We will have our next Membership Meeting, July 7 at McGivney. We plan on social distancing in the Hall. If you are not feeling well, please stay home and participate online with us.





# “Wolfman Jack” Meets Our Wulf-Man

For those of you old enough to remember the greatest Radio DJ of them all, “Wolfman Jack”, in the late 1950’s and early 1960’s. He played the newest rock n’ roll hits on his nightly national radio show and was also featured in the classis movie “American Graffiti” with a large cameo part. He regaled his listeners with wit and wisdom between each record played. Well, he met up with our own Wulf-Man, Wulf Lindenau, on 30 June 1960 (the very day before Jack died).

Jack autographed his biography book *(Have Mercy! Confessions of the Original Rock N’ Roll Animal Wolfman Jack)* after meeting Wulf. He was tickled pink when he found out our own brother’s first name was really “Wulf”, and signed the front page “To Wulf-Man, with a hoot!”.

# Lindenau to Military Hall of Fame

Lest you start to think that this is the Wulf Lindenau Memorial Edition Newsletter (after three consecutive articles), please be advised that he is still very much with us. He is just very active and maybe even somewhat interesting.

He has just been voted to a special Military Hall of Fame and we thought that was newsworthy. Here is the information that he provided us about his latest award.

“Today I was notified by Lt. Colonel Randy Dunham, the Editor of the newsletter for all graduates of the Artillery and Missile Officer Candidate School (OCS) at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, that the board of officers evaluating whom they will offer induction into the Artillery and Missile OCS Hall of Fame, have determined that based on my military service in the Army (20 1/2 years, retired as a Major, Military Intelligence) and my service as a senior civilian (23 years as a GS-15, step 10) in the Federal Government, merit induction into their Hall of Fame.

This honor came as a surprise, as I had no information that I would (or could) be even considered for this honor. To my knowledge only officers who had received the Medal of Honor, the Silver Star, etc. for valor, could be considered - and most inducted graduates of our OCS were senior Colonels or Generals (e.g. the former Chief of the General Staff, four star General Shalikashvili) or officers awarded medals for combat.

I was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in 1965, and learned that my civilian grade is listed by the Department of Defense as a senior Colonel, which made me eligible. The selection board, I was told, determined what I did in the military and as a senior Federal civilian qualified me for induction, as they felt that our country was served in such a manner that induction was appropriate.

They offered me induction and I accepted....albeit my own assessment is that I did only what countless others do.”



# Fr. McGivney Sainthood Progress

Dear Brother Knight,

It is with particular joy that I write to share with you the news that, at Noon today in Rome, the Vatican announced the formal recognition of a miracle attributed to our founder, Venerable Father Michael McGivney.

With this announcement, a Mass of Beatification will soon be scheduled.

This joyful news is the culmination of many years of determined effort, and I ask for your continued and increased prayers as we prepare for the day when our founder will be known as "Blessed Michael McGivney."

The Vatican announcement can be found below:

## ***Decrees of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints***

*On May 26, 2020, the Holy Father Francis received in audience His Eminence Cardinal Angelo Becciu, prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. During the audience, the Supreme Pontiff authorized the same Congregation to promulgate the Decrees regarding:*

*[...] the miracle, attributed to the intercession of the Venerable Servant of God Michael McGivney, Diocesan Priest, Founder of the Order of the Knights of Columbus; born on August 12, 1852 in Waterbury (United States of America) and died in Thomaston (United States of America) on August 14, 1890; Venerable Michael McGivney was the founder of the Knights of Columbus, now the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization. After studies in Canada and the United States, he was ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop James Gibbons in Baltimore. He founded the Knights of Columbus as a mutual aid society, geared especially to working men and their families. He was known for his tireless work among his parishioners. He died at the early age of 38 from pneumonia.*

I would ask each brother Knight to learn more about our founder at the newly updated Father McGivney Guild [website](#) where the Order will also regularly post news and updates related to the beatification.

And if you would like to learn even more about our founder's heroic life and continuing legacy, please consider reading Father McGivney's biography, *Parish Priest*, and the newly-released book *The Knights of Columbus: An Illustrated History*.

## PRAYER FOR CANONIZATION

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. Through the example of his life and virtue may we follow your Son, Jesus Christ, more closely, fulfilling his commandment of charity and building up his Body which is the Church. Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast. We humbly ask that you glorify your venerable servant Father Michael J. McGivney on earth according to the design of your holy will. Through his intercession, grant the favor I now present (*here make your request*). Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

# Passing of Brother Ray Turcotte

**TURCOTTE, Maurice Raymond "Ray"**

Maurice (Ray) Raymond Turcotte died very peacefully at his home at Saint George Village in Roswell, GA. He was born in Williamsville, CT, on May 23, 1925, to Annie Irbina (McMunn) and Samuel Joseph Turcotte, M.D. Being born on the cusp of the Greatest Generation and the G.I. Generation, he was raised during the Depression and learned well the values of love, integrity and great generosity, which he demonstrated all his life.



At a young age he and his mother moved to Lincoln, RI, to join with his mother's sister Alice and her husband Edward Dunn. He would remain in this tight family unit for the remainder of his formative years. Life during the Depression was lean, but his uncle always had a job. Ray saw work as an opportunity rather than a burden and worked on a bread delivery truck from late grade school through high school. He was admitted to St. Raphael Academy in Pawtucket after presenting himself at the front door and asking the brothers if he could go to school there. After high school, he attended Providence College for one year before dropping out and getting a job at the local textile mill. He often said that the mill experience, where workers rarely had ten fingers and often had difficult breathing, was a prime motivator for the rest of his academic career. He returned to Providence College and graduated with a Biology degree in 1946. During this time, he also played semi-pro football. This was the era of leather helmets and tin sideways caps. He weighed a mere 125 lbs but he had, surprisingly, some physical conflict, enough to earn him the nickname "Tanglefoot Turcotte".

Promising PC science students often attended Thomas Jefferson Medical School in Philadelphia and Ray followed this path, graduating in 1950. Upon completing his residency in Maryland and Connecticut, he briefly opened an office in General Practice. He was fond of pointing out that he charged \$7 for an office visit and \$3 for a home visit, including any drugs and injections. He enjoyed the GP role, but his true love was anesthesiology, so he returned to Hartford, Connecticut and completed his two-year residency at St. Francis Hospital and the US Army, where he was stationed in Germany.

He practiced anesthesiology at St. Francis until 1957 and then relocated to South Fulton Hospital in Atlanta, GA. In 1977, he served as President of the Georgia Society of Anesthesiologists. He is survived by his children Maurice (Jeanette), Anna, John (Sandra), Suzanne (Fred Colson), Mary (Ronny) Brown, Margaret (Brad) Barlett, and Catherine (Don) Amante, 27 grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren.




