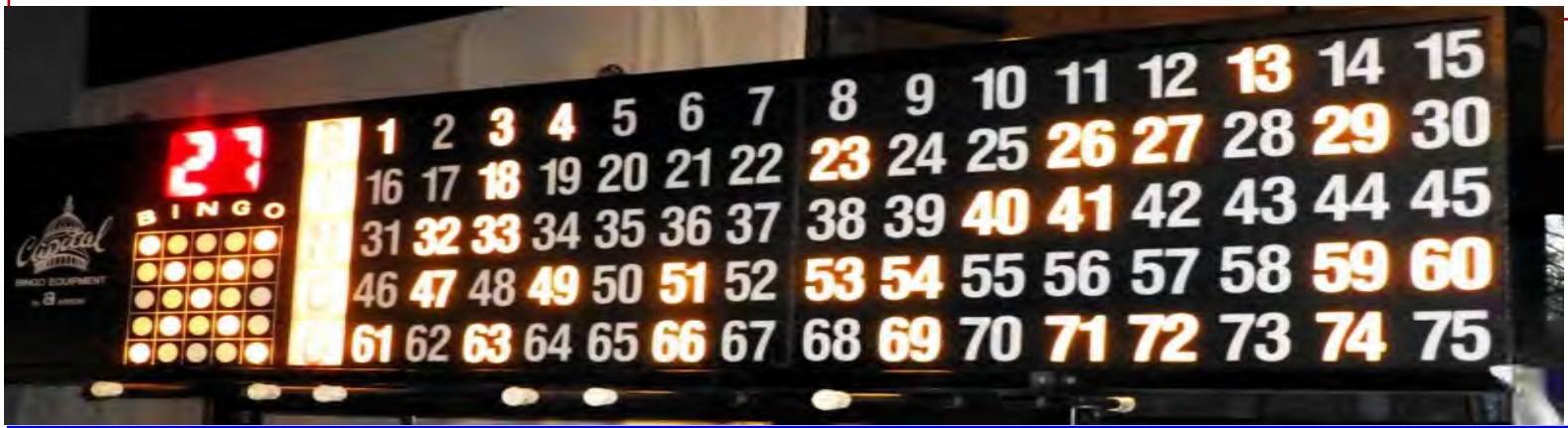
"The ecological design of the new eco-classroom creates the perfect location for learning about the environment," said Parks and Recreation Director Brent Walker. "The City of Dunwoody is happy to partner with the Dunwoody Nature Center to construct this unique amenity for the park and Dunwoody citizens."

What is a FIPP Grant?

Dunwoody's Facilities Improvement Partnership Program (FIPP) started in 2013 as a pilot program designed to provide a kickstart for enhancements and capital improvements of existing park buildings, facilities and grounds for the city's Parks and Recreation partners.

Its success was immediately apparent, and Dunwoody's Mayor and City Council allotted \$250,000 for the program each year through 2018.

JUNE Parish Bingo— excellent Night!!

Since the number of players was up significantly, the net profit over last month was quite notable. Thank you all for your contribution to our charities.

Churches can help widows solve practical problems

My thermostat was bumping itself up to 85 degrees each day, so I consulted the manual, but it was as confusing as an ancient Greek manuscript – and left me clueless. Then the sound system broke on my DVD player, so I ordered a new one, but didn't even open the box when it arrived, since the prospect of installing it was daunting. These are just a few examples of the practical problems widows wrangle

with on a daily basis. The batteries need changing in the smoke alarms, but some folks, like me, aren't keen on climbing ladders. There's an odd clanking sound in the car, but is it serious or not? Fortunately, fellows from the Knights of Columbus, a Catholic fraternal and charitable organization, have come to my rescue. These groups of laymen are stationed at many parishes in the Archdiocese of Atlanta and throughout the nation. The Knights of Columbus, which began in New Haven, Connecticut, in 1892, raise money nationally for disaster relief, food banks, ultrasound machines, persecuted Christians in the Middle East and orphaned

children in Uganda and Kenya, among other causes. It's not just about money, though, because the men routinely pray together and generously donate time to help others. For example, Knights who serve at St. Thomas More Catholic Church are renovating a building that will become a safe house for women who've been rescued from sex trafficking. The Knights historically have a special ministry to widows and orphans, so when I sent an email asking for help, a Knight cheerfully arrived at my house and worked on the thermostat and the sound system. The Bible has many passages about helping widows and orphans, such as

the words from St. James: "Religion that God our father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress." I'm guessing there are many widows nodding their heads and saying, "I need help too!" Sometimes it might be a simple task, like giving advice about whether to buy a new dishwasher or call a repairman, and when to get new tires. Does your church or synagogue have a team of men and women ready to help widows, starting with the initial shock of their husbands' deaths? Many churches mercifully provide emotional and spiritual support during that crucial time, but may then assume widows are doing just fine.

Still, along with the emotional difficulties of being alone, there are the niggling practical matters that were handled by the spouse. In my case, my late husband was the chief computer and car guy, household repairman, yard man and financial guru. I'm extremely grateful that friends and relatives helped me when the water heater broke, the windshield cracked, the faucet leaked and the printer died. They've also helped me haul my rambunctious tomcat to the vet's office and cleared underbrush threatening to overtake the backyard. People from the churches I attend – and my readers – have rallied with prayers, the most precious gift of all. I hope other churches

and synagogues have volunteers ready to tackle practical matters for widows. Certain tasks, of course, require professional help, like putting on a new roof, but often the job is small, and the joy of having it done is immense. "Blessed are they who mourn for they shall be comforted," Jesus told us, and he was quick to help the widows he met. In the Psalms, God is called a "father to the fatherless" and a "defender of widows." We are the hands of God in the world, and through our love and mercy, he tenderly embraces and comforts those who face life alone.

ONLINE Membership Push

Supreme is strongly pushing ONLINE membership as a quick doorway into KofC membership for reluctant joiners. Any practicing Catholic male who is interested in joining the Knights, but never pulled the trigger, can join online and then move at his own speed to council membership via 1st degree exemplification later.

An online member is a full member getting all magazines, electronic info, and a membership card, but not assigned to a council. Online membership is \$30. He can come to meetings if he chooses, but not vote. He can purchase KofC insurance. His info is sent to a local council for follow-up. If and when he decides to join a council, he is fully vetted, goes through a 1st degree, and his online membership data and initiation fees are forwarded to his council of choice. This process makes it easy for reluctant joiners to ease into council membership as time and schedule permits.

Millions of men are interested in the KofC, but feel they don't have the time to become active council members because of travel or family concerns. Tell your reluctant friends that these excuses have just disappeared.

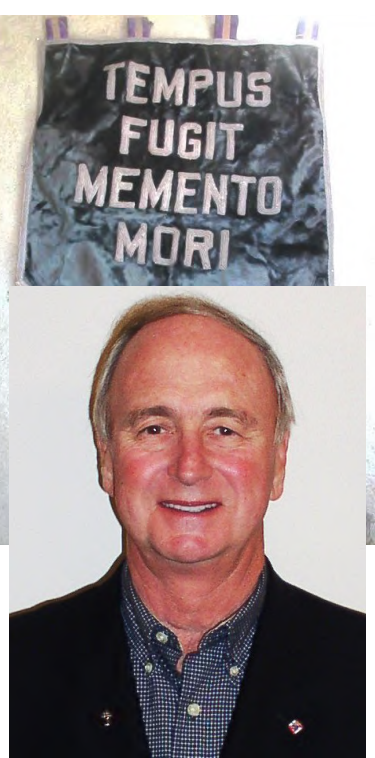
