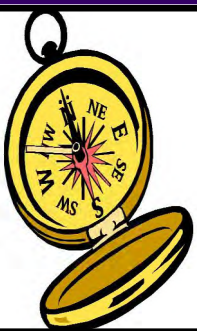

KofC founder to be beatified October 31; other beatifications postponed

Father Michael McGivney's beatification date was announced on Twitter by Congregation for Saints' Causes.

The beatification Mass for the American priest Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus, is scheduled for October 31 in Connecticut, according to the Congregation for Saints' Causes.

The date was communicated in a Tweet, which also announced that due to the coronavirus, the beatifications of Benigna Cardoso and of the missionary priest Giuseppe Ambrosoli, respectively scheduled for October 21 and November 22, are postponed.

First McGivney Miracle Announced

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS around the world rejoiced May 27 at the news that Father Michael J. McGivney, the Order's founder, had advanced a step closer to sainthood.

The previous day, Pope Francis approved a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to Father McGivney's intercession, clearing the way for him to be declared "Blessed." It is anticipated that his beatification Mass will be celebrated in the Archdiocese of Hartford sometime in the coming months.

An additional miracle attributed to the priest's intercession will be required for his canonization.

Pope Francis, addressing the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors in Rome in February, praised the Order for being faithful "to the vision of your founder, Venerable Michael McGivney, who was inspired by the principles of Christian charity and fraternity to assist those most in need."

In a statement following the May 27 announcement, Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson said, "Father McGivney has inspired generations of Catholic men to roll up their sleeves and put their faith into action. Today, his spirit continues to shape the extraordinary charitable work of Knights as they continue to serve those on the margins of society, as he served widows and orphans in the 1880s."

Born of Irish immigrant parents in 1852 in Waterbury, Conn., Father McGivney was ordained in Baltimore in 1877.

He ministered to a heavily Irish-American and immigrant community in New Haven and Thomaston, Conn. At a time of anti-Catholic sentiment, the young parish priest worked tirelessly to help his parishioners live out their faith, in part by finding practical solutions to their many problems — spiritual and temporal.

With a group of the leading Catholic men of New Haven, he founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882 at St. Mary's Church to provide spiritual support for Catholic men and financial resources for families that suffered the loss of their breadwinner.

"Father McGivney was decades ahead of his time in giving the laity an important role within the Church," noted Supreme Knight Anderson. "He remains an important role

model for parish priests around the world and left us a transformative legacy of effective cooperation between the laity and clergy."

Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore urged Knights to take inspiration from his beatification. "Let us see this providential turn of events as a sign from God of the goodness, soundness and importance of our mission," he said. "Let it be an enduring moment of grace that will spur us on to live the principles of charity, unity and fraternity, to put our faith in action, and to recruit good Catholic men to join us in the mission bequeathed to us by our holy founder."

Known by his contemporaries for his compassion and his zeal for the faith, Father McGivney will be the first American who spent his entire ministry as a parish priest to be beatified.

He died of pneumonia Aug. 14, 1890 — two days after his 38th birthday — after falling ill amid a pandemic.

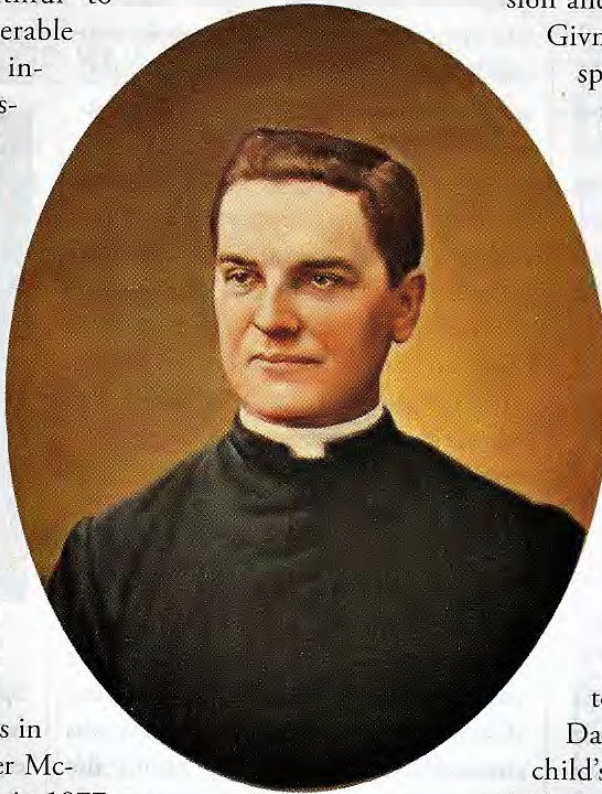
His cause for sainthood was opened in the Archdiocese of Hartford in 1997, and he was declared Venerable by Pope Benedict XVI in 2008.

The miracle paving the way for the beatification occurred in the Diocese of Nashville, Tenn., when an unborn child was healed of a very serious medical condition. Doctors gave the parents, Michelle and Daniel Schachle, no hope for their child's survival and offered abortion, which they refused.

A general agent with the Knights of Columbus, Daniel asked his wife to join him in praying to Father McGivney for a miracle and suggested that if the boy survived, they name him after the Order's founder. Other family members, friends and co-workers also invoked Father McGivney's intercession.

A few weeks after the initial diagnosis, an ultrasound found that the unborn child was completely healed of the condition, defying any medical or scientific explanation. Michael McGivney Schachle, affectionately called "Mikey" by his family, was born May 15, 2015.

Mass Dispensation Extended Through Sept 28th

Archbishop Gregory Hartmayer has once again increased the length of time that Catholics are exempt from attending Sunday Mass in person through September 28th because of the pandemic. The time period will be re-examined at that time.

Although parishioners are again able to attend Sunday and daily Masses in person, many are not yet comfortable with personal appearance, although numbers increase.

All Saints utilizes quite safe conditions for Mass attendance. Notably:

- All parishioners are required to wear masks.
- Every second pew is roped off, ensuring an easy six feet separation for parishioners.
- Church ushers (mostly brother knights) are positioned to ensure that people are not clustered and obey restrictions.
- All parishioners enter the church through the rear doors only under supervision.
- Hand sanitizers are available in the narthex.
- Donation envelopes are dropped off in the narthex to eliminate usher collections during Mass.
- Communion occurs at the very end of Mass, so that recipients can immediately exit the church without any interaction.
- Priests sanitize before giving out Communion and wear masks.
- Less than 100 parishioners usually present at any Mass in a church that holds 900.

Seeing these important safeguards in place, it may be time to reconsider personal appearance at daily and Sunday Masses.

If still not comfortable, know that daily and Sunday Masses are always telecast on the internet at allsaintsdunwoody.org/live-mass in very fine format by three cameras.

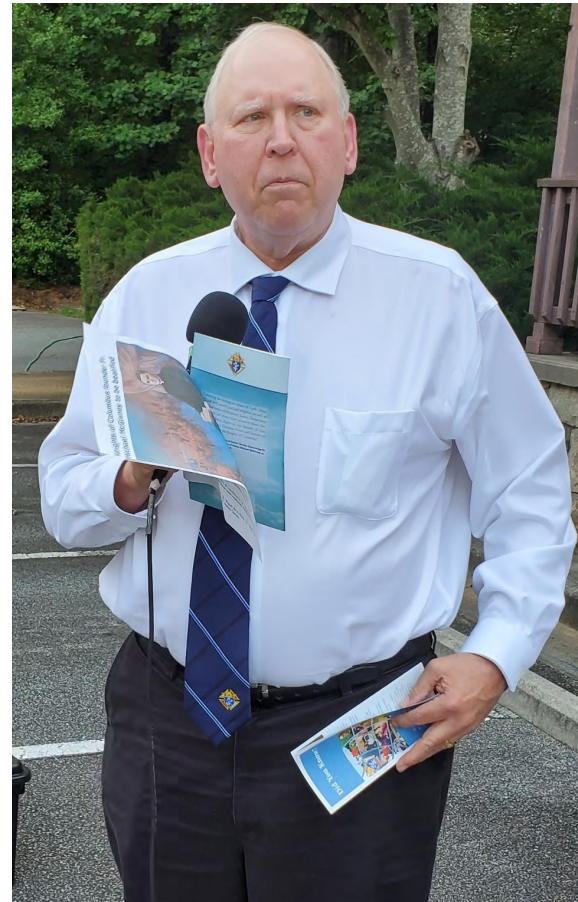

We all know that we are obliged to honor the Sabbath Day once a week.

The Jews define the Sabbath as starting at Friday sundown and lasting until Saturday at sundown.

The Catholic Church had always defined Sabbath as Sunday. Lately, the Church has redefined it as starting loosely from Saturday evening until Sunday evening. Thus we have the Saturday Vigil Mass. In any scenario, God gets one day a week of reverence.

The calendar is an imperfect creation of man and has been manipulated over centuries.

When Pope Gregory XIII (the Great) saw the need to bring the calendar into harmony with planetary position, he decreed the Julian Calendar be replaced with his Gregorian calendar. Thus the concept of Feb. 29th Leap Year was born.

This was required because the earth takes almost exactly 365 and 1/4 days to traverse around the sun. When the Gregorian Calendar became mandatory by his decree in October 1582, ten days disappeared from human history and the earth came back into line with the defined seasons. The old Julian calendar had no Leap Year Day.

The entire world now defines the days of the week as Gregory had mandated. This illustrates the power of the Vatican even after the Reformation.

The Greek Orthodox Church still continues its resistance to the calculation of Easter based on the occurrence of Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox, but largely the calendar was reset in stone by Pope Gregory XIII in 1582.

Make sure to keep the Sabbath.

Know Your Catholic Iconic Abbreviations



Because there is no letter “J” in the Latin alphabet, the name “Jesus” is spelled “Iesus”. By the same substitution, the Latin word for the “Jewish Nation” is “Iudaeorum”.

Because the Bible states that Pilate had the inscription “Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews” placed above his head, most crucifix depictions show the letters INRI, rather than an equally possible formal Roman document scroll.

In Latin, this is short for:

Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum



Again, remembering that there is no letter “J” in the Latin alphabet, the name of “Jesus” is again spelled “Iesus”.

The letter “H” stands for “Hominum” or “mankind”. The letter “S” stands for “Salvator” or “savior”.

In English, the IHS shown on all manner of Catholic vestments and items, stands for:

Jesus, Savior of Mankind
Iesus Hominum Salvator

Sir Knight Walt Gauthier Passes

Walter R. Gauthier, 79, passed away peacefully on Thursday August 20, 2020 while at the Lutheran Home of Worcester, Mass.

Walter is survived by his niece Cecile March of Auburn, MA.; he was predeceased by both his brothers Richard and Robert Gauthier, and by his sister Lorraine LaJoie.

Walter was born in Worcester, MA on February 1, 1941, son of the late Wilfred and Aurora (Derosier) Gauthier; he served honorably in the United States Army from 1961-1966.

Private funeral arrangements were entrusted to the care of the Shaw-Majercik Funeral Home, 48 School Street Webster, MA. He maintained close association with our council mostly via our SK Bob Santos. We regularly had asked prayers for his many heart and accident surgeries plus a bout with Covid-19.

Walt had been a member of Mary Our Queen Council, but later transferred to All Saints for several years before he grudgingly needed to enter a full-time assisted living facility in Massachusetts near family caretakers.

He loved being a Knight and was All Saints Knight-of-the Month in October 2015. He earned the award by donating both a wheelchair to the parish and a signed lithograph of Christopher Columbus' three ships (Nina, Pinta, and Santa Maria) which still graces the council chamber. 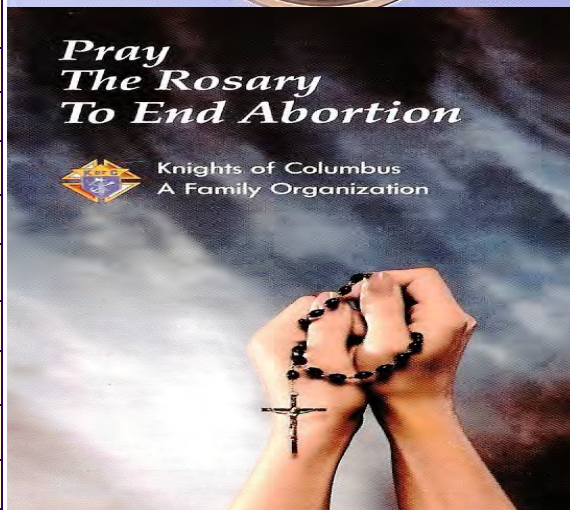
He faithfully attended all council and Watters Assembly meetings while a member. When his failing health forced him to relocate to Massachusetts, several members of the council joined in packing his furniture and effects. He donated his honor guard regalia to the Assembly and a huge personal collection of movie DVD's to the Dunwoody Library for sale. God bless this very devout brother.

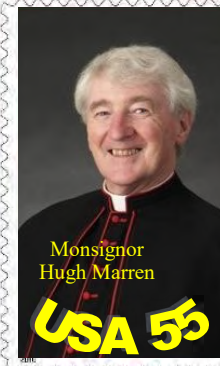
