The beatification Mass for the American priest Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus, is scheduled for October 31 in Connecticut, according to the Congregation for Saints' Causes.

The date was <u>communicated in a Tweet</u>, which also announced that due to the coronavirus, the beatifications of Benigna Cardoso and of the missionary priest Giuseppe Ambrosoli, respectively scheduled for October 21 and November 22, are postponed.

First McGivney Miracle Announced

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS around the world rejoiced May 27 at the news that Father Michael J. McGivney, the Order's founder, had advanced a step closer to sainthood.

The previous day, Pope Francis approved a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession, clearing the way for him to be declared "Blessed." It is anticipated that his beatification Mass will be celebrated in the Archdiocese of Hartford sometime in the coming months.

An additional miracle attributed to the priest's intercession will be required for his canonization.

Pope Francis, addressing the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors in Rome in February, praised the Order for being faithful "to the vision of your founder, Venerable Michael McGivney, who was inspired by the principles of Christian charity and fraternity to assist those most in need."

In a statement following the May 27 announcement, Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson said, "Father Mc-Givney has inspired generations of Catholic men to roll up their sleeves and put their faith into action. Today, his spirit continues to shape the extraordinary charitable work of Knights as they continue to serve those on the margins of society, as he served widows and orphans in the 1880s."

Born of Irish immigrant parents in 1852 in Waterbury, Conn., Father Mc-Givney was ordained in Baltimore in 1877. He ministered to a heavily Irish-American and immigrant community in New Haven and Thomaston, Conn. At a time of anti-Catholic sentiment, the young parish priest worked tirelessly to help his parishioners live out their faith, in part by finding practical solutions to their many problems — spiritual and temporal.

With a group of the leading Catholic men of New Haven, he founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882 at St. Mary's Church to provide spiritual support for Catholic men and financial resources for families that suffered the loss of their breadwinner.

"Father McGivney was decades ahead of his time in giving the laity an important role within the Church," noted Supreme Knight Anderson. "He remains an important role model for parish priests around the world and left us a transformative legacy of effective cooperation between the laity and clergy."

Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore urged Knights to take inspiration from his beatification. "Let us see this providential turn of events as a sign from God of the goodness, soundness and importance of our mission," he said. "Let it be an enduring moment of grace that will spur us on to live the principles of charity, unity and fraternity, to put our faith in action, and to recruit good Catholic men to join us in the mission bequeathed to us by our holy founder."

> Known by his contemporaries for his compassion and his zeal for the faith, Father Mc-Givney will be the first American who spent his entire ministry as a parish priest to be beatified.

He died of pneumonia Aug. 14, 1890 — two days after his 38th birthday — after falling ill amid a pandemic.

His cause for sainthood was opened in the Archdiocese of Hartford in 1997, and he was declared Venerable by Pope Benedict XVI in 2008. The miracle paving the way for the beatification occurred in the Diocese of Nashville, Tenn., when an unborn child was healed of a very serious medical condition. Doctors gave the parents, Michelle and Daniel Schachle, no hope for their child's survival and offered abortion, which they refused.

A general agent with the Knights of Columbus, Daniel asked his wife to join him in praying to Father Mc-Givney for a miracle and suggested that if the boy survived, they name him after the Order's founder. Other family members, friends and co-workers also invoked Father Mc-Givney's intercession.

A few weeks after the initial diagnosis, an ultrasound found that the unborn child was completely healed of the condition, defying any medical or scientific explanation. Michael McGivney Schachle, affectionately called "Mikey" by his family, was born May 15, 2015.

Archbishop Gregory Hartmayer ordained three new priests recently for the Archdiocese of Atlanta.

All three were offered a gift of new Mass chalices by our Fr. Charles J. Watters fourth degree Assembly. Fr. Paul Porter had access to one through his family members and declined.

The other two, Fr. Cristian Cossio and Fr. Miller Gomez Ruiz, accepted our donations and will be awarded their chalices as their schedule permits from Sir Knights Bob Mitchell and Ed Pierson, as soon as it can be arranged.

Pictures will follow. Our Assembly regularly honors new priests with such donations which include the engraved names of our deceased Sir Knights. Edward Trainor, Don Myers, Rich Szyperski, and Father Dan McCormick are scheduled for these sacred honors on our next two Assembly chalices.

Mass Dispensation Increased Through August

Archbishop Gregory Hartmayer has once again increased the length of time that Catholics are exempt from attending Sunday Mass in person throughout the month of August because of the pandemic. Although parishioners are again able to attend Sunday and daily Masses in person, many are not yet comfortable with personal appearance.

All Saints displays quite safe conditions for Mass attendance. Notably:

- All parishioners are required to wear masks.
- Every second pew is roped off, ensuring an easy six feet separation for parishioners.
- Church ushers (mostly brother knights) are positioned to ensure that people are not clustered and obey restrictions.
- All parishioners enter the church through the rear doors only under supervision.
- Hand sanitizers are available in the narthex.
- Donation envelopes are dropped off in the narthex to eliminate usher collections during Mass.
- Communion occurs at the very end of Mass, so that recipients can immediately exit the church without any interaction.
- Priests sanitize before giving out Communion and wear masks.
- Less than 100 parishioners are present at any Mass in a church that holds 900.

Seeing these important safeguards in place, it may be time to reconsider personal appearance at daily and Sunday Masses.

If still not comfortable, know that daily and Sunday Masses are always telecast on the internet at <u>allsaintsdunwoody.org</u> in very fine format by three new cameras.

Vesting deacon: Wayne Nacey, also a deacon, is vesting his son. "The easy answer to why I chose him is because he is my dad. The more thoughtful answer is I chose him because he was part of the reason I had the courage to enter seminary in the first place," said Deacon Nacey. "I saw something change in him that I had never witnessed before he was ordained. In witnessing that, I knew that the Lord would do the same thing for me if I just said 'yes.' The thing that I admire about him is his dedication. Whether it is his family or his job or his responsibilities at the parish, he works hard and gives

Ministries of interest: "I think the answer to this question changes for me every time someone asks me it. I think right now I am looking forward to working with people who are looking to enter the church, whether it is parents and their infants or through RCIA. I have already had a couple people ask me to baptize their babies after I'm ordained and just the idea brings me such joy," said the new deacon.

Best advice during vocation discernment: For 21 years,

Deacon Nacey has been praying a prayer that he learned in second grade religion class. It says, "Lord Jesus Christ, take all my freedom, my memory, my understanding, and my will. All that I have and cherish you have given me. I surrender it all to be guided are wealth enough for me. Give me these Lord Jesus and I ask for nothing more."

"While this prayer was never really given as 'advice,' I learned from it over the years and it taught me how to live and how to pray, by giving everything to the Lord," he said.

Deacon Nacey also said he received more direct advice upon entering seminary-to "be docile to the Holy Spirit."

He said: "Through the good and bad, the easy and challenging, I knew that that was where the Lord wanted me to be. And knowing that, I could have peace because ultimately I want what the Lord wants for me."

Lindenau to Military Hall of Fame

Lest you start to think that this is the Wulf Lindenau Memorial Edition Newsletter (after three consecutive articles), please be advised that he is still very much with us. He is just very active and maybe even somewhat interesting.

He has just been voted to a special Military Hall of Fame and we thought that was newsworthy. Here is the information that he provided us about his latest award.

"Today I was notified by Lt. Colonel Randy Dunham, the Editor of the newsletter for all graduates of the Artillery and Missile Officer Candidate School (OCS) at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, that the board of officers evaluating whom they will offer induction into the Artillery and Missile OCS Hall of Fame, have determined that based on my military service in the Army (20 1/2 years, retired as a Major, Military Intelligence) and my service as a senior civilian (23 years as a GS-15, step 10) in the Federal Government, merit induction into their Hall of Fame.

This honor came as a surprise, as I had no information that I would (or could) be even considered for this honor. To my knowledge only officers who had received the Medal of Honor, the Silver Star, etc. for valor, could be considered - and most inducted graduates of our OCS were senior Colonels or Generals (e.g. the former Chief of the General Staff, four star General Shalikashvili) or officers awarded medals for combat.

I was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in 1965, and learned that my civilian grade is listed by the Department of Defense as a senior Colonel, which made me eligible. The selection board, I was told, determined what I did in the military and as a senior Federal civilian qualified me for induction, as they felt that our country was served in such a manner that induction was appropriate.

They offered me induction and I accepted....albeit my own assessment is that I did only what countless others do."
