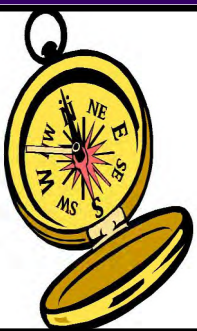
I am looking forward to our June meeting (outdoors).

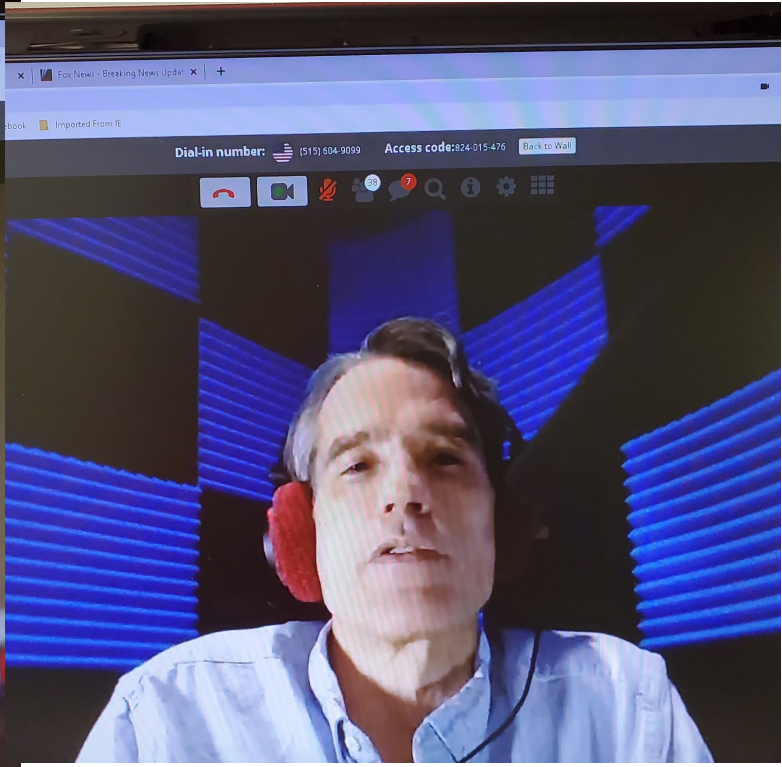
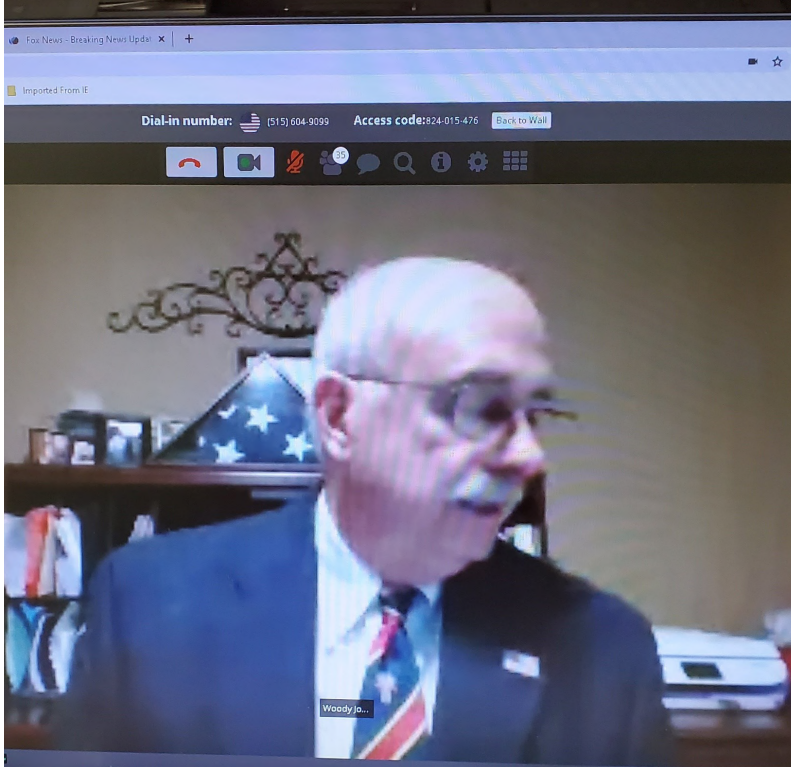




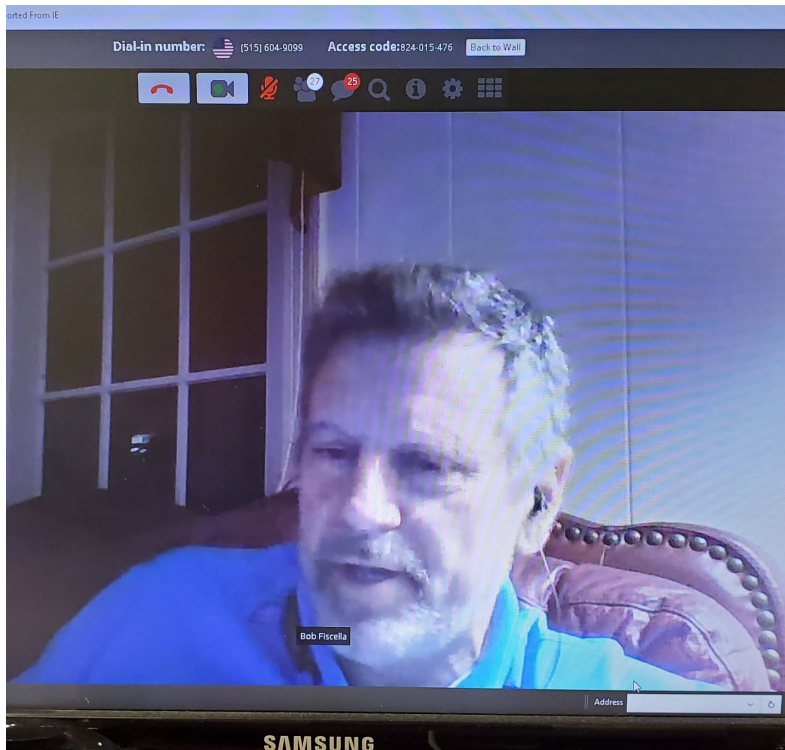
# Council Business Proceeds Online

**The passage of years has dimmed his original excitement and determination to form our new parish. The long era of fundraising and architectural planning for the new church has caused his founding vision to become a more distant memory.**

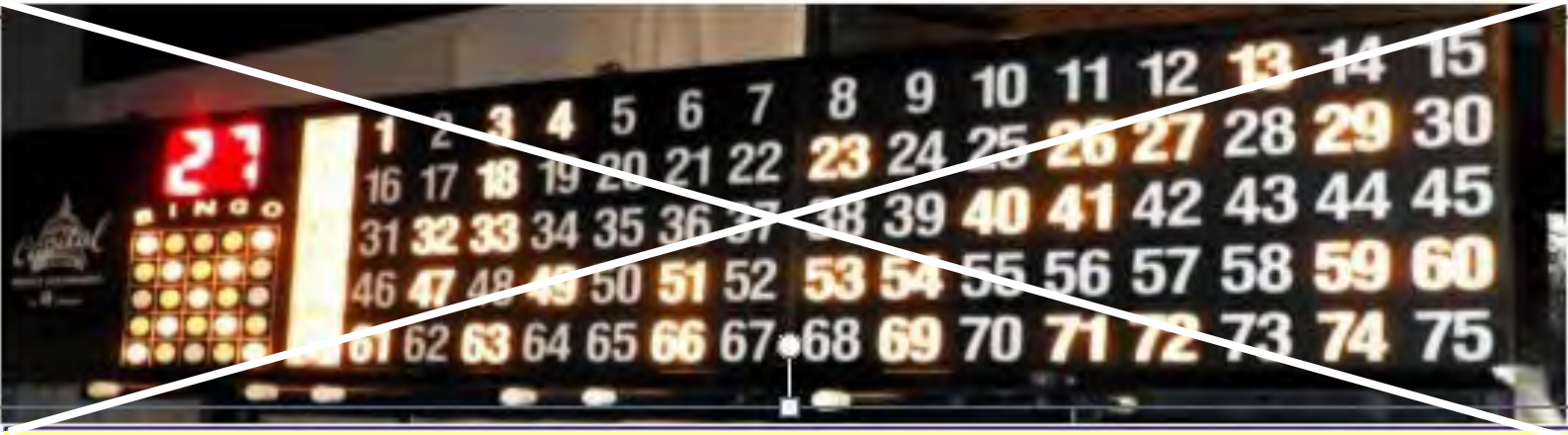

# Vietnam's "The Wall That Heals"

Watters Assembly knights were located—the bench honoring Watters and the Boots and Rifle Statue and Plaque honoring deceased vets. We are proud as Knights to have contributed to this memorial park.

# Fr. McGivney Sainthood Progress

Dear Brother Knight,

It is with particular joy that I write to share with you the news that, at Noon today in Rome, the Vatican announced the formal recognition of a miracle attributed to our founder, Venerable Father Michael McGivney.

With this announcement, a Mass of Beatification will soon be scheduled.

This joyful news is the culmination of many years of determined effort, and I ask for your continued and increased prayers as we prepare for the day when our founder will be known as "Blessed Michael McGivney."

The Vatican announcement can be found below:

## ***Decrees of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints***

*On May 26, 2020, the Holy Father Francis received in audience His Eminence Cardinal Angelo Becciu, prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. During the audience, the Supreme Pontiff authorized the same Congregation to promulgate the Decrees regarding:*

*[...] the miracle, attributed to the intercession of the Venerable Servant of God Michael McGivney, Diocesan Priest, Founder of the Order of the Knights of Columbus; born on August 12, 1852 in Waterbury (United States of America) and died in Thomaston (United States of America) on August 14, 1890; Venerable Michael McGivney was the founder of the Knights of Columbus, now the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization. After studies in Canada and the United States, he was ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop James Gibbons in Baltimore. He founded the Knights of Columbus as a mutual aid society, geared especially to working men and their families. He was known for his tireless work among his parishioners. He died at the early age of 38 from pneumonia.*

I would ask each brother Knight to learn more about our founder at the newly updated Father McGivney Guild [website](#) where the Order will also regularly post news and updates related to the beatification.

And if you would like to learn even more about our founder's heroic life and continuing legacy, please consider reading Father McGivney's biography, *Parish Priest*, and the newly-released book *The Knights of Columbus: An Illustrated History*.

## PRAYER FOR CANONIZATION

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. Through the example of his life and virtue may we follow your Son, Jesus Christ, more closely, fulfilling his commandment of charity and building up his Body which is the Church. Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast. We humbly ask that you glorify your venerable servant Father Michael J. McGivney on earth according to the design of your holy will. Through his intercession, grant the favor I now present (*here make your request*). Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

# Passing of Brother Louis P. Bernard

Brother Louis Phillip Bernard, 72 , passed away unexpectedly on April 25, 2020 of unknown causes. He was thought to have some heart issues by friends.



Louis was only a first degree brother, but he was a charter founding member of All Saints Council on July 4th, 1994. He was an active knight and played Bingo regularly with friends every month.

He was born in Italy. His father, Louis Benedict Bernard, was a USA citizen and during WWII served in the armed forces while stationed in Italy where he met Louis' mother.

He, with mother and father, left Italy for America when he was five and it is thought he was raised in Pittsburg before moving to Dunwoody. Louis had no siblings and his parents are both deceased

and buried in North Atlanta Memorial Park on Winters Chapel Road. He has no known family or relatives. He had always been unmarried.

Louis lived alone in his parents' house and his body was discovered when neighbors noted he had not appeared for days as normal and police were summoned. What is known about him is information from friends and neighbors. Anything else that can be gleaned would be appreciated.

Please keep this very private man in your prayers, so that he can be given a proper remembrance from the Knights and the Parish.

Sir Knight Benedetto (Benny) Mastrogiovanni's passing occurred on April 30th, 2020 in home hospice. He was 80 and had long term illnesses. His visitation was held at the Crowell Funeral home on Peachtree Industrial followed by a private family burial in that cemetery the next day. There was no obituary found in the newspaper or online.

The family had moved to Prince of Peace Parish in Flowery Branch, GA, but Benny never left the All Saints Council or the Watters Assembly.

His wife Bridget died unexpectedly in her sleep only 15 days later on May 14th. See her obituary on the next page.

The couple was a fixture in All Saints gatherings and sales events. Benny was a fourth degree member of the Watters Assembly and had been a long time member of the honor guard. He was born in Italy and never lost his strong Italian accent which lent to his charm. He served in the Italian military.

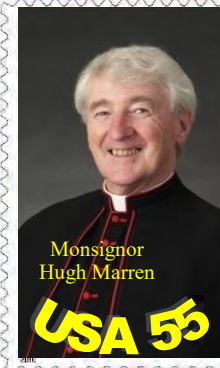
