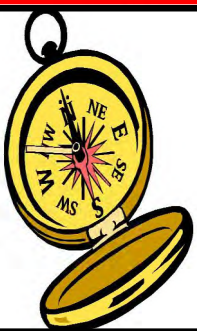

# Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to the proper procedure for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail still works perfectly well also. Those liking immediate gratification may use the instructions below for a small processing fee.

Brothers,

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2021 are \$40.

Our council website [www.kc11402.org](http://www.kc11402.org) handles electronic payment of council dues.

You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently.

You may still pay your normal 2021 annual dues directly at a meeting or send a check made out to "**KofC Council 11402**" to:

# Danny Ross—Plans For Dunwoody

Our Sir Knight Danny Ross, longtime Dunwoody resident, venture capitalist, entrepreneur, inventor, community leader and member of the Dunwoody Economic Recovery Committee, has submitted to the city a 44-page proposal for a Dunwoody tech incubator, a plan that was turned down when he first proposed it in 2012. Now, it's more relevant than ever, as the Committee seeks ways to respond to a changing economy in which technology touches every aspect of our lives.



Thanks to Atlanta's expanding tech ecosystem, many cities outside the Perimeter— like Peachtree Corners, Alpharetta and Marietta – now have tech incubators, many with ties to Georgia Tech's ATDC (Advanced Technology Development Center), and TAG (Technology Association of Georgia).

Already recognized as one of the country's top ten tech cities, Atlanta is the undisputed leader in fintech, with more than half of U.S. financial technology firms based here, and nearly 70 percent of all U.S. debit, credit card and prepaid card transactions processed in the state. With the growth of online banking, shopping, healthcare and their demand for contactless forms of payment, Atlanta is fertile ground for tech start-ups.

Danny Ross sees this ecosystem of talent, resources, need and opportunity as a source of both financial and intellectual capital for the incubator he has dubbed the *Innovation Center of Dunwoody*.

For now, his proposal is in the hands of Dunwoody's Director of Economic Development, Michael Starling , and a consultant hired by the city to study the options for growing Dunwoody's new economy.

"We have to compete for talent, tech companies and small entrepreneurs," said Starling. "Quality of place and quality of life are important as is access to business resources. Work forces want to live in a true live-work-play environment. We want to do all the right things, including the hardscape and softer issues like possibility of an incubator."

No stranger to the give-and-take of selling new ideas, Danny, who with his son Dell holds seven technology patents, started his first business while in college, selling imported wigs door-to-door. Lacking seed money, he bought the wigs with money borrowed from "Understanding Henry," sold them on credit that customers paid off by earning commissions for bringing him new customers, repaid Henry and made a profit. His customers called him "Mr. Dan, the Wig Man."



**After his first job, with IBM during the infancy of the computer era, his reputation for tech and sales savvy led to leadership roles in tech start-ups in Atlanta and New York, including the launch of the Timex Sinclair, a home computer that sold for under \$100 through Timex watch retailers.**

**“We sold the world’s cheapest computer at the world’s largest department store [Macy’s New York],” he said. “It made the New York Times, and Fortune magazine named it one of the top ten new products for 1983.”**

**A price war between Timex, Commodore and Texas Instruments eventually caused the demise of the Timex computer. “But first we put a lot of them into classrooms,” Danny said. “I still meet people who say their first computer was a Timex.”**

**When Danny returned to Atlanta, he co-founded a venture capital firm and entered the nascent Atlanta tech ecosystem.**

**“We funded 30 startups and served on their boards,” he said. The company was based in midtown at ATDC, where some say Atlanta’s tech revolution was born.**

**In 2004-2009, he also found time to be co-president, along wife wife Queenie, of the Dunwoody Preservation Trust. During that time he was instrumental in saving the Donaldson-Bannister Farm, now a Dunwoody public park; campaigned for Dunwoody cityhood; and served in Dunwoody’s first city council.**

**“I never intended to be a politician,” he said and served only one term.**

**Danny believes an incubator can help replace service jobs lost to AI and robotics, build our tax base, retain top talent, attract support businesses and fill our office buildings.**

**“Go back 30 years to Silicon Valley,” he said. “All those little cities started by forming incubators. Look at what incubators have already done for Alpharetta and Peachtree Corners.”**

**Like Michael Starling, he thinks Dunwoody already has the infrastructure, including plenty of banks and office space, low personal tax rates and high quality of life.**

**“Why go all the way to ATDC when you can get the same resources in Dunwoody?” he asked.**

**The answer depends on the consultant’s report, due later this year.**



# Acolytes Returning in Near Future?

The most unique ministry that all Saints Council has fostered has been our funeral acolyte ministry. We have never heard of another council anywhere which provides Knight acolytes (Mass servers) for all parish funerals.

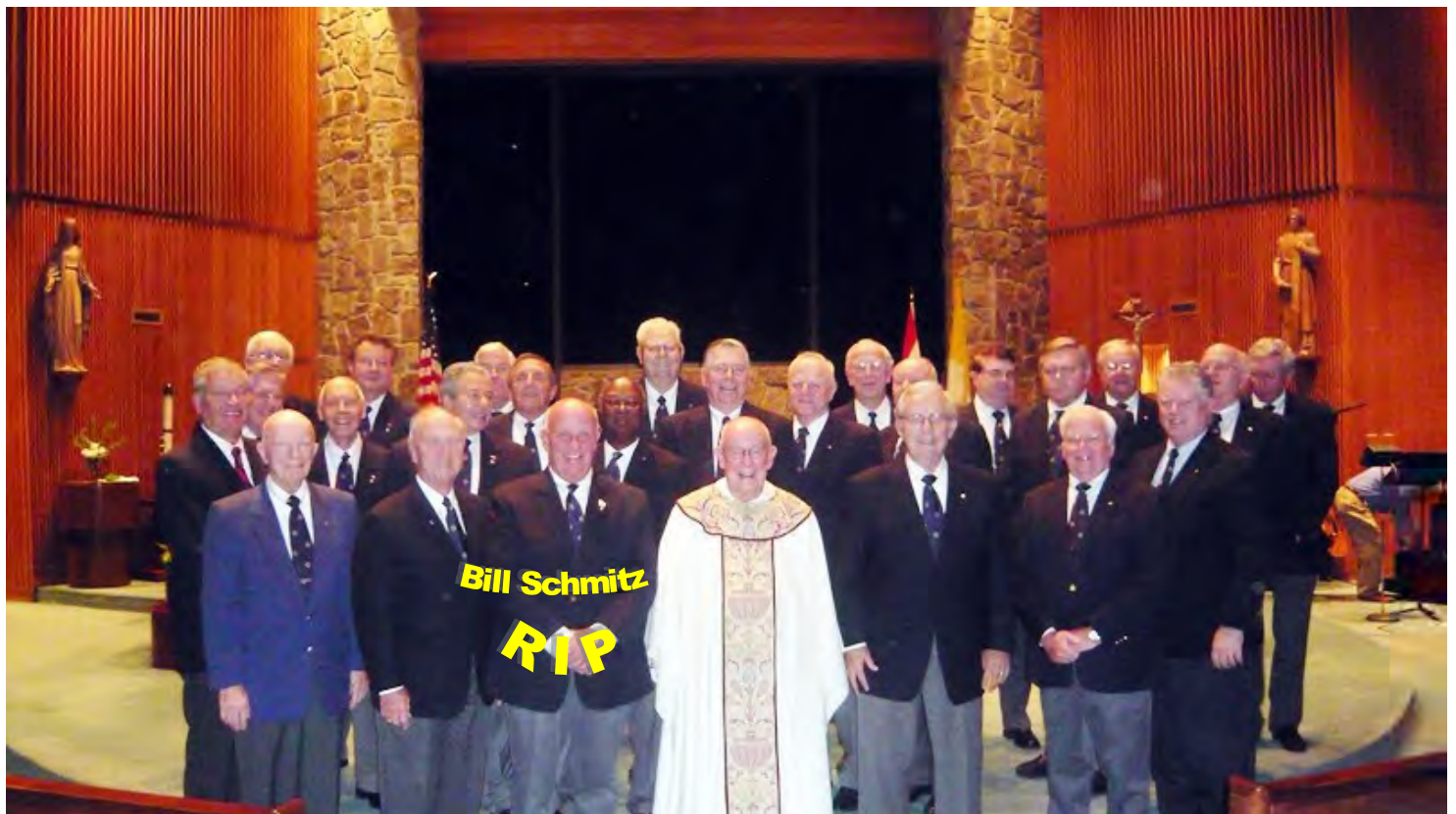
Teams of three or more brothers have graced the altar during all Parish funerals to assist the priest(s) by carrying crosses, lighted candles, bringing water and wine, furnishing incense and holy water as needed, and carrying cremains if requested. Some funerals then process out to the Columbarium for further devotionals.

Acolytes are divided into teams that take turns covering funerals on weekdays, weekends, and sometimes special occasions like Remembrance Masses. Outfit garb includes navy blue blazers, dark grey dress slacks, white shirt, black shoes and socks, and a special Knight tie given to participants. The funeral cantor usually dresses in a likewise outfit, but does not serve on the altar.

During the Covid pandemic, this ministry was suspended with the need to keep the number of funeral participants at a bare minimum. Now, Monsignor Marren is of a mind to possibly resume this ministry in the next few weeks with three-server Mass acolytes maximums. We await official word.

When this ministry resumes, we will need fresh volunteers to replace brothers who have died, moved away to retirement venues, or transferred to other councils. There is not another ministry that serves the council as well and is so visible to the public.

At the Oktoberfest picnic, one of the sides brought by Joan and Gert Kampfer for sharing made quite a hit. Usually sauerkraut is not nearly as popular as mashed potatoes, but this dish was special. People were asking about the recipe.

Here is what Gert had to say about the “secret”:

“Several people approached me at our gathering, asking for the recipe of the Sauerkraut I brought. Somebody suggested to include in the newsletter. I hold no patent on this recipe and I am attaching it for dissemination.”

## Ingredients

<b>2 Tbsp</b>	Butter (or Olive oil)
<b>1 medium</b>	Onion
<b>2</b>	Garlic toes
<b>100 g</b>	Bacon (thick)
<b>2 Tbsp</b>	Flour
<b>500 g</b>	Sauerkraut
<b>1 L</b>	Vegetable bouillon
<b>2</b>	Laurel leaves
<b>1 tsp</b>	Paprika scharf
<b>1 tsp</b>	Caraway
<b>1 Tbsp</b>	Juniper berries
<b>“</b>	Salt
<b>“</b>	Pepper (white)
<b>“</b>	Sugar

Note: Gert is from Austria, so:

100 grams = 3.5 ounces

500 grams = 17.6 ounces

1 liter = 4.22 cups = 34 fluid ounces

- Peel onion and garlic and cut both into small pieces.
  - Cut the bacon into small cubes (see below)
  - In a pot melt the butter and add onion, garlic and bacon
  - Roast until onion becomes translucent and bacon becomes crisp
  - Dust with flour and make a white roux
  - Add drained Sauerkraut in increments, mixing well at each addition
  - Add vegetable bouillon followed by laurel leaves, juniper berries, caraway, paprika, salt, pepper and sugar
  - Simmer on low heat for 90 minutes, but stir occasionally.
  - Prior serving remove laurel leaves and juniper berries
- 
- Regarding bacon: I use frozen “thick sliced” bacon from Costco. First cut across slicing (1/4 inch) and second cut slices into quarters.

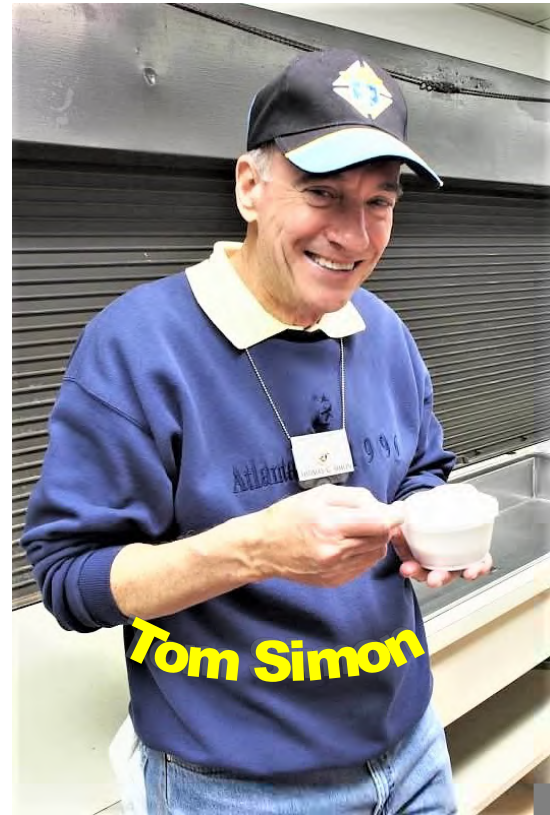

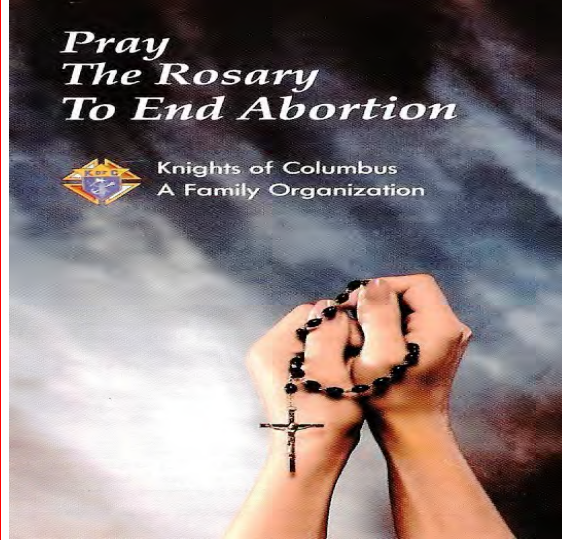

Bill is survived by the love of his life for 60 years, Katie Schmitz, daughters Debbie Garner (Steve), Judy McClure ( Mike), Kristin Baker (Todd), Lisa Phelan (Sean), son Bill Schmitz ( Holly), 20 Grandchildren, 7 great grandchildren, and sister Barbara Lund (Roger), and 5 nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents William and Catherine Schmitz and brother Robert Schmitz.

**Brian held numerous leadership positions throughout his career concluding as Squadron Commander before taking the Langley assignment. Following 22 years active duty, Brian continued his service as a contractor supporting U.S. Department of Defense programs and in 2018 was hired into Civil Service as a Branch Chief at Langley AFB, VA.**

**Brian’s calm and laid-back personality easily earned the trust and respect of those in his professional and personal life. A quiet and confident man, his fighter pilot mentality, selfless kindness, love, and generosity impacted positively all those around him, especially his immediate family and friends.**

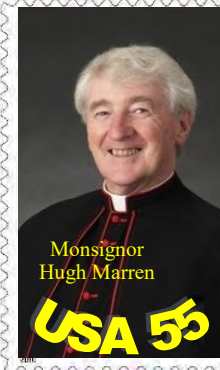
