
If you are having a setback, or any kind of difficulty with payment, please call me. We want to keep you active and we will help.

Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to the proper procedure for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail still works perfectly well also. Those liking immediate gratification may use the instructions below for a small processing fee.

Brothers,

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2021 are \$40.

Our council website <u>www.kc11402.org</u> handles electronic payment of council dues.

You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently.

You may still pay your normal 2021 annual dues directly at a meeting or send a check made out to "KofC Council 11402" to:


Our Four Sponsored Seminarians



My Journey in My Vocation

I am the fourth of five children in my family. I have two older sisters, an older brother, and a younger sister. I was born in Dallas, Texas and lived there for seven years. My dad was laid off and he was able to find a job in Gainesville, Georgia. We lived in Gainesville for four years and went to St. Michael's in Gainesville for those four years. After that, my dad lost his job again. He found a new job and we moved to LaGrange, GA and went to St. Peter's Catholic Church. I lived there for about 7 years before

heading to college. For college, I lived with my sister and her husband during my first two years of college in Calhoun, GA. My junior and senior year I transferred to Georgia College and State University and lived there in Milledgeville.

What are your hobbies and interests?

A couple of my hobbies are running, reading, and sports. I started running in my junior year of college when I was asked to run a half marathon with a couple of my friends. I trained for that run for a couple months and I haven't stopped running since. Since that time I have run two half marathons and a half dozen 5k runs. I also like to read, often while I'm running. Some people like to listen to music while running, I like to listen to books. I will get audio books and listen to them. I like to read science fiction and fantasy books, similar to Lord of the Rings. I also enjoy playing and watching sports, especially baseball, basketball, and football. I even get the opportunity to play basketball and flag football at seminary.

What is one of your favorite scriptures?

One of my favorite scripture verses is John 15:15 which says, "I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father." This understanding that Jesus is inviting all of us to this friendship with Him is just beautiful to me and because it is an invitation, it makes me constantly self-reflect. What is my response to this invitation? How much am I giving to this relationship? Can I give more? Am I talking to Him on a daily basis through prayer and acting in a way that He would be proud of?

Who is your favorite saint and why?

This is a tough question. My confirmation saint is St. Benedict, but I wouldn't say he is my favorite saint. I would say my favorite saint is Mary but that seems a bit too easy since she is our mother. Instead, I'll give you my second favorite saint, who is St. Joseph. I did not have a devotion to him until I joined seminary. But as I reflected more on Joseph and his role in the holy family, I came to realize the fortitude he practiced by taking Mary as his wife and raising our Savior. It is this fortitude that St. Joseph practiced that I pray, he interceded to God for me that I may have that same courage for these years in seminary and God willing, in ministry as a priest.

Paul Nacey Bio (continued)

In a nutshell, what is your vocation story? How did you feel called to the priesthood?

I was 23 years old when I joined seminary. I have thought about becoming a priest since the beginning of high school. I was home schooled throughout high school and this had a huge impact on my life. I was able to receive a good Catholic education that helped me to understand the faith well and to have a firm foundation to face the challenges of college life. Home schooling also allowed my family to attend Mass twice a week. With this habit established when I went to college, it felt strange not to go to Mass when I was able. It was this firm foundation in my faith and time with our Lord at Mass and Christ speaking through the priest in those homilies that brought me to seminary.

What is seminary life like for you?

Seminary life is awesome. My favorite part is probably the community. Being able to make friends and talk with so many men, who are discerning priesthood, is beyond words. Throughout the year, we have various sport activities that go on, with scrimmages and practices, usually at least once a week. In the fall, we have a flag football team that I am on and we play intramurals with one of the local universities. We also have a basketball team that takes part in a tournament with 10 other seminaries. And we have a soccer team that scrimmages as well. This community, that I call family, has played a huge part in my formation and discernment. Not to say there aren't challenges when living with 130 men in the same place, because there definitely are, but even in those challenges, there are moments of growth and that is one of the beauties of seminary life. Blessings abound.

What do you look forward to about being a priest?

The one thing I look forward to most is being able to live in and have the opportunity to minister to a community and by doing so, they may encounter Christ and build true and lasting friendship with Him. I think this encapsulates a lot of what priesthood is. I look forward to being able to minister the sacraments: Eucharist, confession, baptism, etc. I look forward to helping others through spiritual direction and counseling. I received my bachelors in Psychology when I went to college because I wanted to be able to help others in a counseling role. Ultimately, I want to grow with the community. I want to baptize babies and see them grow up and receive their first communion. I want to see them confirmed and eventually married. I want to not just be a part of the community, but a part of the family. The family of faith.

What advice do you have for other guys thinking about the priesthood?

What I have to say probably isn't anything new to those thinking about priesthood but I hope by me saying it again, it puts an emphasis on how important these three things are. First, prayer is so important. In my time in college, I can see a positive correlation of when I prayed and when I was felt called to be a priest. When my prayer life was good, I wanted to be a priest more than anything, but when it was bad, priesthood wasn't even on my radar. Second, friendships are so important. If you are thinking about becoming a priest, talk with your friends about it. They can be so supportive and help you in your journey. Third, talk to a priest. They know so much and have so much first hand experience when it comes to discernment that they are more than happy to share, usually. I didn't talk to a priest much while I was discerning but looking back, I wish I had. I probably would have joined seminary a year earlier, not taking a gap year after graduating college. Pray and talk to friends and priests, and allow God to work through them.

Council "Feed the Needy" Ministry

You may not know that during 2020, while our world was reeling from the COVID VIRUS and so many Knight Activities were cancelled, the FEED THE NEEDY Ministry Team kept delivering Bakery Products to the needy through the St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store. Together, our collections from Publix and Costco (Joe Liebsack) totaled over \$35,000 worth of Bakery products.

We pick up from Publix 6-7 specific nights a month, with an additional 8 nights per month that started in December, to help meet the tremendous need in our community. Joe picks up from Costco every Friday morning. We bring the bakery goods to parishioners Janice and John Leahy or



directly to the SVdP Thrift Store. The Thrift Store puts the goods out for the public and they disappear quickly. They are very grateful to have this supply to help many needy families.

I send out the scheduled dates for the month to our team members, and they get back to me with the date(s) they can fill. No pressure to take a date if their schedule doesn't fit the needs. We now try to fill 15 dates per month.



All Saints Catholic Church (Dunwoody, GA) - Mens Shelter Ministry - Cooks, Servers, Overnight Stay

Volunteers from All Saints have been supporting the Men's Shelter at The Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and Central Presbyterian Church for over 30 years

All Saints commitment to the Men's Shelter this year involves ten days during Nov - Mar where we will preparing dinners, preparing lunches and serving the meals at Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and Central Presbyterian. There is no overnight at either shelter in Nov and Dec, so the meals will be 'handed out' in the parking lot of the Shrine. Overnight will start in Jan at a reduced capacity. We will provide the meals for the Men staying in the Shrine and Central Presbyterian and also prepare meals to be 'handed out'

to other men outside at the Shrine.

We are not signing up to spend the nights at the Shelter. We may reconsider that later in the year depending on the situation with COVID-19 if the need is there. If anyone wishes to spend the night, we can point you to the main signup genius for the Shelter to do so.

1) Cook Leader (Dinner) - Distributes recipes and instructions

2) Cooks (Dinner) - The cooks bring the food to All Saints Church in the back of the Gym by 5PM.

3) Captain (Lunch Crew and Servers) - The Captain is responsible for purchasing lunch items (list provided) and working with Lunch Crew to prepare the lunches. The Captain will ensure attendance of the Servers and make assignments.

4) Lunch Crew - arrive at the All Saints Gym (kitchen) by 4:30PM to make sandwiches for lunches.

5) Servers - Four people (at least 16 years old) who will serve food at the Shrine or four people (at least 16 years old) who will serve food at Central Presbyterian. Arrive at All Saints by 5PM to rendezvous with the Cooks to bring food down to the Shelter. Due to Shelter rules considering COVID-19, we can only have four servers at either site - sorry, no more big groups and family groups serving



Brother Larry Cullen Has Passed



Judge Lawrence W. Cullen, 82, of Peachtree Corners, Georgia, born on January 10, 1939, in Saint Louis, Missouri, died February 4, 2021 at the Emory University Hospital in Decatur, Georgia. His death was the result of complications arising from the Covid-19 virus.

Judge Cullen (Larry) was preceded in death by his son, Daniel L. Cullen; his parents, William B. and Nellie, nee O'Sullivan, Cullen; his brother, William B. Cullen, Jr.; his aunt, Anastasia (Ann) Cullen; his nephew, Thomas Cook; and his niece, Aimee Ziegler. He is survived by his wife Nancy, nee Nold, Cullen whom he married on June 12, 1971 in St. Peter's Cathedral, Belleville, Illinois; his children, Gregory W. Cullen of Peachtree Corners, Georgia, Cynthia A. (Jeremy) Kimmel of Asheville, North Carolina, and Andrea M. Cullen, of Atlanta, Georgia; two granddaughters, Josephine L. Kimmel

and Danielle E. Kimmel, both of Asheville; three sisters, Mary Eileen Cook, Shelia (Bill) Dettmann, and Kathleen (Dave) Ziegler, all of Saint Louis, Missouri; and a brother, John (June) Cullen of Claremont, California. He is also survived by five nephews, two nieces, six grand nephews, and three grand nieces.

Larry received his education in Saint Louis, Missouri attending Resurrection Grade School, St. Mary's High School, class of 1957, and St. Louis University where he received a Bachelor's degree in Political Science, and a Master's degree in Business Administration. He received his Law degree from the St. Louis University School of Law in 1963.

He began his professional career in 1963 in the Saint Louis Circuit Attorney's Office where he served as a prosecutor. He then worked for several years in private practice, at which time he also ran for and was elected to the Saint Louis Board of Alderman. He served as the alderman for the thirteenth ward from 1965 to 1969. Larry then ventured into corporate law, working as a corporate attorney for Union Electric Company (now Ameren Corporation) a public utility company. It is here that he found his calling to labor law. He worked at Union Electric Company for over ten years before being appointed an Administrative Law Judge with the Federal Government, serving as a judge for the National Labor Relations Board from November 1980 until his retirement in January 2009.

Judge Cullen was a member of the Missouri Bar Association from August 1963 until his death. He was an active member of Saint Jude's Catholic Church and later All Saints Catholic Church, serving as an usher in both parishes for many years. He loved his faith and served his parish in the Knights of Columbus, in the St. Vincent de Paul Society, working at Habitat houses, and homeless shelters and in many other ways. He was also active in his neighborhood associations and clubs, serving on the board of the Homeowners Association.

Larry enjoyed the outdoors and spent many happy hours gardening, planting trees, playing tennis, fishing, and hiking, to name a few. He was an animal lover, he relished working out, and he loved traveling with his family, where he would often serenade them with many songs from his youth while driving to their destination. He enjoyed barbecuing, cooking, and fine dining. But his greatest love of all was his family to whom he was always devoted.

A rosary was said at one-thirty in the afternoon on Friday, February 12, 2021 at All Saints Catholic Church in Dunwoody Georgia followed by a Requiem Mass at two o'clock. Following Mass, the cortege traveled past Larry's home to Peachtree Memorial Park in Peachtree Corners for the Rite of Committal and Burial.


