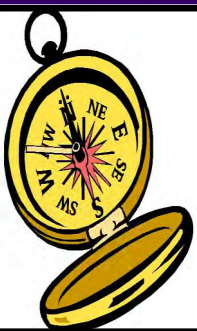

Steven is one of our newer advisors and looks forward to serving the members of your council. He brings much experience and can help assisting you in recruiting efforts as well.

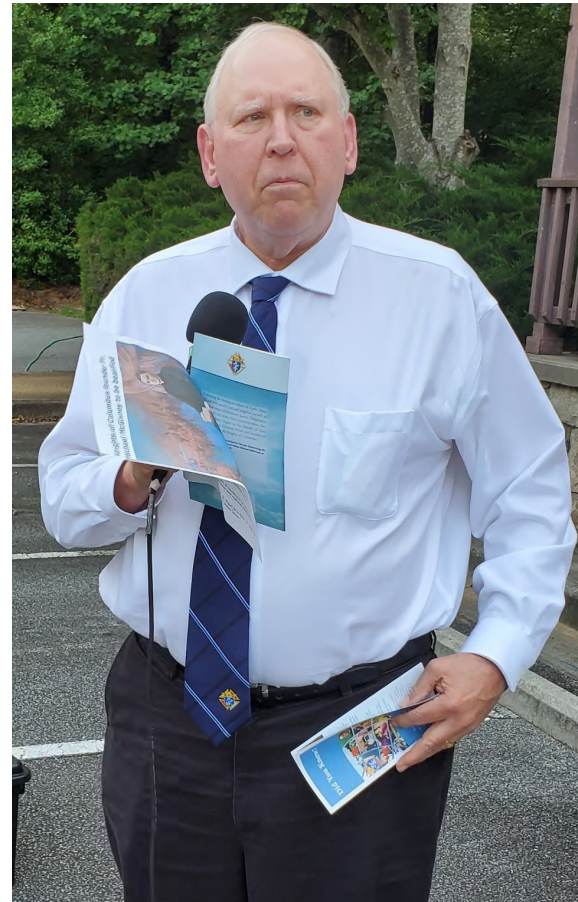

## Special *Knights of Columbus* Edition

### Our Lady, Queen of the Knights Chapel

Hidden in plain sight in the vestibule of All Saints Church is a interesting room with a small sign reading "Our Lady, Queen of the Knights Chapel." In a previous life, it was a gift shop, but its ultimate destiny was to become a chapel.

In late 1998, Monsignor Kiernan mentioned to All Saints Grand Knight George Novac that he would like to have a chapel similar to one that he had admired at Holy Spirit Parish. Brother Novac took our home-building Brother Sam Portis with him, and they checked out the Holy Spirit Chapel. They let Monsignor know that it would not be a problem, because it was constructed of American Cherry "judges paneling" with a light stain and lacquer found in many higher level homes.

It was decided that the gift shop would be converted, that the Knights would donate the labor and the room materials, and the church would pay for the air conditioning and electrical modifications. Novac would handle the administrative issues, Portis would handle the construction, and they took turns overseeing subcontractors as schedules permitted.

At this point, David Boring, the sales manager of the Pierce and Pierce Mill Works Company on Buford Highway, was contracted by Portis to supply the wood. (*Boring was a Catholic and eager to help. Novac and Portis eventually persuaded Boring to become a Knight, and he later even helped start the Blue Ridge Council in North Georgia*). Portis then contacted his trim man to design the paneling. Monsignor was shown the raw product samples at the mill supplier and approved the final design and "look" he wanted.

The project took about a month and went extremely well except for some heating/air conditioning problems. Another Knight, Bob Greene, volunteered his expertise with carpeting from his decorating business and also chose the colors. At that point, the question of furniture came up.

It was decided that they would start with twelve kneeler/chairs named in honor of the twelve apostles. That brought yet another Knight into the picture. Dick Holcomb (now with St. Brigid Council) was a neighbor of Sam Portis and sold that type of furniture. After some cajoling by Portis, he agreed to sell the kneeler/chairs at a discount to the church. Portis, Novac, and Holcomb generously each paid personally for one unit and nine other parishioners bought one also. The dedication plaques are on the chairs still.

The chapel was dedicated and blessed by Archbishop Donoghue and Monsignor on Feb. 8, 1999. Today it is used for smaller baptisms, benedictions, prayer and silent meditation, and other limited functions. With the twelve apostle chairs and a few others, the room should only accommodate about 15 people maximum.

Using the people, techniques, and talents that were so successful on the chapel project, the Knights then turned their efforts toward converting the cluttered storage area in the basement under the Kiernan Scout Hut into the present beautiful McGivney Hall, named after Fr. Michael J. McGivney who founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882. Thus, two underserved areas became very functional additions to the parish because of this hard-working organization.

**The Monsignor was our friend. As many of his friends do, I'd like to keep the memory of Monsignor Kiernan alive.**

**In the blur of the extreme difficulties of weathering the recession storm, and finally building the new MOQ Sanctuary, I was reminded of Monsignor's hopes and desires for this new Parish over in the 'Bad Lands of Peachtree Corners', and the many of us he called his 'Outlaws' who lived over here.**

**The passage of years has dimmed his original excitement and determination to form our new parish. The long era of fundraising and architectural planning for the new church has caused his founding vision to become a more distant memory.**

**I am working to not let that happen. He was extremely caring of me and my family on many levels. We also had many conversations before and after the founding of MOQ as a Mission. He asked me to carry out numerous tasks much like he did in asking others to contribute their time and talents (unsure in my case why he did it).**

**Our first attempt to keep his name going here at MOQ was a minor success. We are planning another Monsignor Donald Kiernan Memorial Golf Tournament on Monday, May 18, 2020 to be played at Bear's Best Golf Club in Suwanee. (See rescheduling date to the right).**

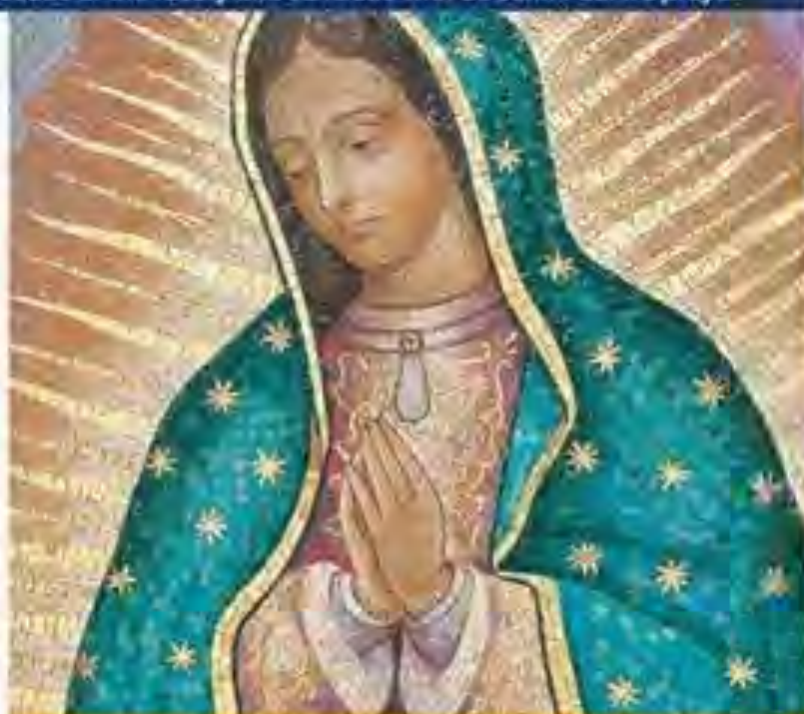

Arthur "Art" Ernest Montagne, age 98, of Decatur, GA passed away peacefully on August 31, 2020, at the Benton House of Decatur. Born in Detroit, MI on November 23, 1921, Art was the third of five children of Ed and Irene Montagne of Detroit, MI. He graduated from University of Detroit High School, attended Wayne State University for two years before enlisting in the US Marine Air Corps in 1943, achieved the rank of Captain and was awarded The Distinguished Flying Cross while fighting in WWII in the South Pacific flying a single engine TBF Avenger (torpedo bomber). He received an honorable discharge in 1947, but remained in the reserves until 1957.



Art married Ruth Connelly on December 1, 1945 and they had a beautiful and loving relationship for 56 years before Ruth's passing in 2001. He is survived by his children, Arthur Richard (Linda), Thomas Daniel, Larry Edward (Lyn), Mary Lou Allen (Randall), nine grand and great-grandchildren, brother, Lionel (Lena) and sister, Germaine Canar. Preceding Art in death was his son, Timmy in his first year of life, and brothers, Ed (age 100) and Bob (age 88).

Art was an accomplished high school football player, playing halfback and punter. In 1939, he was captain of the team and won the Michigan State Championship, scoring the winning touchdown. Art was a lifelong avid follower of sports especially the Ga Tech Yellow Jackets football, Atlanta Falcons and Atlanta Braves.

His career as regional credit manager for J.C. Penney Co. began in 1957 and spanned twenty years. During those years Art relocated his young family from Detroit to Denver, CO, then Seattle, WA, Portland, OR and finally to Atlanta in 1964. In this process, the family benefited from seeing this country from "sea to shinning sea." Road trips each summer found routes that toured every major National Park. This was an education in its own right.

Approximately 1974 he was appointed by then Gov. Jimmy Carter to head a commission that made recommendations to improve consumer credit legislation. Throughout the 1980's he worked for the Consumer Credit Counseling Service working with consumers and creditors to ease the burden of personal debt.

All who knew Art knew he was a kind, loving and giving man, often referred to as a "gentle soul." He had a deep faith attending Catholic Mass every Sunday, was a member of the Knights of Columbus, served communion and ushered. His abiding faith and love and commitment to family was the center of his world. After retiring, Art volunteered at St. Joseph Hospital several days a week.

In lieu of flowers, the family has asked that contributions be made to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, one of Art and Ruth's favorite charities.

A Catholic Mass will be held for family Friday, September 4, 2020.
