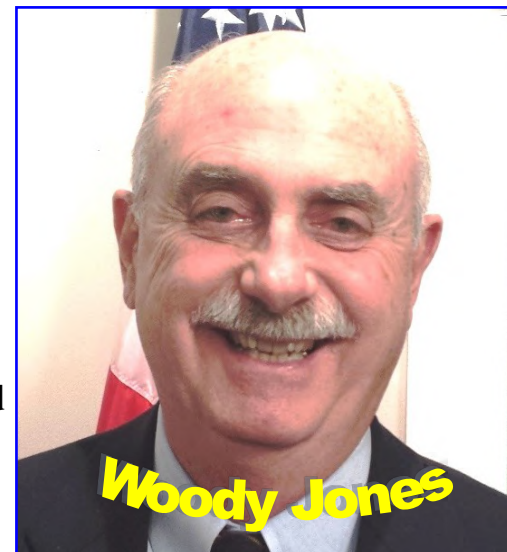
We are having our yearly mandatory **Council Retreat** on Saturday, February 15. It will be in the Social Hall from noon until 6:30.

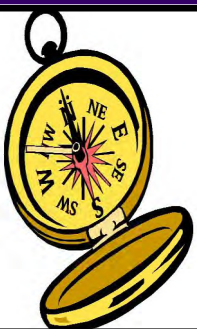

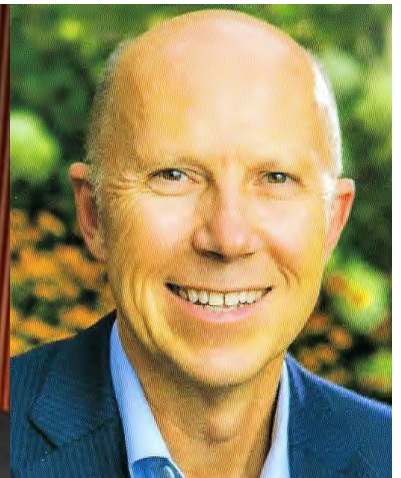

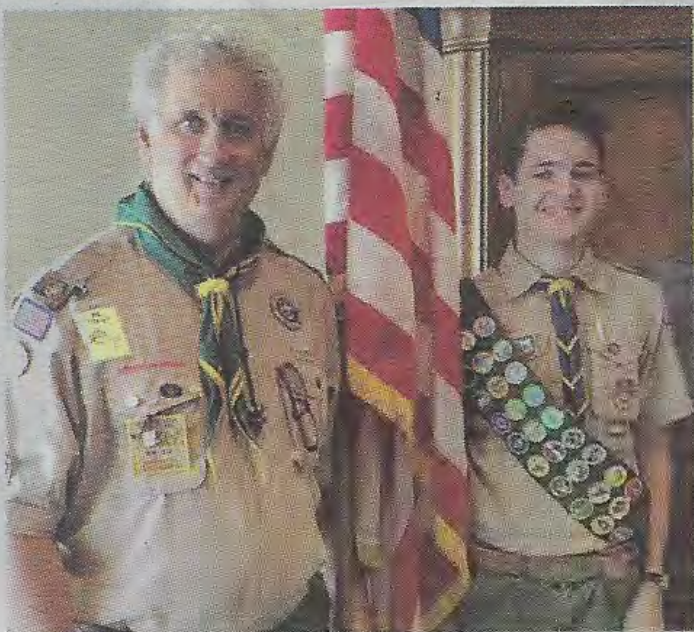

Dunwoody student obtains Eagle Scout rank

DUNWOODY, Ga. — Chamblee Charter High School senior Foster Cowan recently earned the Eagle Scout rank as a member of Dunwoody's All-Saints Boy Scout Troop 434.

His Eagle project consisted of rehabilitating a section of walking trail at the Dunwoody Nature Center. The trail has been split into multiple Eagle projects, with the goal of creating a "Native Plant Hike" for both community enjoyment and teaching opportunities.

Cowan tore out English ivy growth along the trail, laid down wood chips and lined the trail with logs.

Cowan serves as an editor for his school's newspaper, plays trombone in the marching and jazz bands, and is a member of the Model United Nations team and quiz bowl team. He is also a volunteer with Interact, National Honor Society member and performs altar service at All Saints Catholic Church.

Dunwoody Nature Center dedicates new classroom

DUNWOODY, GA — The Dunwoody Nature Center officially dedicated a new classroom in honor of the Dennis and Marie Crean family, long-time supporters of the center.

The Crean Eco-Classroom was constructed from two used shipping containers, and the design of the new building complements the cedar-planked design of the Center's North Woods Pavilion. Later this spring, it will feature a green roof with live plants, serving as an environmental and sustainability teaching tool.

"It's up-cycling at its best," Executive Director Michael Cowan said. "It's also a perfect use for the containers because the reinforced-steel frames will support the weight of the garden of native pollinator plants that will grow on the roof of the classroom."

Nearly 70 guests attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony Jan. 5, conducted by the Crean family, city officials and nature center staff. The building was built in partnership with the city will be used for camps and programming, school field trips, scout programs and other community events.

Council Brother Willy Trent has been the All Saints Troop 434 Scoutmaster for some time.

Council widow Marie Crean has donated the cost of a new building at the Dunwoody Nature Center in the name of deceased Sir Knight Dennis Crean and herself.

New Combination 1-2-3 Degree

The new push by Supreme to modernize the Order into 21st Century standards has resulted in a complete rethinking of the degree ceremonies that brothers go through. Formally they had to take 1st, 2nd, and 3rd separate degrees to become “full” knights. (The 4th degree was and still is a specialized optional degree with a separate Sir Knight super-council type organization.)

Supreme has now directed that becoming a “full” knight can now be accomplished in one degree ceremony which combines the important elements of the three separate degrees. This eases the process of becoming a knight and eases the burden of councils needing three degree teams to perform the three different ceremonies. This combined degree is rolling out in stages.

Even more interesting, the new combined degree is to be held in public in a church or church meeting facility which eliminates the secrecy and allows friends and family members to view their men becoming knights. Brothers who are now first or second degree now sit for the combined degree and are likewise “full” knights. New candidates get the same advancement. The concept of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd degree fades away in time. Any knight may run for council offices.

Georgia is a prime rollout site and recently the first combined degree was held January 18th at St. Benedict’s meeting hall. It was well attended and dozens of new candidates and existing 1st and 2nd degree brothers were elevated to “full “ knighthood (formally 3rd degree) with family members there. Seemed strange to see women at a ceremonial degree. See degree below.

With this new direction, All Saints must try to put together a brand new combined ceremonial team that may pilfer members from our other teams. For a while, no degrees.

Even though there was a long-overdue price increase from \$15 to \$18 with a price charged for food sales, people didn't stay away. This is still a great cost for an evening of fun with lots of prizes. We had suspected that some people were not paying anything for the food in the past. Dunwoody Crier coupons were 77.

Here are the results; Bingo took in \$2038 gross, food added \$441, drinks added \$437, for a total of \$2916 gross. Prizes, taxes, fees, food and drink costs deducted from this. Two council widows played free, paid by the council. We are beginning to build a standing escrow account each month

Rebecca Schaaf Passes



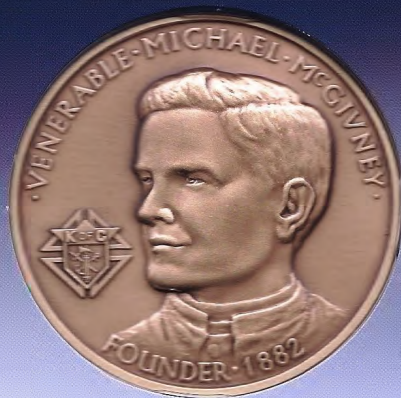
