We can all continue to pray that things will get better. I hear from the Brothers, that they do miss the gatherings and fellowship that we have shared in the past.

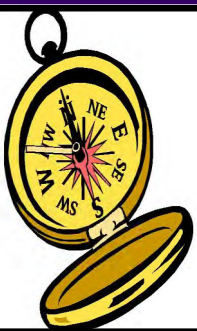

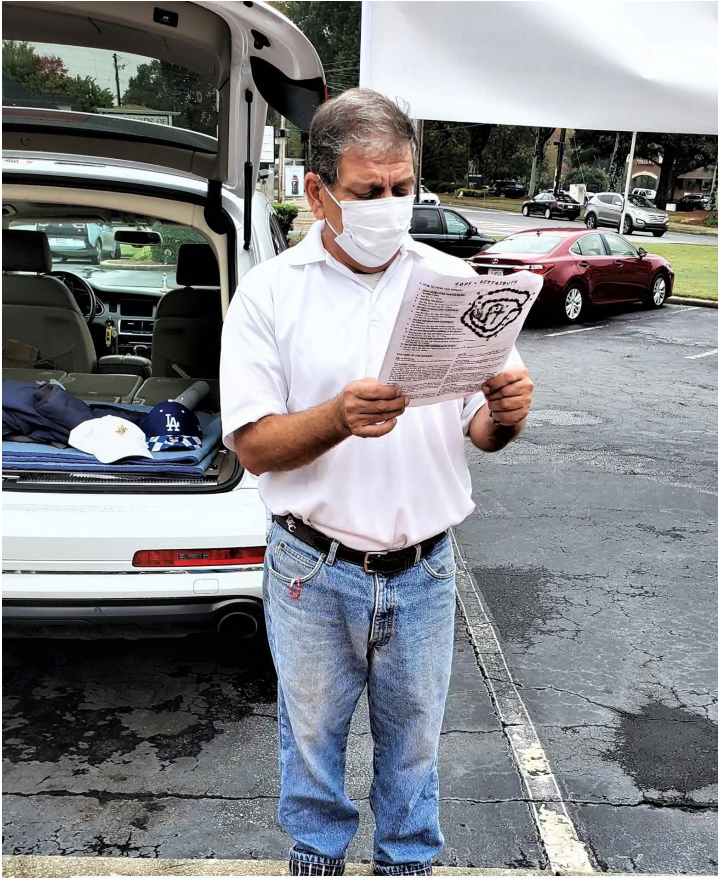
Parish Habitat Home #27

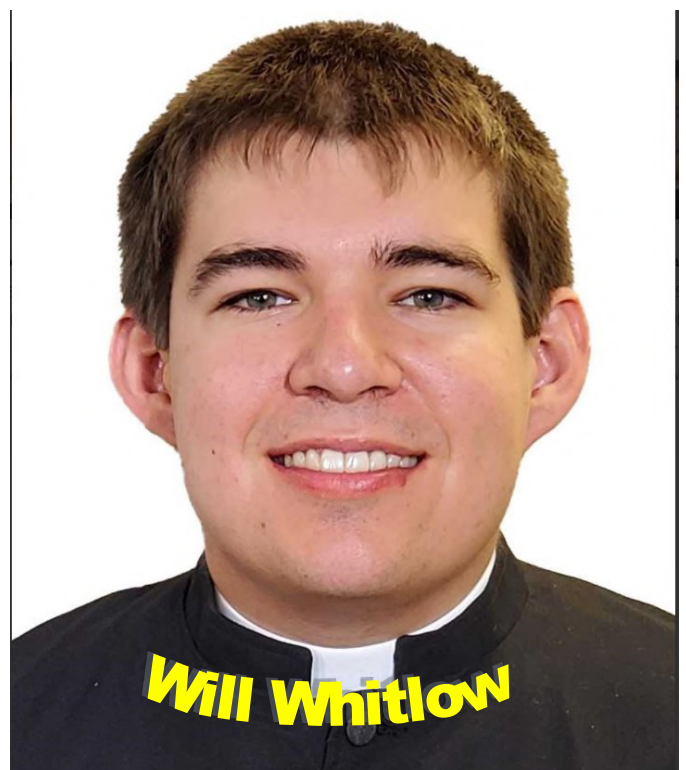
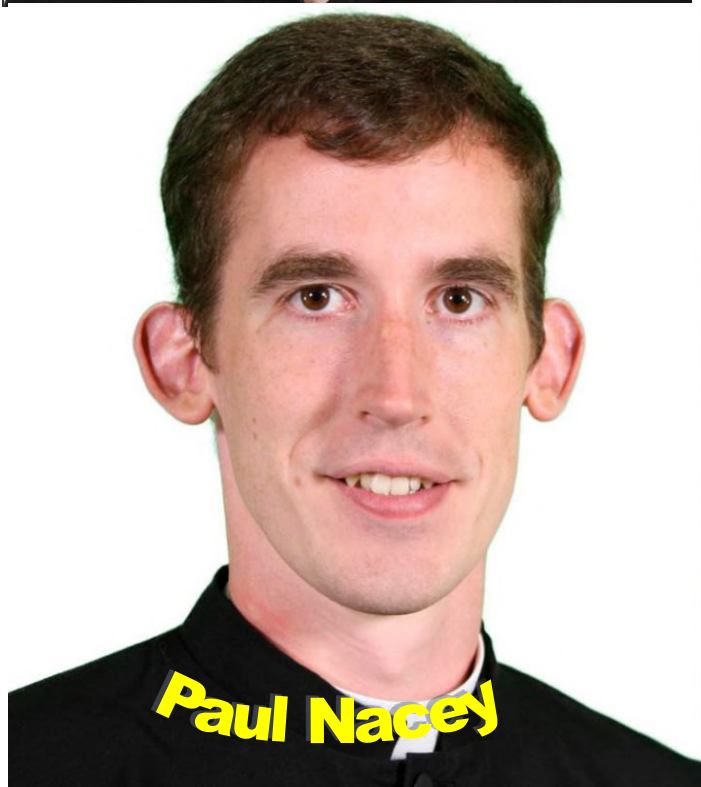
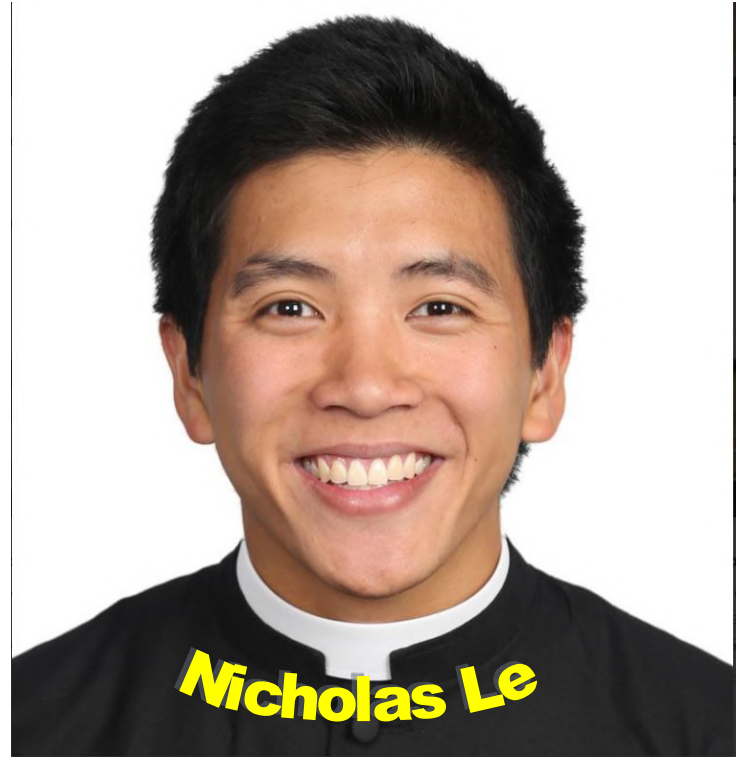

Faith in Action

All Saints Homeless Shelter

All Saints Catholic Church (Dunwoody, GA) - Mens Shelter Ministry - Cooks, Servers, Overnight Stay

MT 25:36 - "For I was hungry, and you gave me to eat; I was thirsty, and you gave me to drink;..."

Volunteers from All Saints have been supporting the Men's Shelter at The Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and Central Presbyterian Church for over 30 years.

All Saints commitment to the Men's Shelter this year involves ten days during Nov - Mar where we will preparing dinners, preparing lunches and serving the meals at Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and Central Presbyterian. There is no overnight at either shelter in Nov and Dec, so the meals will be 'handed out' in the parking lot of the Shrine. Overnight will start in Jan at a reduced capacity. We will provide the meals for the Men staying in the Shrine and Central Presbyterian and also prepare meals to be 'handed out' to other men outside at the Shrine.

We are not signing up to spend the nights at the Shelter.

We may reconsider that later in the year depending on the situation with COVID-19 if the need is there. If anyone wishes to spend the night, we can point you to the main signup genius for the Shelter to do so.

1) Cook Leader (Dinner) - Distributes recipes and instructions.

2) Cooks (Dinner) - The cooks bring the food to All Saints Church in the back of the Gym by 5PM.

3) Captain (Lunch Crew and Servers) - The Captain is responsible for purchasing lunch items (list provided) and working with Lunch Crew to prepare the lunches. The Captain will ensure attendance of the Servers and make assignments.

4) Lunch Crew - arrive at the All Saints Gym (kitchen) by 4:30PM to make sandwiches for lunches.

5) Servers - Four people (at least 16 years old) who will serve food at the Shrine or four people (at least 16 years old) who will serve food at Central Presbyterian. Arrive at All Saints by 5PM to rendezvous with the Cooks to bring food down to the Shelter. Due to Shelter rules considering COVID-19, we can only have four servers at either site - sorry, no more big groups and family groups serving.

Brother Arthur Montagne Passes



The passing of our oldest brother, Art Montagne, 98, was unknown to us until we saw this obituary in the AJC. He had apparently moved to Decatur in his last days. Art was a very active brother in his early days as a council member.

Arthur "Art" Ernest Montagne, age 98, of Decatur, GA passed away peacefully on August 31, 2020, at the Benton House of Decatur. Born in Detroit, MI on November 23, 1921, Art was the third of five children of Ed and Irene Montagne of Detroit, MI. He graduated from University of Detroit High School, attended Wayne State University for two years before enlisting in the US Marine Air Corps in 1943, achieved the rank of Captain and was awarded The Distinguished Flying Cross while fighting in WWII in the South Pacific flying a single engine TBF Avenger (torpedo bomber). He received an honorable discharge in 1947, but remained in the reserves until 1957.



Art married Ruth Connelly on December 1, 1945 and they had a beautiful and loving relationship for 56 years before Ruth's passing in 2001. He is survived by his children, Arthur Richard (Linda), Thomas Daniel, Larry Edward (Lyn), Mary Lou Allen (Randall), nine grand and great-grandchildren, brother, Lionel (Lena) and sister, Germaine Canar. Preceding Art in death was his son, Timmy in his first year of life, and brothers, Ed (age 100) and Bob (age 88).

Art was an accomplished high school football player, playing halfback and punter. In 1939, he was captain of the team and won the Michigan State Championship, scoring the winning touchdown. Art was a lifelong avid follower of sports especially the Ga Tech Yellow Jackets football, Atlanta Falcons and Atlanta Braves.

His career as regional credit manager for J.C. Penney Co. began in 1957 and spanned twenty years. During those years Art relocated his young family from Detroit to Denver, CO, then Seattle, WA, Portland, OR and finally to Atlanta in 1964. In this process, the family benefited from seeing this country from "sea to shining sea." Road trips each summer found routes that toured every major National Park. This was an education in its own right.

Approximately 1974 he was appointed by then Gov. Jimmy Carter to head a commission that made recommendations to improve consumer credit legislation. Throughout the 1980's he worked for the Consumer Credit Counseling Service working with consumers and creditors to ease the burden of personal debt.

All who knew Art knew he was a kind, loving and giving man, often referred to as a "gentle soul." He had a deep faith attending Catholic Mass every Sunday, was a member of the Knights of Columbus, served communion and ushered. His abiding faith and love and commitment to family was the center of his world. After retiring, Art volunteered at St. Joseph Hospital several days a week.

In lieu of flowers, the family has asked that contributions be made to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, one of Art and Ruth's favorite charities.

A Catholic Mass will be held for family Friday, September 4, 2020.

The family of Gerard "Jerry" Hussion Howley announces his passing, on Friday, October 2, 2020, at the age of 84 years. Gerard died peacefully in his home with his family by his side. Gerard was preceded in death by his wife, Julianne (Kehew) Howley, his parents, Thomas Francis Howley II and Zita (Clark) Howley and sister, Kathleen (Joseph) Zimla.

Gerard will be lovingly remembered by his three children, Michael (Fran) Howley, Lynn (Grant) Proulx, Mary Beth (Mike) Kuhn and his twin brother, Thomas Francis Howley III. Gerard will also be fondly remembered by his seven grandchildren, Brennan, Colin, Connor, Eion, Allison, Megan and Erin, as well as 10 nieces and nephews.

Gerard was born on May 23, 1936, in Wheeling, WVA. He graduated from West Virginia University, Morgantown, WVA, with a degree in Commerce. After serving in the United States Navy as an A-3D Bombardier Navigator, on the USS Forrestal, Gerard began his 30-plus year career with the B.F. Goodrich company in sales management.

Gerard was a proud member of the All Saints Catholic Church, Dunwoody, GA, Knights of Columbus and most recently, as a courtesy cart driver for Emory-St. Joseph's Hospital in Atlanta, GA.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated in memory of Gerard on November 27, 2020 at 11 AM, at All Saints Catholic Church, Dunwoody, GA, followed by a private celebration of his life TBD.

Widow Jackie McGill, 85, Passes



Mary "Jackie" Reeb McGill, 85, of Dunwoody, passed away on September 28, 2020, in Dunwoody, GA. Mrs. McGill grew up in Oak Park, IL, and graduated from Rosary College in River Forest, IL. After raising her four children, Mrs. McGill went back to school and earned a Master's in Computer Science from Georgia Tech. She also worked at Georgia Tech as a Research Scientist until her retirement. She was an accomplished Bridge player, receiving the Life Master Certificate for outstanding achievement in bridge competition. She loved skiing, reading, and attending Georgia Tech football and basketball games.

Mrs. McGill was preceded in death by her husband of 55 years, James "Jim" McGill and is survived by her children, Jim and wife Kim, Mary and husband Mark, Tom and wife Alicia, Annie and husband Neil; grandchildren, Katie, Megan, Alex, Joseph, Anna, Emily, Jamie, Sara, Sam, Michael and Angus; and great grandson, Liam. 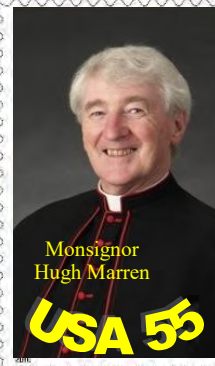
