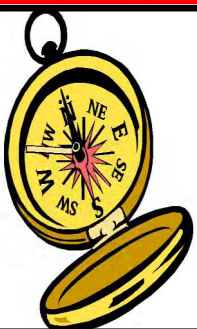
Come participate and have fun and let's get even more of that fraternity and unity back into the council.

Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to the proper procedure for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail still works perfectly well also. Those liking immediate gratification may use the instructions below for a small processing fee.

Brothers,

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2021 are \$40.

Our council website www.kc11402.org handles electronic payment of council dues.

You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently.

Watters Assembly Observes 9/11



Knights pray a 9/11 rosary

JOHNS CREEK—Members of the Father Charles J. Watters Knights of Columbus Assembly #2688 prayed the rosary on Saturday, Sept. 11 at the Veterans Memorial Walk at Newtown Park in Johns Creek. The assembly is based in Dunwoody.

The Veterans Memorial Walk at Newtown Park is a symbol of remembrance and respect for all the men and women who have and currently serve in the United States Armed Services. The five-acre memorial features a trail, circling a newly installed fountain with granite benches. Along the trail, black granite monuments pay homage to

each conflict, beginning with WWI and include special monuments for Purple Heart recipients, POW/MIAs, and Women in Service.

In 2020, The Wall That Heals, a 250-foot replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, was added to the Veterans Memorial Walk.

The Knights prayed in front of the Vietnam memorial on the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks.

"It was touching to see and feel the reverence shown by these gentlemen as they said each decade of the rosary and afterwards saluted the flag and the reflection wall," said one park visitor.

Georgia Bulletin September 16, 2021

Sir Knights Dennis Klein, Lou Hlad, Abe Kassis, Charles Lynch, and Nick Mattera celebrated the twentieth anniversary of 9/11 by praying a rosary at the replica of the Vietnamese Memorial Wall in Johns Creek. Their Assembly namesake, Fr. Charles J. Watters, is remembered on the wall. He is a Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient. The five also saluted the battlecross monument erected in 2017 by the Assembly at the park entrance.

Watters Assembly at Minor League B'Ball Game

Thanks to the contacts of our council brother, Sir Knight Bob Santos, the Watters Assembly was able to reschedule the rained-out minor league baseball game on September 7th. The Gwinnett Striper team management (formerly called Gwinnett Braves) offered a makeup game in a fancy private suite at their CoolRay Field in Lawrenceville complete with a buffet dinner at no additional cost over the original interrupted event. Seventeen brothers and family (mostly All Saints folks) partook in the generosity and saw a nice makeup game with a victory. The event was October 2nd.



Acolytes Returning in Near Future?

The most unique ministry that all Saints Council has fostered has been our funeral acolyte ministry. We have never heard of another council anywhere which provides Knight acolytes (Mass servers) for all parish funerals.

Teams of three or more brothers have graced the altar during all Parish funerals to assist the priest(s) by carrying crosses, lighted candles, bringing water and wine, furnishing incense and holy water as needed, and carrying cremains if requested. Some funerals then process out to the Columbarium for further devotionals.

Acolytes are divided into teams that take turns covering funerals on weekdays, weekends, and sometimes special occasions like Remembrance Masses. Outfit garb includes navy blue blazers, dark grey dress slacks, white shirt, black shoes and socks, and a special Knight tie given to participants. The funeral cantor usually dresses in a likewise outfit, but does not serve on the altar.

During the Covid pandemic, this ministry was suspended with the need to keep the number of funeral participants at a bare minimum. Now, Monsignor Marren is of a mind to possibly resume this ministry in the next few weeks with three-server Mass acolytes maximums. We await official word.

When this ministry resumes, we will need fresh volunteers to replace brothers who have died, moved away to retirement venues, or transferred to other councils. There is not another ministry that serves the council as well and is so visible to the public.

Our Seminarian Nacey is Now a Priest

ATLANTA—Two men were ordained to serve as priests in the Archdiocese of Atlanta, with a call to share the “gospel of joy and the gospel of justice.”

Rousing applause followed Father Paul Nacey and Father Robert “Robbie” Cotta as they exited the Cathedral of Christ the King, after being ordained Saturday, June 12, by Archbishop Gregory J. Hartmayer, OFM Conv.

Speaking from the pulpit, Archbishop Hartmayer said the two priests take on new roles in the Atlanta Catholic community.

“You are to become ambassadors for Christ, as if God was appealing through you; today you will become missionaries of mercy,” he told them.

Born in Dallas, Texas, Father Nacey, 30, spent time growing up in Gainesville and LaGrange, Georgia. His parents, Deacon Wayne and Kay Nacey, live in Mount Airy, North Carolina. Before relocating to North Carolina, Deacon Nacey was a permanent deacon for the Archdiocese of Atlanta, serving at St. Peter Church.

Father Nacey attended Dalton State College before transferring to Georgia College and State University in Milledgeville, where he earned a bachelor’s degree in psychology. He studied for the priesthood at Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans, Louisiana.

Be proud of the All Saints Council’s support program of four seminarians at a time. We now move Josh Harris into our support program in place of Fr. Nacey.

Council Brother Serves Those “Inside the Walls”

ATLANTA—Father Kevin Peek is the new Coordinator of Prison and Hospital Ministries for the Archdiocese of Atlanta. He supervises a staff of five priests.

The prison ministry provides support, sharing resources and training opportunities to all those who minister to the incarcerated in prisons and jails in the Atlanta Archdiocese.

Within the archdiocese’s geographical boundaries, there are more than 230 incarceration facilities, with 32 run by the Department of Corrections, two federal and 196 county and city jails.

To increase Catholic presence in prisons and jails and more effectively minister to the incarcerated, Father Peek is asking Catholics within the archdiocese to prayerfully consider joining the ministry.

“Prison ministry involves more than visitation and the giving of the sacraments,” said Bishop Bernard E. Shlesinger III, in a recent Georgia Bulletin column. “The goal of prison ministry must be directed at inclusivity in parish life, rather than thinking of them as exclusive from it and relegated to the responsibility of some department within the church. We cannot allow someone who is ‘out of sight’ to be ‘out of our hearts.’”

The Georgia Bulletin asked Father Peek to share future plans for the ministry. The email exchange has been edited for length.

How long have you been involved in prison ministry outside of this new role?

I actually got started in prison ministry through the Legion of Mary while in college. The Legion of Mary promotes lay people to take on active roles in the service of Christ in the community, especially to the marginalized. I chose prison ministry because I figured they were the least visited and most in need of connection to the grace and love of Christ and his church.

It was an amazing experience, and one I did not forget as I became a priest. Throughout my priesthood, I have been visiting prisons and jails as part of my parish and ministry responsibilities. In 2015, I became a full-time prison minister for the Archdiocese of Atlanta, serving for two and a half years before being activated for military chaplaincy. Now I return as coordinator, with hopes we can increase Catholic presence and support to all of our incarcerated brothers and sisters.

How has being a part of prison ministry impacted your faith?

Being a part of prison ministry has reminded me on a regular basis of those who suffer amongst us. Mission trips are great for forming our youth and inspiring them to care for the suffering of the world. But we have many neglected, forgotten, suffering and in need right here in our own area—especially in our prisons. Christ’s reminder that in serving them we serve him is also very grounding in the reality of faith.

What is a misconception about being involved in prison ministry?

Most people who have never been incarcerated and have never had a friend or family member incarcerated often see prison through the scope of the media or Hollywood. But these are usually sensational and inaccurate portrayals of daily life behind bars.

Prison ministry has several different dimensions, a couple of which do not even necessitate entry into the facility. Additionally, once inside, volunteer ministers are always welcomed by those incarcerated who attend services. You are a break from the monotony and a sign that people still remember and care.

Can you share an experience in prison ministry that had a deep impact on you?

Early in 2015, I met a prisoner in the Georgia Diagnostic facility in Jackson. He asked if I could help him make a vow to God. Understanding that vows to God are serious things, I asked him what type of vow and why. He said that he just entered the prison system and was going to be in the system for quite some time, and wanted to make of his time “inside the walls” a monastic experience—as the prison, with its walls, cells, dining areas, and chapel reminded him of a monastery, and he wanted to live his time there in that way. It was a powerful lesson in re-shaping one’s view of the environment and situation, and a deep understanding of the potential that still existed within him as a child of God.

I have met truly innocent and good people who simply made a mistake under pressure. Also a death row inmate who converted to Catholicism and spent his last years writing encouraging words to foster kids who were enduring similar challenges to those he experienced—trying to keep them from falling into the same trap he did.

Not everyone inside are like these ... , but those who are seeking to renew and rebuild their lives and relationships with God and others are usually the ones we end up meeting the most.

What goals do you have for the ministry over the next year?

Over the next year, our goal is to transition prison ministry from being centered on the archdiocesan office to being more a parish and deanery level ministry. We hope to establish a prison ministry team in each parish, with coordinators on the deanery level to help create comprehensive support across the deanery—particularly from parishes with few facilities to parishes with many.

We look to recognize and build upon the great ministries that are already functioning throughout north Georgia and leverage their successes to benefit and inspire newcomers with training and assistance to work through the process of getting access and any challenges.

What would you say to encourage someone to get involved?

Encouraging someone to get involved in prison ministry is really a matter of helping them to hear the call of the Holy Spirit in their heart.

If someone has a sense that God is possibly calling them, get involved and start asking questions. You do not have to be a theologian or a scholar to get involved—many of those incarcerated are there because they lack knowledge of many things, including God.

If you have a love of God and a simple knowledge of the faith, you will be a great asset and catalyst in the lives of those “inside the walls” incarcerated and staff alike.

Oktoberfest is Back ! - Oct. 10th

For several past years, our Council has had the advantage of reserving the beautiful Rivermont Private Park alongside the Chattahoochee River for a Council **Family** Picnic. Covid had limited that event the last two years. But now it is back and we are ready to enjoy the event again on Sunday, Oct. 10th . We always schedule the start just after the 12:15 Mass crowd is out and able to join us, so the event starts about 1 PM. Free parking is available inside the park.

The council provides meat, beverages (including a keg of German beer), and all meal accessories. **We ask every family whose last name begins with A-M to bring their favorite side, and those with last name starting with N-Z to bring a dessert.** There is no cost and the entire family is invited. Seating is limited to a few fixed tables and everyone should bring a folding chair.

Rivermont Park is located just a couple hundred yards from Holcomb Bridge Road on Barnwell Road (on the right side). A sign guides you onto the dirt road leading into the park. Please come and enjoy the out-

Volunteer drivers use their own vehicles to provide the FREE Door to Door transportation to Seniors. Volunteers share themselves through not only their time and service, but also through their companionship. Rides are provided weekdays, between 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM.

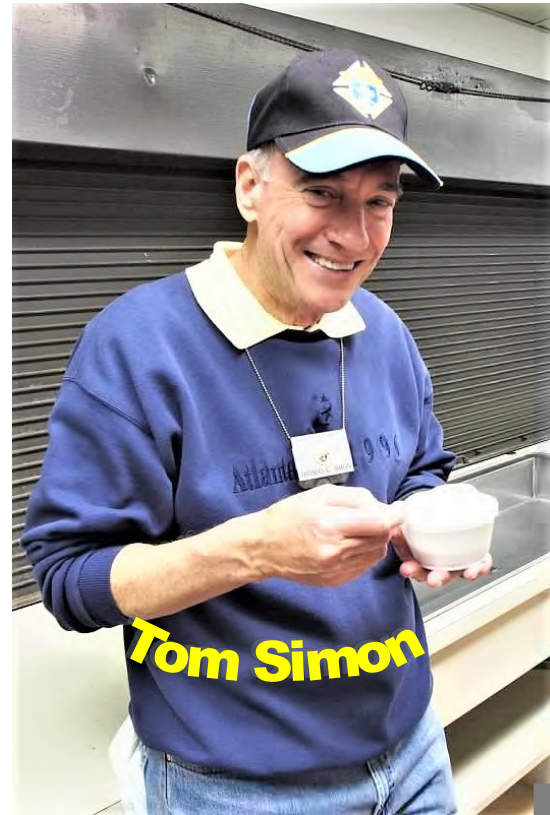

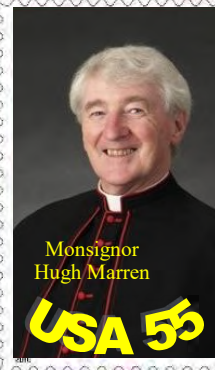
