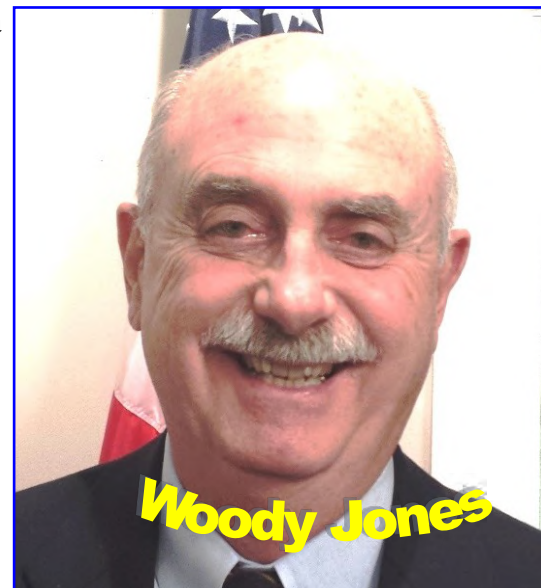

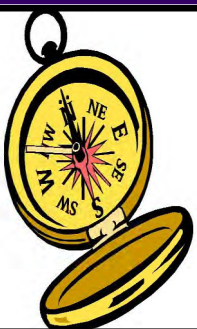

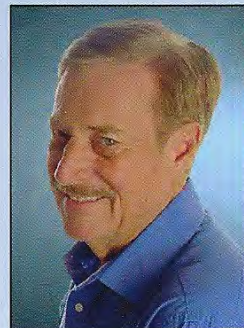

Afterwards, a great lunch featuring Lebanese food was served to the hungry workers. Pastor Father Tony gave a special blessing to all of us there.

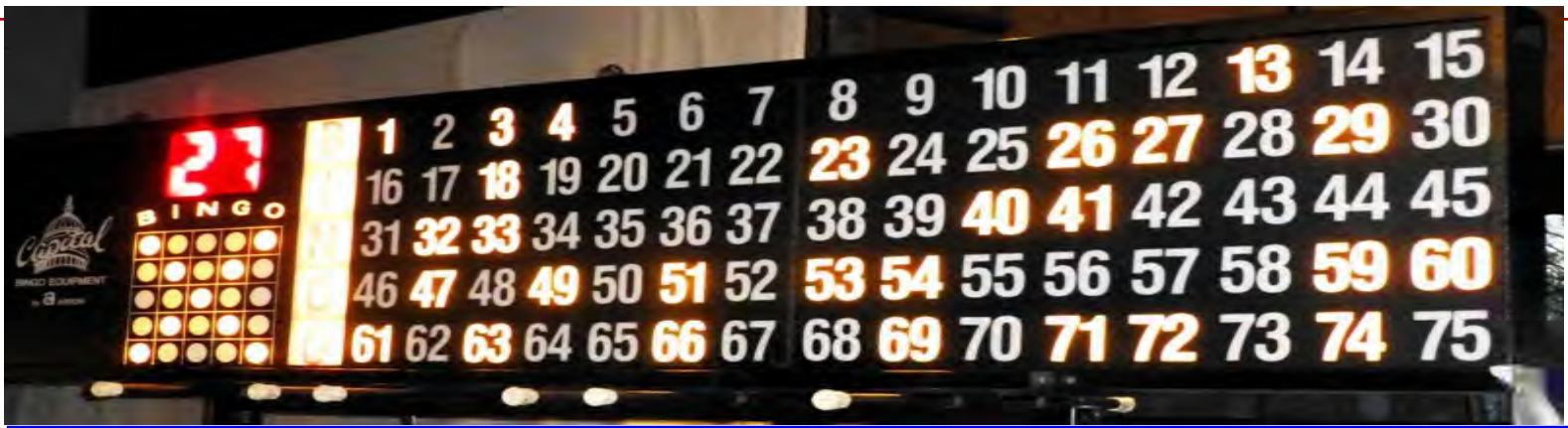

We had 113 players on November 14th. Ten more than last month. We took in \$1,695 and paid out \$900 in prizes. We also took in \$201 in food donations, \$26 for popcorn, \$320 for beverages, and \$162 for 50/50 ticket sales. Various costs to buy food, beverages, licenses, ads, etc. were not tallied.

Our staff continues to keep a close tab on the cost versus the payouts, since we want the maximum enjoyment and value for players vs. charity money.

11402 Acolyte Program

Brothers, since the late 1990's, our council has run an Acolyte Program unique in all the Order. Requested by Monsignor Kiernan, we organized a group of brothers to volunteer to act as mature altar servers at all the funerals at our parish, since young servers were hard to come by on weekends. Our acolyte teams also serve at some specialized religious ceremonies upon request (like our Mass of Remembrance).

Like the military, we could use a few good men to replace those who have moved away and passed onto their reward.

Our Acolyte Director, Bernie Marino, needs some new blood to serve as needed on God's altar. Many of our brothers were altar boys when they were young. Experience is not required. Our Mass crews consist of a cross bearer, two candle bearers, a wine server, a water server, and an incense bearer. Six is ultimate, four or five men can often make do. Brother Choir Director, Bernie Sotola, usually joins us with vocals.

Sir Knight Mike Feeney Passed Nov. 21st



Michael (Mike) passed away on November 21, 2019 in Atlanta, Ga. He was 83. Born on June 6, 1936 in Kansas City, Mo., He attended the University of Notre Dame, where he earned a Business Management degree. He went on to spend a 26 year career with Hallmark Cards, during which he laid roots in cities across the Midwest before settling down and opening his own business in 1984 'Containers!', later changed to Addison Avenue in Atlanta. He was a dedicated proprietor of the business, until he retired and moved with his wife Ann to a cabin in the Blue Ridge Mountains. After many peaceful years in Blue Ridge Mike and Ann returned to Atlanta to be closer to their six daughters and their grandchildren in 2008.

Mike was an involved member of local Catholic parishes throughout his life, most recently belonging to All Saints Catholic Church in Dunwoody and previously to St. Anthony's Catholic Church in Blue Ridge and Immaculate Heart of Mary in Atlanta.

He also served his community as a dedicated member of the Knights of Columbus and of Rotary International, where planned many charity galas in Dunwoody and Blue Ridge in more than ten years of membership.

An avid fan and player of tennis, Mike enjoyed competing in Twin Lakes and ALTA tennis leagues late into his life. In his retirement, Mike was fond of carpentry and maintained a workshop in his home. He also loved to travel, often embarking on cross-country road trips in the United States. He was most comfortable behind the wheel of a car and saw much of the country through long drives over the course of his life.

Mike and Ann started a dog sitting business that provided much love for them and gave them so much emotionally. A lifelong salesman, Mike never met anyone he couldn't talk to.

Mike sustained long-distance friendships with old classmates and co-workers throughout the country. He loved family above all and was a dedicated husband, father, grandfather, mentor, and friend to his final days. Endlessly giving, Mike put everyone else ahead of himself, except, occasionally, when a Notre Dame game was on. He will be dearly missed but leaves behind a great legacy for all to see.

Mike is survived by his wife Ann Feeney, daughter Kathy (Chris) Armistead, Molly (Jeff) Willis, Beth (Pete) Ori, Michele Feeney, Maggie (Rob) Eckard, and Patti (Bart) Mathews. He is also survived by his many grandchildren and one great grandchild.

The memorial service will be at All Saints Catholic Church (2443 Mt. Vernon Rd, Dunwoody, GA 30338) on November 25, 2019 at 11 am.
